PATROL UPDATES



Lynch Creek Trail Progress:

- Extra patrols have been performed along the entire Lynch Creek Trail on a weekly basis to address vandalism and illegal camps along the footpath. SAFE and HomeFirst also canvass the area.
- We are working with the City of Petaluma's IT department to identify possible locations along the trail for surveillance camera installations.
- A clean up of the trail that involved multiple organizations took place on 9/14. Chief Miller, Lt. Rivera, and CIRT Officers were all present during the effort to maximize volunteer safety while engaged in the clean up.

Ongoing extra patrols have also been conducted at the Trestle Bridge area. During those patrols, subjects have been arrested for active warrants and drug related offenses.

We are excited to share some citywide updates in the second edition of our quarterly newsletter. Officers have been hard at work increasing traffic safety, reducing crime, improving the quality of life, and engaging with the community. - added saturation patrols downtown and extra speed/stop sign/traffic enforcement near schools and busy intersections

GUN LOCKS AND DUTY TO SECURE

In an effort to increase safety and eliminate accidental shootings, Petaluma has joined 20+ other cities in California enacting firearm lock requirements.

What does this mean?

- Requires safe storage of all firearms in homes and vehicles
- Firearms must be stored in a locked container or disabled with a locking device
- Gun owners must report a lost or stolen firearm within 2 days to the Petaluma Police Department
- You may be found guilty of a misdemeanor or felony should a child under 18 use it or carry it in a public place

If you are in need of a gun lock, they are available for free at our department courtesy of our partnership with Project Child Safe.

We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our community safe!
