I was asked to deliver an update on the Pt Ruston project to the Washington senate committee for local government on January 15th. Last February we agreed to allow Tacoma to process permits for the entire Pt Ruston development in an attempt to speed up development. Since February of last year there has been one permit issued. That permit is a shell building permit for the Public Market at Pt Ruston so we should see the construction begin soon. We hope that 2019 produces much more than one permit because the developer has a very tight time line to complete the remediation of the site. EPA has given the developer until 2020 to have all the remedial action complete. If you are interested in what that timeline looks like, please visit our city website at www.rustonorg.com and you will be able to view the slide show that was presented to the senate committee.

Last council meeting we heard from the Ruston-Point Defiance Business District and they reported that their first wine walk event was hugely successful. I regret we were out of town and couldn't attend but I heard from those that did that it was an outstanding event. Glad to see the community supporting our local businesses and its leading to heightened interest in businesses wanting to establish themselves in Ruston.

Christmas Tree Recycling: Christmas trees will be picked up with regular yard waste. The tree must be free of any decoration or flocking or anything else not part of the tree. Please cut the tree up in three (3) feet sections and place them in your yard waste cart (do not jam them in) or place them two (2) feet away from your yard waste cart it and it will be collected.

Remember to protect your plumbing by disconnecting your garden hose, drain irrigation systems and shut off and drain water from pipes leading to outside faucets. Insulate exposed pipes, valves and faucets. Report a water emergency by contacting Tacoma Public Utilities Water Division at 253-502-8384.
