Meeting Notes

The meeting convened at 4:20pm. Tim Gilbert of Moore Iacofano Goltsman, Inc., gave a 10 minute presentation of the Americans with Disabilities Act sections and titles as applicable to local government agencies receiving Federal funds and the requirements of the Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan that the City of Petaluma is preparing. The meeting was then opened to the attendees for comments and questions.

Mr. Sullivan stated that he is a retired San Francisco Police Department ADA Coordinator. He held the position for seventeen years. He commented that transporting a disabled person in an ambulance usually separated them from their wheelchair or scooter, which are vital to their mobility, so alternate transportation may be more appropriate in a parataxis. He also clarified that TDD is now referred to as TTY, and recommended that one unit be available at each office that is at a different location than the City Clerk's Office. Lastly, Mr. Sullivan commented that the upcoming building code change will affect the codes referenced in the City's Facility Reports.

Mr. Streeper commented that the City should consider revising the door width to 4" greater than the 32" width minimum to accommodate power wheelchairs. He also commented that nearly all of the doors of the Community Center need to be retrofitted with a transitional kickplate since the vertical door locking mechanism would get in the way of a wheelchair footrest. He also requested a hard copy of the draft ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan for review by the Senior Advisory Committee.
