Words may not be printed in boldface type or all capital letters, nor are indentations, circles, stars, dots, bullets or underlines allowed; profanity or other objectionable language may not be used. Lists or enumerations must be wrapped as a single block paragraph with items separated by semicolons or periods. If not wrapped when submitted, wrapping will be done during the process of typesetting.

Multiple single line paragraphs that do not fit in the space allotted will be wrapped. All arguments/ rebuttals should be checked by the author for spelling and punctuation, as the department will not correct any material contained therein.
