## **Workers Compensation Reporting Procedures**

When an employee is injured on the job, a supervisor's first concern should be to see that the employee receives proper first aid and/or medical treatment.

If the employee requires Emergency Medical Services, call 911

## **Incident Report Only:**

If the injury is minor and the employee is not seeking medical attention:

- 1. Supervisors and employees will complete the Employee and Supervisor Incident Report and submit it to workcompclaims@cityofpetaluma.org.
- 2. If in the future, the employee needs medical attention for their injury the Employee and Supervisor will complete the Workers Comp Claim Form (DWC 1) and follow the directions below

## If the employee has had an Injury that requires Medical Attention:

- 1. Complete the following two forms completely:
  - Employee and Supervisor Incident Report
  - Workers Comp Claim Form (DWC 1)
  - If exposed to Bloodborne Pathogens (blood, saliva, or tissue) compete the forms in the Human Resources Bloodborne Pathogens Packet
- 2. Have the employee complete their portion of the Workers Comp Claim Form (DWC 1) and sign
- 3. Give employee their copy of Workers Comp Claim Form (DWC 1)
- 4. If employee is not able to sign, please put "unable to sign" and initial
- Scan and email a copy to: workcompclaims@cityofpetaluma.org
- 6. Put both signed forms in interdepartmental mail and send to HR- Attention: Lauren Carvalho
- 7. Please give "Notice to Injured Worker" packet to employee

If injury occurs Monday – Friday, 9:00am – 6:00pm direct the employee to seek medical attention at:

→ Direct the employee to tell the doctor that they work for the City of Petaluma and this is a work related injury

If the injury occurs before or after Kaiser OccMed business hours direct the employee to:

Petaluma Valley Hospital (PVH) 400 N McDowell Blvd Petaluma, CA 94954 (707) 778-1111

→ Direct the employee to tell the doctor that they work for the City of Petaluma and this is a work related injury. This is especially important with PVH so the reports and billing will be processed correctly
