CONTRACT DOCUMENT QUESTIONS

Question #3: Cut to fill quantities for flatwork items: as it looks in the field the sidewalk will most likely be in a fill which could be up to 1' + depth. The plans do not reflect any existing grades in that area nor represent any type of cut to fill will be required. Can you clarify please?

Response #3: We anticipate some degree of fill to be needed. This estimated quantity is detailed on the updated Bid Schedule and the updated 220 – Aggregate Base Technical Specification.

Question #4: The Bid Schedule calls for Green Bike Lane Markings, Item 49, yet none are detailed on the plans.

Response #4: We anticipate the placement of 5000 SF of green thermoplastic pavement markings. Specific locations will be within the designed bike lane striping, but the limits will be determined prior to application.

This Addendum No. 2 shall become part of the Contract and all provisions of the Contract shall apply thereto. Bidders shall acknowledge all Addendums in the Bid Schedule.

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198

GROUP 3: Dump trucks, 8 yds. and including 24 yds.; Transit mixers, over 10 yds.; Water trucks, 7,000 gals. and over; Jetting trucks, 7,000 gals. and over; Vacuum trucks under 7500 gals. Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average the phonisted rate is derived by compiling a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can

- * an existing published wage determination
 * a survey underlying a wage determination
 * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
 * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:





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SECTION 220 AGGREGATE BASE (addendum #2)

220A. GENERAL

Aggregate base shall conform to Section 26, "Aggregate Bases," of the Caltrans Standard Specifications, the City of Petaluma's Design and Construction Standards and Specifications, the plans, and these Technical Specifications.

220B. SUBMITTALS

Contractor shall submit to the City the typical gradation document of the specified aggregate base in the plans and/or these technical specifications.

220C. MATERIALS

Backfill material shall be Class 2 aggregate base three-quarter (3/4) inch maximum conforming to Section 26 of the Standard Specifications.

220D. CONSTRUCTION

220D.1 AGGREGATE BASE

The constructed thickness of the aggregate base layer shall not be less than the design thickness minus 0.04' (1/2 inch). Aggregate base shall be Class 2, ¾ inch maximum, and shall be firm and unyielding. The minimum sand equivalent shall be 31 for any individual test. The requirements to use recycled Class II Aggregate base shall only be approved by the ENGINEER.

220E. QUALITY CONTROL

Aggregate must comply with the grading requirements as shown in Section 26 of the Standard Specifications

220F. MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

Full compensation for Aggregate Base except for fill - class II AB identified below, shall be considered as included in prices paid for the various contract items of work involved and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

Fill- Class II AB shall be paid for at the contract unit price **per cubic yard (CY)** of actual fill material installed, which shall be full compensation for mobilization, site preparation and site clean-up, staking/ layout, site grubbing, excavation, placing, compaction and grading, including roadway excavation root pruning, all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to do all the work involved thereof and as directed by the Engineer, complete, in place, and accepted, and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor. Fill

Class II AB exclude base rock previously included in other concrete items i.e. curb and gutter, sidewalk and curb ramp.

The estimated quantity of Fill – Class II AB is for bidding purposes only. This item may be increased, decreased, or eliminated in its entirety based on field conditions evaluated by the Engineer, and no adjustment in the contract bid price or other contract items will be made therefor. The provisions of Section 9-1.06, "Changed Quantity Payment Adjustments," of the Standard Specifications shall not apply.
