## **Mayors Corner**

The holidays always mean different things to many people. For me it means family, friends and community spending time together. This is also the time of year I reflect on our financial performance from our current year and projections for next year. We continue to invest in our future making significant investments into our public safety departments.

For 2019 we have entered into an interlocal agreement with the City of Fircrest that will integrate our two court systems. We will be utilizing Fircrest's court to handle the increased activity our court has seen over the past couple of years. This was a difficult decision to make but the need to improve public safety was the primary factor. On court days City Hall did not have the capacity to house everyone therefore they spilled out onto the adjacent properties. In order to upgrade City Hall to handle the increased capacity and improve our safety features the costs were prohibitive. The interlocal provides us with increased capacity while minimizing our long-term financial ramifications.

In 2019 we will also be transitioning away from our contracted landscaping service and moving the work in-house. While outsourcing this over the years was financially prudent, we have seen the contract costs almost double for next year and it is no longer a viable alternative.

The city's financial health continues to improve every year and our future looks very bright.
