

Public Art Master Plan Mission

- Aiming to foster a sense of beauty at the artwork site
- Represent the diversity of our community
- Activate neighborhoods that may not have existing public art
- Be low maintenance and appropriate for public space



Addressing the Public Art Master Plan Mission

- Does collecting specific sizes, themes, or numbers of McChesney works substantially further certain goals and collecting initiatives for the Public Art program?
- Could acquisition of McChesney's art address certain aspirations for the Public Art program?
- What would be the intent by adding McChesney's works to the public art collection? For example, would the purpose be educational, preservation-based, or possibly creating new components of the program (i.e. guided or online tour, a sculpture garden, a public-private loan program, a school program)?

Financial Impact

Costs associated with:


- Acquisition (sale price, deinstallation, transportation, storage, installation)
- Conservation
- Ongoing maintenance
- Staging or temporary storage space
- Programming, signage, interpretive information

Medium and Scale

- Small works versus large
- Outdoor display with minimal regular maintenance
- Modular assembly
- Can weigh upwards of thousands of pounds

Location

- Indoor versus outdoor display
- Maintenance cost
- Use patterns
