Council and Mayor were provided with 2019 Action Plan, and inside are two report documents that run through the fourth quarter of 2018. Mr. Powers highlighted some of the achievements that were met in 2018.

Mayor Putaansuu discussed the possibility of joining the Greater Seattle Partnership.

- 8. DISCUSSION ITEMS (No Action to be Taken)
- A. Resolution Supporting the South Kitsap Community Events Center

Mayor Putaansuu discussed the South Kitsap Community Events Center proposal's economic benefits and shared a document with the tax benefits. Kitsap County, Port of Bremerton, and City of Port Orchard are requested to pass the same resolution of support which would be presented to the Kitsap Public Facilities District.

Councilmember Cucciardi asked what the intentions were for approving the resolution. Mayor Putaansuu stated that it is a request for a funding commitment from the Kitsap Public Facilities District, and from there it would initiate the area's lobbyists to pursue state and federal grants.

Steve Sego spoke to funding commitment options including private donors and public partnerships. However, there are no set commitments currently.

Councilmember Clauson requested discussion of the item be on the next meeting's agenda.

Councilmember Diener inquired on the status of obtaining Kitsap County Commissioner support.

Councilmember Chang asked about financial costs and requested support.

Mr. Steve Sego addressed the comments of the council.

B. Residential Parking

Mayor Putaansuu spoke to multiple expired passes recently noticed by Parking Enforcement, to which a letter was generated to those impacted. Thought it would be appropriate to give a friendly notice, instead of a mass citations. Also, explained that in order to remedy the issue for the future a new format of passes have been ordered that adhere to the inside of the glass and have an expiration date on the pass itself.

Councilmember Chang expressed his concern with the content of the letter not giving details, such as a date on the letter or the process on how to renew.

Councilmember Ashby asked if there is an opportunity to rewrite letter to include the process.

Mayor Putaansuu stated that rewriting the letter will be discussed at the Director's Meeting to be had the following day.

Councilmember Chang suggested referring residential parking concerns to a committee, as citizens have expressed other areas of concerns.

Councilmember, mayor and staff discussed adding the discussion item to a future committee meeting.

9. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 7:25 p.m., Mayor Putaansuu recessed the meeting for a 10-minute executive session to discuss a potential litigation matter pursuant to RCW 42.30.110.(1)(i). City Attorney Cates, Public Works Director Dorsey, and Development Director Bond were invited to attend.

At 7:35 p.m., Mayor Putaansuu reconvened Council back into regular session.

MOTION: By Councilmember Cucciardi, seconded by Councilmember Ashby, to add Agenda Item to Adopt an Emergency Interim Ordinance amending Chapter 20.39 of the port orchard municipal code to adopt interim regulations related to social services facilities.

The motion carried.

MOTION: By Councilmember Cucciardi, seconded by Councilmember Rosapepe, to adopt an emergency interim zoning ordinance amending chapter 20.39 of the port orchard municipal code to adopt interim regulations related to social services facilities.

Mayor Putaansuu gave a summary as the reason to address the emergency interim zoning ordinance, regarding housing sexually violent predators and to protect the community.

Staff and councilmembers discussed permitting, public hearing, establishing additional criteria, timeframe for ordinance adoption, and a similar location in the industrial park.

The motion carried.

Councilmember Clauson reported that the Finance Committee meeting is to be scheduled.

Councilmember Ashby reported on the April 8th Economic Development and Tourism Committee meeting.

Councilmember Lucarelli reported the Utilities Committee is scheduled to meet April 15th. The Sewer Advisory Committee is scheduled to meet April 24th. The Festival of Chimes and Lights Committee is scheduled to meet April 15th.

Councilmember Diener reported on the Land Use committee meeting that met on March 25th. Next meeting is scheduled for April 22nd.

Councilmember Rosapepe reported the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee is scheduled to meet April 10th.

Mayor Putaansuu reported on Kitsap Transit Board meeting and the new ferry arriving.

Councilmember Ashby reported on the Peninsula Regional Transportation Planning Organization (PRTPO) meeting and advised that an Interlocal Agreement will be brought forward as a discussion item at the next council meeting.

City Clerk Rinearson informed that the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee time was incorrect on the agenda, and the correct time is 5:30pm.

13. CITIZEN COMMENTS

Dick Vlist expressed concern of the lack of curbing on the highway and the fog lane, which has resulted in his customers getting ticketed, as their tire was partially on the sidewalk. Also, concerned that someone is going to get hurt if they don't pull up further on the sidewalk.

Stacey Bronson, with daughter Paige Lutz, Karen Spangler, Martha Mitchell, tenants of Marlee Apartments, expressed safety concerns with the pocket park construction. Stated that there has been communication with a city employee, but there hasn't been any resolution at this time. Asked that someone do something about it. Also, inquired about getting the safety concern added as a discussion item on to the next meeting's agenda.

Public Works Director Dorsey stated that he will meet with the contractor regarding the safety concerns.

Summary: Discussion was held during the April 9, 2019, Council meeting regarding the proposed Community Events Center and a resolution that confirms the City's participation as a public partner with the Port of Bremerton and Kitsap County.

It is anticipated the Port of Bremerton will be adopting a similar resolution during their April 23rd meeting and Kitsap County is also in the process of bringing forward a resolution in the next few weeks.

Relationship to Comprehensive Plan: The development of the South Kitsap Community Events Center would support and implement several goals and policies of the City's Comprehensive Plan:

Goal 9. Encourage the ongoing development of downtown as an active, vibrant community, commercial, social, and civic center while respecting its historic character.

Policy LU-28 In conjunction with the proposed Centers strategy, enhance downtown Port Orchard's role as the center of the South Kitsap region, reflecting the following principles in development standards and land use plans:

- Encourage land uses that support transit centers and promote pedestrian activity.
- Promote a mix of uses, including retail, office, and housing.
- Encourage uses that will provide both daytime and evening activities.
- Support civic, cultural, and entertainment activities.
- Provide sufficient public open space and recreational opportunities.
- Enhance, and provide access to, the waterfront.
- Develop enhanced design guidelines and design review requirements that promote attractive, pedestrian-scale development and redevelopment within the City's historic downtown area.

Policy LU-30 Ensure land use designations and development support existing maritime industries, promote creative uses of the waterfront, and facilitate the planning and construction of waterfront parks and gathering places.

Policy CN-19 Encourage residential use above commercial and retail ground floor developments, including incentives and public amenities.

Policy CN-21 Facilitate the planning and construction of waterfront parks or gathering places.

Policy ED-7 The City shall prioritize economic development and redevelopment in local centers.

Policy ED-39 As appropriate, work with other jurisdictions and agencies such as state and federal agencies, tribes, the Port of Bremerton, the cities, the Kitsap Economic Development Alliance (KEDA), Port Orchard Chamber of Commerce, and the Kitsap County Public Utilities Districts, in marketing and developing the City of Port Orchard.

Recommendation: Staff recommends adoption of a resolution confirming the City's participation as a public partner with the Port of Bremerton and Kitsap County to support the proposed South Kitsap Community Events Center.

Motion for Consideration: I move to adopt a resolution confirming the City's participation as a public partner with the Port of Bremerton and Kitsap County to support the proposed South Kitsap Community Events Center.

Fiscal Impact: This proposal is not expected to impact the city's budget.

Alternatives: Do not adopt resolution.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PORT ORCHARD, WASHINGTON, CONFIRMING ITS PARTICIPATION AS A PUBLIC PARTNER WITH THE PORT OF BREMERTON AND KITSAP COUNTY TO SUPPORT THE PROPOSED SOUTH KITSAP COMMUNITY EVENTS CENTER.

WHEREAS, the City of Port Orchard and the South Kitsap community have been lacking and in need of a central gathering place and community "Events/Activity Center" venue for decades; and,

WHEREAS, a regional development team has created a Master Plan for the redevelopment of an area of downtown Port Orchard including a Community Events and Activity Center, shoreline restoration, parking, retail, office and residential development; and,

WHEREAS, this project would result in an investment estimated at \$120 million into Port Orchard's downtown, and could include a corporate headquarters for Kitsap Bank; and,

WHEREAS, the investment in this area of downtown will increase the assessed valuation of these parcels from \$3.95 million to \$120 million, resulting in a net increase in annual post-development property tax revenue to various agencies as follows:

City of Port Orchard: \$193,607 State School Levy: \$308,892

Kitsap County Current Expense: \$103,605 Kitsap County Mental Health: \$2,901 Kitsap County Veterans Relief: \$1,509 Kitsap County Conservation Futures: \$4,324 South Kitsap Fire & Rescue: \$223,242

Port of Bremerton: \$34,154 Kitsap Regional Library: \$45,700 Public Utility District No. 1: \$7,408

South Kitsap School District: \$246,451; and

WHEREAS, the Kitsap Bank corporate headquarters and surrounding Master Plan project would create hundreds of jobs, retail activity, shoreline restoration, public spaces and result in Kitsap Bank remaining in the community of its founding for many decades to come; and,

WHEREAS, the Master Plan project is consistent with and implements the goals and policies of the City's Comprehensive Plan for redevelopment and economic revitalization of the downtown area, and provision of transit-oriented and affordable housing; and,

WHEREAS, the Master Plan project is consistent with the Puget Sound Regional Council's VISION 2040 directive to encourage growth and development in areas that are served by high-capacity transit, such as the Washington State ferry system, the Port Orchard-

Bremerton foot ferry, and Kitsap Transit's fast ferries; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan project is dependent upon the construction and operations of a Community Events Center (CEC) as part of the project; and,

WHEREAS, the Kitsap Public Facilities District (KPFD) is evaluating the proposed funding of a large portion of the CEC dependent upon the Public Partners raising the remaining funding by pursuing local, state, and federal grant sources, private benefactors and other appropriate sources; and,

WHEREAS, the Port of Bremerton (POB) has agreed to serve as the Public Partner for this purpose and is willing to facilitate the funding of the project; and,

WHEREAS, Kitsap County is also considering joining the City of Port Orchard and the Port of Bremerton as a Public Partner as described below; and,

WHEREAS, the KPFD is seeking confirmation that the communities affected and benefitted by the CEC are willing to support the project; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ORCHARD, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

THAT:

- 1. The City agrees to join the Port of Bremerton as a Public Partner in this project to assist with the effort to identify and secure funding for the CEC project, including local, state and federal grant sources, private benefactors and other appropriate sources for the funding of the project.
- 2. The Mayor and staff will provide expertise and participation as a joint applicant in funding requests.
- 3. The City will coordinate with Public Partners, including POB and Kitsap County, to determine underlying CEC ownership and operations funding sources.
- 4. Funding committed by the KPFD to the CEC project will not be fully awarded until the Public Partners raised the additional funds to for total project and operations details have been successfully completed.
- 5. The City of Port Orchard is willing to support the CEC operations as an applicant for the City's lodging funds.

- Funding committed by the KPFD to the CEC project will not be fully awarded until the Public Partners have raised the additional funds to fully support the project and its projected operating costs.

Summary: On March 12, 2019, the Port Orchard City Council Authorized Change Orders No. 14 through 18 for Contract No. C037-17 with Active Construction, Inc., thereby bringing the current value of all change orders to date to a total of \$1,483,831.06, or 148.4% of the Contingency Value. Tonight's action is for the approval of Change Order No. 19 (Removal of Unsuitable Material & SG Repair) at \$102,608.32, Change Order No. 20 (Reroute of existing Canyon Court SSFM) at \$36,408.94, Change Order No. 21, (Time Extension – CO#12 Associated Costs) at \$10,766.75, Change Order No. 22 (Cost Value Reconciliation – Deduction) at <\$160,810.55> and Change Order No. 23 (Trench Backfill Reconciliation) at a net result of \$202,760.20. Approval of these change orders brings the current value of all change orders to date to a total \$1,675,564.72, or 167.6% of the Contingency Value. WRITTEN JUSTIFICATION

1. DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE.

Remove unsuitable material under the roadway of Tremont St., Pottery Ave. & S Kitsap Blvd for a depth of 1 to 2 feet, replace with geotextile fabric and fill with dryer material consisting of silty sand with varying gravel content mixed with crushed/ground asphalt "cuttings." Excavated material was soft/loose, moist to wet, gray silty sand with gravel and silt with sand and gravel. Change is to include all labor, equipment, and material cost involved with the removal, disposal of the material off-site, placement of the geotextile fabric and replacement of unsuitable foundation material in locations identified by the Contracting Agency and is paid for by force account.

2. WHAT IS REQUIRED BY CONTRACT? WHY THE CHANGE? (REFERENCE PLAN SHEETS & SPEC SECTIONS.)

- The plans and specifications do not address the removal of unsuitable material underneath the roadway prism and the contract does not include a bid item for this work.
- Deflecting (pumping) material was observed by the Geotechnical Engineer under equipment tires on the Tremont Street subgrade. The Geotechnical Engineer probed the subgrade with a ½ inch diameter steel rod resulting in penetrations of about 1 to 1.5 feet. Based on the Geotechnical engineer's observations and probing, it was determined that the pumping subgrade observed was not in a firm and unyielding condition and not suitable for roadway support.
- WSDOT Standard specification Section 2-06.3 requires that the subgrade be compacted to a depth of 6 inches. Compaction shall achieve 95 percent of the maximum density determined under the tests described in Section 2-03.3(14)D. If the underlying material is too soft to permit proper compaction of the subgrade, the Contractor shall loosen, aerate (or excavate and remove), and compact the subgrade until the top layer can be compacted as required.
- The Geotechnical Engineer recommends the pumping subgrade material be removed and replaced with compacted structural fill.

3. HOW IS CHANGE ORDER THE SOLUTION?

This change order provides a firm and unyielding subgrade that is suitable for roadway support and meets the requirements of WSDOT Std. Spec. Section 2-06.3.

ALTERNATIVE(S) CONSIDERED.

Alternatives that were considered were, the pumping subgrade material may have been excavated, stockpiled and allowed to dry, or the excavated material may also have been mixed with dryer fill. Then the dryer material may have then been placed and compacted to a firm unyielding condition.

5. REASON FOR ENTITLEMENT AND WHY IT CANNOT BE PAID UNDER EXISTING CONTRACT.

The requirement for the over excavation of the roadway subgrade is an additional work beyond the scope of the contract. In accordance with 1-04.4 the contractor is entitled to an equitable adjustment.

Reason For Change

There are 390 working days specified in the original contract. Change order 1 added 8 working days to the Contract and is reflected in the latest statement of working days. The Contractor requested additional working days on previous change orders but those could not be evaluated until a schedule update was submitted. The Contractor submitted an updated schedule with a run date of December 18, 2018.

As of the end of December 2018 (Weekly Statement of Working Days No. 73) there are 83.5 working days remaining to complete the project. The completion schedule shows that 25 working days are required in January and February of 2019 to progress the work to the proposed suspension date of February 5, 2019. Upon resuming work 6 May 2019 until Physical Completion 80 working days are needed per the Completion Schedule. Therefore the Contractor will need a total of 105 working days in 2019 to complete the project contingent upon not counting working days during the suspension. The result is an additional 21.5 working days, beyond the 83.5 working days remaining as of December 31, 2018, are needed to accommodate a Physical Completion date of August 22, 2019. The completion schedule reflects past delays to the critical path activities due to change orders and added critical path work such as dewatering to install the 30 inch storm sewer at the south end of the project.

This change adds 21.5 non-compensable working days to the project other than the costs shown for the extended trailer rental and utilities.

Reason For Change

The Contract documents contain conflicting information regarding the use of native material and Gravel Borrow as trench backfill in Schedule A, B and C. Schedule D calls out a measurement item for trench backfill but does not include a payment item. This change represents an equitable adjustment for the work performed.

This change also incorporates reductions of plan quantities that were overestimated in the Contract and for bid items that were not used due to site conditions.

Description

This Change Order compensates the Contractor for Gravel Borrow including Haul used as trench backfill for storm drainage trenches and east vault backfill in Schedule A, trench backfill for waterline trenches in Schedule B, trench backfill for sewer line trenches in Schedule C and backfill for joint utility trenches in Schedule D. The agreed per ton price includes the cost to move the Gravel Borrow from stockpile to trench and place and compact the material.
