Project Need

- Lack of connectivity
- Deficient traffic operations
- Limited bicycle and pedestrian facilities
- Absent transit links

Project Purpose

- Improve regional connectivity between northbound US Route 101 and eastbound Interstate 580.
- Improve traffic operations on local streets and freeway.
- Enhance the active transportation (bicycle and pedestrian) network and improve bicycle and pedestrian safety within the community.
- Improve transit access and travel times.
- Support economic prosperity by providing better and more reliable access to local businesses.
- Improve community cohesion by enhancing local connectivity to work, school, and businesses for disadvantaged communities near the project area.


Project Alternatives

3 Build Alternatives + 1 No-Build Alternative

- Alternative 1: Local street improvements on Bellam Boulevard
- Alternative 2: Connector between
 US 101 and I-580 along Simms Street + all improvements in Alternative 1
- Alternative 3: Connector near Bellam Blvd off-ramp + all improvements in Alternative 1

Prefer separation between bike and pedestrian facilities Multiple turning movements between intersections










Alternative 1 (Option B: Signalized Intersections) Bellam Blvd






What is a Citywide Bicycle & Pedestrian Plan (CBPP)?


- Guides the development of infrastructure projects and programs to support safe and comfortable bicycling, walking, and rolling















Pedestrian Crash Analysis

229 crashes involving pedestrians from 2018-2023




Pedestrian Crash Locations

 Intersections and roads with highest number of pedestrian collisions are all in downtown




Bicycle Crash Analysis

 Intersections and roads with highest number of pedestrian collisions are all in downtown and the Canal









What is the Capital Improvement Program (CIP)?

The CIP is a multi-year planning tool used to identify and implement the City's capital needs over the upcoming 3-year period. The CIP document summarizes the City's planned capital and infrastructure improvement projects, including their funding sources, and prioritizes projects after analysis and coordination with other City departments in order to ensure that all department needs are represented. Project selection and priority is based on recommendations by the Department Directors to accommodate high priority needs, which focused on life/safety, maintenance and repair, public and Council input, and other factors. The CIP is intended to provide a comprehensive three-year project list for the City's known capital and infrastructure needs.


