### **Mayors Corner**

My first Mayor's corner for the New Year typically has me looking forward to what is slated for the coming year. 2018 has started out quite busy. City of Ruston was made aware that the City of Tacoma was seeking new legislation to allow it to forcibly annex a portion of the City of Ruston without the consent of Ruston, contrary to long established Washington law. To pass legislation to forcibly remove the best commercial property in Ruston and give it to Tacoma would not be in the interests of the people who call Ruston "home" nor would it be in the interest of any small city that is adjacent to a large city. Last week, Representative Jake Fey, Representative Laurie Jinkins and Senator Jeannie Darneille, presented Bill #HB 2880 – 2017-18, Companion Bill #SB 6487 to Local Government.

#### Greetings

We continue to take reports of thefts from vehicles. It is quite clear that the criminal element has chosen to seek crimes of opportunity within our community. While there have been a couple of recent business burglaries and break ins, that majority of reports are centered around Ruston citizens that for one reason or another have left their car unlocked and in some cases even left the keys in the car. Crime prevention really starts with our citizens first. While we have a comfortable, safe living environment; the transient traffic passing through has become somewhat of a challenge. While we are working on strategies to address this issue please take preventative measures to prevent these crimes from occurring by not leaving valuables visible, locking you cars, homes and businesses. If you have a video and alarm system, all the better.

We have two new officers starting with us this month, Leighton Cox and Sergie Andres. Both have previous experience so if you see them around please feel free to introduce yourselves and talk with them. As these new officers learn their new positions, they will be part of our team to enhance the safety and security of our City.

We are making plans to work on a web site and Facebook revisions at this time. Our plan is to use these forms of communication better to keep you informed of events and developments. Please remember that if you need to talk to an officer the quickest way is to use the non-emergency line at South Sound 911 rather than the police department phone number as we do not have staff in the station to answer the phone. We contract dispatching services through South Sound and they will quickly dispatch one of us to meet or call you.

Please take time to check your property to make sure there are no bushes or tree branches overhanging above and along sidewalks. This creates a potential hazard for pedestrians. If you notice any overgrowth, please take care of it as soon as possible. Ruston has an ordinance that addresses this as obstructing streets, alleys and sidewalks. Also, overhead connection from service pole to the residence should be a clear path and maintained by property owner. Notices will be sent out in the form of a letter regarding these concerns.
