




For the future intersection at Salmonberry, please rank the following elements in order of their importance to you...



Do you have any other thoughts or concerns about the Bethel/Salmonberry Road roundabout concepts?

- 139 open-ended responses
- Common response themes included:
 - Access to Salmonberry Road (about 32% of responses): Concerns raised about potential negative impact on residents and emergency services if access to Salmonberry Road were limited or eliminated
 - **Traffic Safety and Accidents (30%):** Concerns about the current traffic conditions and frequency of accidents at the intersection and the need for improvements to enhance safety
 - Impact of New Growth/Developments (28%): Highlighted the impact of new developments on traffic congestion, stressed the importance of addressing infrastructure needs alongside future population growth
 - **Roundabout Suitability (25%):** Some questioned whether a roundabout is the most appropriate solution, with concerns about its effectiveness in handling the high volume of traffic on Bethel Road
 - **Desire for Multi-Lane Roundabout (19%):** Some respondents specifically expressed a belief that a larger/multi-lane roundabout would better accommodate traffic/future growth
 - Concerns About 3-Leg Roundabout (15%): These concerns revolved around the potential limitations and inconveniences of a three-leg roundabout, particularly regarding traffic flow and access




Do you have any other thoughts or concerns about the character of the Bethel Road corridor?

- 29 open-ended responses
- Common response themes included:
 - Traffic Flow and Congestion (about 24% of responses): Concerns raised about traffic flow and congestion on Bethel Road, emphasizing the need for solutions such as left turn lanes, road widening, and improved traffic management
 - **Emphasis on Vehicle Traffic (20%):** Highlighted the lack of pedestrian activity on Bethel Road and suggested prioritizing car and/or bicycle infrastructure over pedestrian-friendly amenities
 - Importance of Doing It Right (16%): Emphasizing the need for careful planning, long-term considerations, and ensuring that the project serves the community's needs effectively
 - Safety and Separation of Non-Motorized Traffic (12%): Emphasized the importance of safety for both cyclists and pedestrians by separating them from car traffic


Original Cross Section
