Why Are We Here?


- Replace failed roadway surface on Maria Drive between Rainier Avenue & S. McDowell Blvd.
- Prioritized because of schools and parks
- Explore ways to improve safety and accessibility in tandem with paving project
- We want to hear your ideas



Project Location

Maria Drive:

Rainier Avenue to S. McDowell Boulevard (1.1 miles)



Additional Context

- Sidewalks both sides for most of corridor, but limited ADA curb ramps
- Two trail crossings (Lynch Creek Trail & Washington Creek Trail)
- Bike lanes on northern portion of corridor (Rainier Avenue to Monroe Street)



Confirmed Improvements

- New pavement for smooth roadway surface
- Provide ADA-compliant street corners (curb ramps at crosswalks)
- Reduce pavement "dips"
- Refresh roadway markings
- Install recycled water pipeline for park and school(s)



Additional Potential Improvements

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

- Target damaged sidewalk replacement
- Explore opportunities for new and enhanced crosswalks




Additional Potential Improvements

BICYCLE SAFETY

- Improve Lynch Creek and Washington Creek Trail crossings
- Improve bike lanes (and explore adding bike lanes where feasible)




Proposed Street Configurations




Rainier Avenue – 125' South of Professional Drive (minimum 48' wide)



Monroe Street – E. Madison Street & Lauren Drive – S. McDowell Boulevard (~40' wide)



125' South of Professional Drive – Monroe Street (minimum 33' wide)



E. Madison Street – Lauren Drive (~36' wide)

Additional Potential Improvements

SIGNALS & SIGNAGE

- Improve signals at E. Washington
 Street
- Install wayfinding signage

- Summer/Fall 2023: Construction
- Winter 2023: Project completion

- Local Road Safety Plan
 - Consider new pedestrian crossing at Lauren Drive
 - Remove obstructions from narrow sidewalks
 - Dips in road present difficulties for people with mobility impairments

Feedback Received to Date

- Project Webpage Comment Form
 - Traffic calming provided by dips is appreciated
 - Preserve on-street parking along residential sections
 - Difficult to see around buses at Eastside Transit Center
