# **Mayors Corner**

The City was awarded grant funds for crack sealing all our roadways. The work commenced on August 21<sup>st</sup> and is scheduled to be completed by August 28<sup>th</sup>. Sealing pavement cracks is very important in that it prevents water from penetrating beneath the asphalt and prolongs the roadways life expectancy. A copy of the Crack Seal schedule has been posted on the City website. The City continues to be extremely successful in securing new grants and staff should be commended for their work.

City staff has also begun working on securing a grant from EPA for remedial work that still needs to occur within the city. Most of the work is centered around Rust Park and the hillside leading from the park over to Baltimore Street. We have also entered discussion with BNSF railway about doing a land exchange. Currently the railroad tracks run through the City right of way while Rust Park encompasses some BNSF property which we pay rent for every year. We are looking to vacate the right of way in exchange for the BNSF property that helps form Rust Park. These discussions have been going on for years and we have made significant progress in working with BNSF. The City remains hopeful in getting this done.

EPA brought in a large crane for the shoreline armoring. The crane is located near Dunes Park and will remain in place until work is complete in February 2024

### From the Police Department

In the spring of each year, Ruston Police Department officers emphasize the use of high-volume traffic stops in an attempt to discourage racer-inspired vehicles from violating our anti-racing ordinance. Year-to-date-from January through June, your Ruston Police Department was among the highest performing small agencies in Pierce County for misdemeanor and traffic cases presented to its court of jurisdiction.

Additionally, Sergeant Clayton Grubb is being recognized by the Washington Traffic Safety Commission and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) for his efforts in traffic enforcement. Sergeant Grubb is within the top 5 performers of all police and sheriff deputies in Pierce County and has been invited to receive his award at the NHTSA annual conference in Wenatchee next month.
