Officer Cornejo responded to on-going complaints about drivers failing to stop at the stop sign at the corner of East D Street and Wilson Street. He made a number of traffic stops at that location to help curb violators.

Officer Daut provided several extra patrols in East Washington Place shopping center to deter on-going organized retail theft incidents.

Officer Daut also conducted routine traffic enforcement at multiple intersections that have received complaints, resulting in a number of traffic citations being issued to violators. Some of the locations included:

GUN LOCKS AND DUTY TO SECURE

In an effort to increase safety and eliminate accidental shootings, Petaluma has joined 20+ other cities in California enacting firearm lock requirements.

What does this mean?

- Requires safe storage of all firearms in homes and vehicles
- Firearms must be stored in a locked container or disabled with a locking device
- Gun owners must report a lost or stolen firearm within 2 days to the Petaluma Police Department
- You may be found guilty of a misdemeanor or felony should a child under 18 use it or carry it in a public place

If you are in need of a gun lock, they are available for free at our department courtesy of our partnership with Project Child Safe.

We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our community safe!
