- Officers addressed traffic complaints in the areas of:

- In September, Petaluma Police Department partnered with Rebuilding Together Petaluma and participated in a significant cleanup event on Lynch Creek Trail. Graffiti was cleaned up, trashed removed, and the trees and bushes cut back. We are developing a maintenance plan that will include pavement repairs, the addition of lighting, and video camera installations.
- Officers continue to conduct extra patrols at the Petaluma Community Center, Lucchesi Park, and the Lynch Creek Trail.

We are excited to share some citywide updates in the second edition of our quarterly newsletter. GUN LOCKS AND DUTY TO SECURE

In an effort to increase safety and eliminate accidental shootings, Petaluma has joined 20+ other cities in California enacting firearm lock requirements.

What does this mean?

- Requires safe storage of all firearms in homes and vehicles
- Firearms must be stored in a locked container or disabled with a locking device
- Gun owners must report a lost or stolen firearm within 2 days to the Petaluma Police Department
- You may be found guilty of a misdemeanor or felony should a child under 18 use it or carry it in a public place

If you are in need of a gun lock, they are available for free at our department courtesy of our partnership with Project Child Safe.
