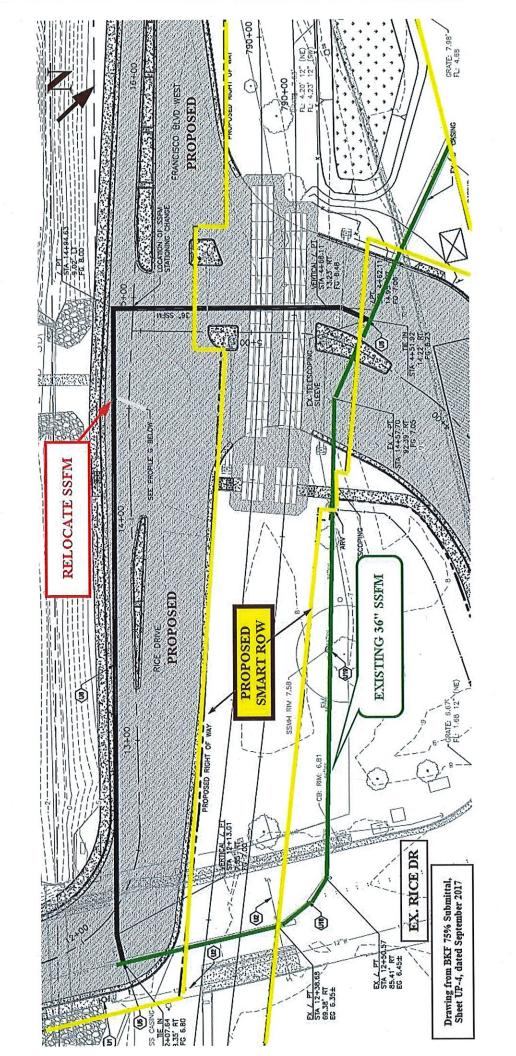

I request that you conduct a closed session during your special meeting on **March 16**th, **2018**, to discuss the following matter: (1) significant exposure to litigation pursuant to California Government Code §54956.9(d)(2). In my opinion, public discussion of this matter would prejudice your position.

The specific reasons and the legal authority for the closed session are:

Government Code Section 54956.9(d)(2). A legislative body of a local agency may hold closed sessions with the local agency's designated representatives when a point has been reached where, in the opinion of the legislative body of the local agency on the advice of its legal counsel, based on existing facts and circumstances, there is a significant exposure to litigation against the local agency.

It should be noted that Government Code Section 54954.5 requires the Board to post a Closed Session item on the Board Agenda. With respect to the above referenced matter, you should include the number of potential cases (estimated at one at this juncture) and the fact that the Board will be meeting with counsel regarding the anticipated litigation. Please note that disclosure of any facts of this matter may, in my opinion, prejudice the District.

FUNDING AGREEMENT

SONOMA-MARIN AREA RAIL TRANSIT

San Rafael Sewer Force Main Relocation at Rice Drive

THIS FUNDING AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into as of ______, 2018, by and between the SONOMA-MARIN AREA RAIL TRANSIT (SMART) DISTRICT, a public entity duly established under the laws of California (District), and the SAN RAFAEL SANITATION DISTRICT, (SRSD).

Recitals

- A. The rail corridor, commonly known as the Northwestern Pacific Railroad (NWP), generally parallels Highway 101 running north-south in Sonoma and Marin Counties. The NWP corridor is owned by the District from Milepost (MP) 68.22 in Healdsburg southward to MP 11.4 in Corte Madera.
- B. District operates and maintains the rail corridor in accordance with applicable California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) and Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) laws and regulations.
- C. District has completed California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review and is proceeding with design and construction of passenger rail service along an approximately 70-mile existing rail corridor extending from Cloverdale in Sonoma County, California, to a location near the ferry terminal in Larkspur, Marin County, California (the "SMART Rail Project").
- D. The District and the City of San Rafael ("City") are realigning Francisco Boulevard West and Rice Drive in order to close two at-grade crossing (Francisco Boulevard at Second and Irwin Street) in order to support the City's Andersen Drive at-grade crossing application to the CPUC.
- E. The City requested that utilities relocate their facilities in and around Rice Drive where a portion of Rice Drive will be realigned.
- F. SRSD intends to reconstruct and relocate its sanitary sewer force main from the portion of Rice Drive that is closing to the realigned to the Francisco Boulevard West.
- G. The District prepared initial relocation plans and included them in the District's design-build Contract CV-DB-16-001 as part of this Agreement as Exhibit B (SRSD Work).
- H. SRSD is funding the SRSD Work cost of \$600,000 which includes all costs to pay for its share of relocating the sewer facilities. These costs are detailed in Bid Item 7B Sanitary Sewer Force Main of the District's design-build Contract CV-DB-16-001 that is incorporated and included as part of this agreement as Exhibit B.

Agreement

THE DISTRICT AND SRSD HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. RECITALS

A. The above recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated in and expressly form a part of this Agreement.

2. COORDINATION

A. SRSD shall coordinate the work with District's Chief Engineer or his designee. Contact information for the parties' respective representatives is set forth below:

3. **DISTRICT'S RESPONSIBILITIES**

District shall be responsible for the following:

- A. <u>Construction Documents</u>: District shall prepare and provide SRSD with construction documents and allow 10 working days for review.
- B. <u>Contracting:</u> District shall contract for the work through its design-build Contract CV-DB-016-001 with Stacy Witbeck/Herzog joint venture.
- C. <u>Changed Circumstances:</u> District shall promptly notify SRSD in writing of any potential change or unforeseen conditions. SRSD shall promptly investigate the change or conditions, and if it finds that the circumstance is a change, District shall provide a change proposal delineating the changed or unforeseen condition and an increase or decrease of costs, for SRSD's approval.

4. SRSD'S RESPONSIBILITIES

SRSD agrees to perform the following:

- A. <u>Permits:</u> SRSD shall obtain any permits that may be necessary from the City of San Rafael for construction of the Project.
- B. <u>Payment</u>: The District will invoice SRSD in monthly as invoices are received from the contractor. SRSD shall pay District within thirty (30) days after receipt of undisputed invoice.

- C. Review of Construction Documents: SRSD shall review the construction documents within ten working days of submittal. If SRSD fails to approve or provide written comments on the any set of the Construction Documents within the review period, SRSD shall be deemed to have approved such Construction Documents. SRSD may not unreasonably withhold approval as long as the construction documents are consistent with the design-build engineering documents in Exhibit B.
- D. <u>Staffing:</u> SRSD agrees to provide adequate staffing to effectively review, inspect and approve construction of the SRSD Work. SRSD shall designate appropriate Staff to review, inspect and approve construction activities related to construction of the SRSD Work.
- E. <u>Inspection:</u> SRSD shall be responsible for timely inspecting and approving the work for the SRSD Work, at no cost to the District. SRSD may not direct or provide instruction to the District's contractor in any way.
- F. <u>Construction Support:</u> SRSD may provide support to the contractor during construction in order to realize cost savings. Support activities could include such tasks as redirecting sewage flow to eliminate need for a pump around, or removing effluent from the isolated line for treatment. The support activities must be approved by the District in writing prior to implementing them.
- G. <u>Schedule:</u> SRSD acknowledges that time is of the essence and that completion of the SRSD Work is necessary so as to not delay the Larkspur Extension Project.
- H. <u>Maintenance</u>: SRSD shall be deemed the owner and operator of the SRSD Work and shall continue to be responsible for all on-going operation and future maintenance and costs associated with the SRSD Work.

5. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Amendments to Agreement

This Agreement may be amended only by the mutual written consent of both parties.

B. Indemnification

Each party shall indemnify, defend, protect, hold harmless, and release the other, its officers, agents, and employees, from and against any and all claims, loss, proceedings, damages, causes of action, liability, costs, or expense (including attorneys' fees and witness costs) arising from or in connection with, or caused by any act, omission, or negligence of such indemnifying party. This indemnification obligation shall not be limited in any way by any limitation of the amount or type of acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

C. Termination

Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving 30-days prior written notice to the other party, in the manner described in Section 5.D of this Agreement, of its intent to terminate. Should SRSD terminate this agreement, DISTRICT shall be entitled to receive the full payment for all costs rendered prior to termination and any claims, loss, damages or profit incurred by the District's contractor.

D. Notice

Unless otherwise requested by a party, all notices, demands, requests, consents or other communications which may be or are required to be given by either party to the other shall be in writing and shall be deemed effective upon service. Notices shall be deemed to have been properly given when served on the party to whom the same is to be given by hand delivery or by deposit in the United States mail addressed to the party as follows:

When a notice is given by a generally recognized overnight courier service, the notice, invoice or payment shall be deemed received on the next business day. When a notice or payment is sent via United States Mail, it shall be deemed received seventy-two (72) hours after deposit in the United States Mail, registered or certified, return receipt requested, with the postage thereon fully prepaid. In all other instances, notices, and payments shall be effective upon receipt by the recipient. Changes may be made in the names and addresses of the person to whom notices are to be given by giving notice pursuant to this paragraph.

E. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

F. Entire Agreement

This instrument contains the entire agreement between the parties, and no statement, promise, or inducement made by either party or agents of the

parties that is not contained in this written contract shall be valid or binding; and this contract may not be enlarged, modified, or altered except in writing signed by the parties.

G. No Third Party beneficiary

This Agreement is between the Parties and no other person or entity is an express, intended, or implied third party beneficiary hereof.

H. Waiver

Unless agreed to in writing by the Parties, the waiver by a Party of any breach, violation, or default of a provision of this Agreement will not operate as a waiver of any subsequent breach, violation, or default of that or of any other provision of this Agreement. No extension of time for the performance of any obligation or act required by a Party hereunder will be deemed to be an extension of time for the performance of any other obligation or act.

I. Unenforceable Provisions

If a court of competent jurisdiction finds any provision of this Agreement to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the Parties agree that such provision will be enforced to the maximum extent permissible so as to effect the intent of the Parties, and the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement will not in any way be affected or impaired thereby. If necessary to effectuate the intent of the Parties, the Parties will negotiate in good faith to amend this Agreement to replace the unenforceable language with enforceable language that reflects such intent as closely as possible.

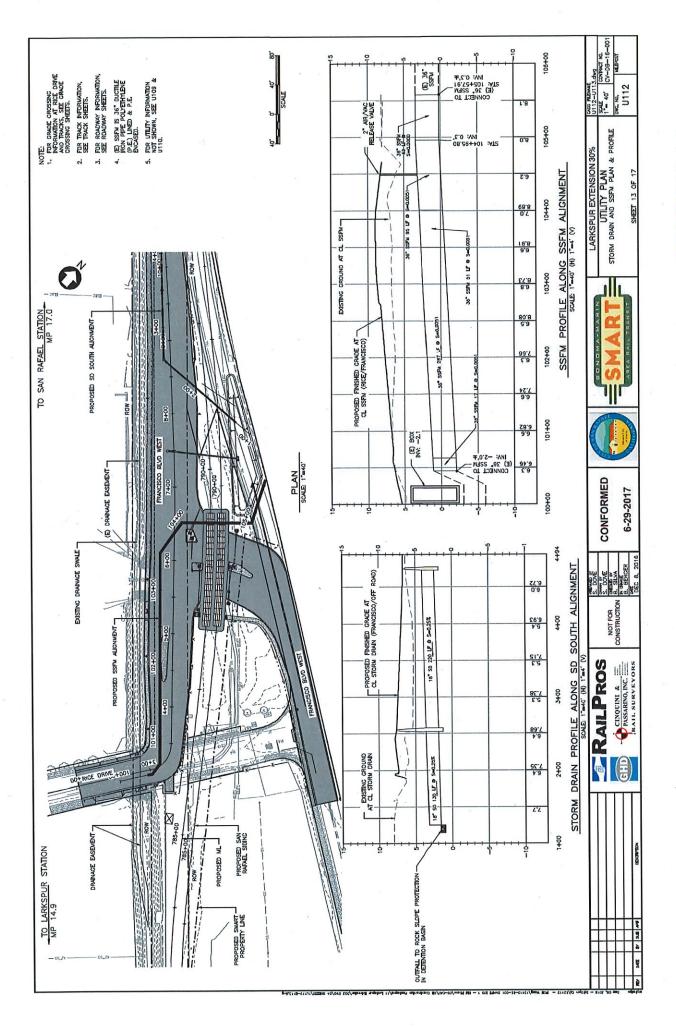
J. Counterparts

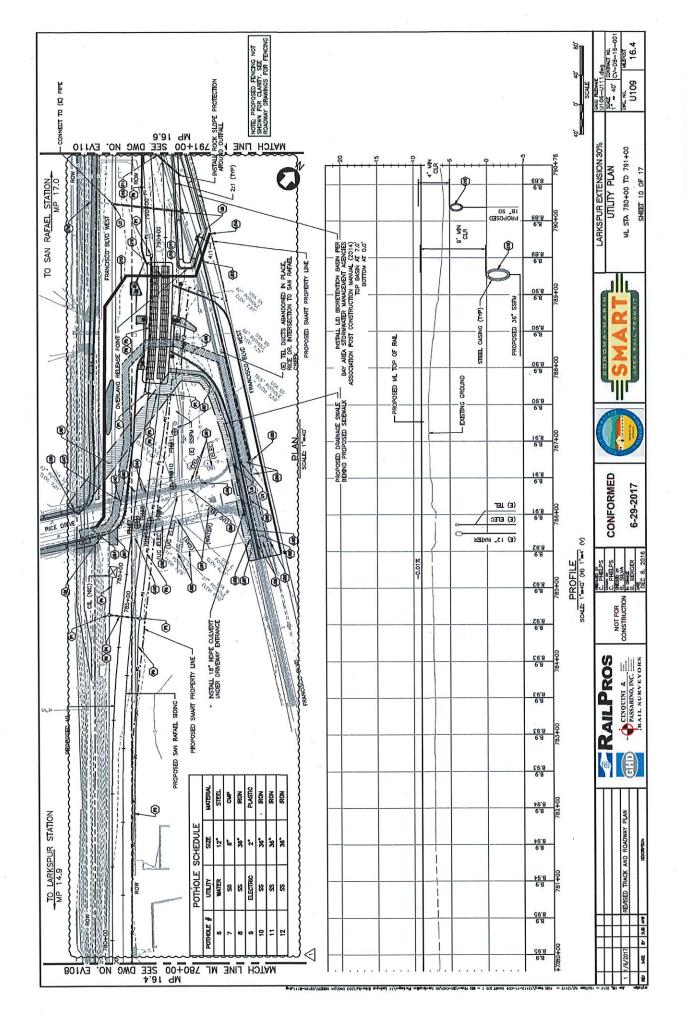

BACKGROUND:

At the December 22, 2017, Board meeting, the Board awarded the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project Rebid to Valentine Corporation. The contract specifications did not include the programming portion of work because District staff wanted this work to be performed by a consultant who is familiar with the programming of its pump stations.

Since WorkSmart Automation, Inc., has performed all the programming for our Cayes Main Pump Station, Glenwood Pump Station, and Loch Lomond Marina Pump Station, and installed the District's SCADA (Supervisory Control Data Acquisition) programming, staff asked WorkSmart to provide a proposal for the programming work for the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project.

ANALYSIS:

WorkSmart's staff has been responsive, has offered recommendations based upon their own experiences, and has performed extra work at fair costs.

WorkSmart has offered a proposal to perform the programming work for the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project at a lump-sum cost of \$39,000.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This project will be funded under the Pump Station and Force Main Capital Improvements Program in the current 2017-18 Budget.

ACTION REQUIRED:

Staff recommends that the Board adopt the resolution authorizing the District Manager/District Engineer to sign an Agreement with WorkSmart Automation, Inc., for programming related services for the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project Rebid.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR PROGRAMMING RELATED SERVICES FOR THE SAN PEDRO PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

This Agreement is made and entered into this 16th day of March, 2018, by and between the SAN RAFAEL SANITATION DISTRICT (hereinafter "DISTRICT"), and *WORKSMART AUTOMATION, INC.* (hereinafter "CONSULTANT").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT has selected WORKSMART AUTOMATION, INC., to perform the required programming related services for the "San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project" (hereinafter "PROJECT") for the DISTRICT; and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT has offered to render certain specialized professional services in connection with this PROJECT.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

DEFINITIONS.

DISTRICT and CONSULTANT have outlined the scope of services to be provided, and related expenses as described in Exhibit "A" attached and incorporated herein.

2. PROJECT COORDINATION

A. DISTRICT. The District Manager/District Engineer shall be the representative of the DISTRICT for all purposes under this Agreement. The Senior Civil Engineer is hereby designated as the PROJECT MANAGER for the DISTRICT, and said PROJECT MANAGER shall supervise all aspects of the progress and execution of this Agreement.

B. CONSULTANT. CONSULTANT shall assign a single PROJECT DIRECTOR to have overall responsibility for the progress and execution of this Agreement for CONSULTANT. DAN JONES is hereby designated as the PROJECT DIRECTOR for CONSULTANT. Should circumstances or conditions subsequent to the execution of this Agreement require a substitute PROJECT DIRECTOR for any reason, the CONSULTANT shall notify the DISTRICT within ten (10) business days of the substitution.

DUTIES OF CONSULTANT

CONSULTANT shall perform the duties and/or provide services as follows; the CONSULTANT agrees to provide professional services as a Programming Consultant to perform work outlined in the Proposal from CONSULTANT dated December 1, 2017, marked Exhibit "A", attached hereto, and incorporated herein by this reference. The CONSULTANT agrees to be available and perform the work specified in this agreement in the time frame as specified and as shown in Exhibit "A".

4. DUTIES OF THE DISTRICT

DISTRICT shall perform the duties as described and incorporated herein.

COMPENSATION

For the full performance of the services described herein by CONSULTANT, DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT on a lump-sum basis for services rendered as described in Exhibit "A" attached and incorporated herein. The total payment will not exceed the amount of \$39,000 as shown on the Proposal Budget, set out in Exhibit "A".

Payment will be made upon receipt by PROJECT MANAGER of an invoice submitted by CONSULTANT.

TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall be from the date of execution until the Project is complete.

7. TERMINATION

- A. Discretionary. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice mailed or personally delivered to the other party.
- B. Cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement for cause upon ten (10) days written notice mailed or personally delivered to the other party, and the notified party's failure to cure or correct the cause of the termination notice, to the reasonable satisfaction of the party giving such notice, within thirty (30) days of the receipt of said notice.
- C. Effect of Termination. Upon receipt of notice of termination, neither party shall incur additional obligations under any provision of this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other.
- D. Return of Documents. Upon termination, any and all DISTRICT documents or materials provided to CONSULTANT and any and all of CONSULTANT's documents and materials prepared for or relating to the performance of its duties under this Agreement, shall be delivered to DISTRICT as soon as possible, but not later than thirty (30) days after termination.

8. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

The written documents and materials prepared by the CONSULTANT in connection with the performance of its duties under this Agreement shall be the sole property of DISTRICT. DISTRICT may use said property for any purpose, including projects not contemplated by this Agreement.

9. INSPECTION AND AUDIT

Upon reasonable notice, CONSULTANT shall make available to DISTRICT, or its agent, for inspection and audit, all documents and materials maintained by CONSULTANT in connection with its performance of its duties under this Agreement. CONSULTANT shall fully cooperate with DISTRICT or its agent in any such audit or inspection.

10. ASSIGNABILITY

The parties agree that they shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement nor the performance of any of their respective obligations hereunder, without the prior written consent of the other party, and any attempt to so assign this Agreement or any rights, duties or obligations arising hereunder shall be void and of no effect.

11. INSURANCE

- A. During the term of this Agreement, CONSULTANT shall maintain, at no expense to DISTRICT, the following insurance policies:
- 1. A commercial general liability insurance policy in the minimum amount of one million (\$1,000,000) dollars per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate for death, bodily injury, personal injury, or property damage;
- 2. An automobile liability (owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles) insurance policy in the minimum amount of one million (\$1,000,000) dollars per occurrence;
- 3. If any licensed professional performs any of the services required to be performed under this Agreement, a professional liability insurance policy in the minimum amount of one million (\$1,000,000) dollars to cover any claims arising out of the CONSULTANT's performance of services under this Agreement.
- B. The insurance coverage required of the CONSULTANT by Section 11. A. shall also meet the following requirements:

- 1. The insurance shall be primary with respect to any insurance or coverage maintained by DISTRICT and shall not call upon DISTRICT's insurance or coverage for any contribution;
- 2. Except for professional liability insurance, the insurance policies shall be endorsed for contractual liability and personal injury;
- 3. Except for professional liability insurance, the insurance policies shall be specifically endorsed to include the DISTRICT, its officers, agents, and employees as additionally named insureds under the policies;
- 4. CONSULTANT shall provide to PROJECT MANAGER, (a) Certificates of Insurance evidencing the insurance coverage required herein, and (b) specific endorsements naming DISTRICT, its officers, agents and employees, as additional insureds under the policies;
- 5. The insurance policies shall provide that the insurance carrier shall not cancel or terminate said insurance policies except upon thirty (30) days written notice to DISTRICT's PROJECT MANAGER;
- 6. If the insurance is written on a Claims Made Form, then, following termination of this Agreement, said insurance coverage shall survive for a period of not less than five years as long as the insurance is reasonably affordable and available;
- 7. The insurance policies shall provide for a retroactive date of placement coinciding with the effective date of this Agreement;
- 8. The insurance shall be approved as to form and sufficiency by PROJECT MANAGER and the County Counsel.
- C. If it employs any person, CONSULTANT shall maintain Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance, as required by the State Labor Code and other applicable laws and regulations, and as necessary to protect both CONSULTANT and DISTRICT against all liability for injuries to CONSULTANT's officers and employees.
- D. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions exceeding \$20,000 in CONSULTANT's insurance policies must be declared to and approved by the PROJECT MANAGER and the County Counsel. At District's option, the deductibles or self-insured retentions with respect to DISTRICT shall be reduced or eliminated to DISTRICT's satisfaction, or CONSULTANT shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, attorney's fees, and defense expenses.

12. INDEMNIFICATION

CONSULTANT shall indemnify, release, and hold harmless DISTRICT, its officers, and employees against any claim, demand, suit, judgment, loss, liability, or expense of any kind, including attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting in any way from any negligent acts or omissions or negligence of CONSULTANT or CONSULTANT's officers, agents, and employees in the performance of their duties and obligations under this Agreement.

13. NONDISCRIMINATION

CONSULTANT shall not discriminate, in any way, against any person on the basis of age, sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin or disability in connection with or related to the performance of its duties and obligations under this Agreement.

14. COMPLIANCE WITH ALL LAWS

CONSULTANT shall use due professional care to observe and comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, codes, and regulations in the performance of its duties and obligations under this Agreement. CONSULTANT shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with these laws, ordinances, codes, and regulations.

15. NO THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES

DISTRICT and CONSULTANT do not intend, by any provision of this Agreement, to create in any third party any benefit or right owed by one party, under the terms and conditions of this Agreement, to the other party.

NOTICES

All notices and other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement, including any notice of change of address, shall be in writing and given by personal delivery or deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, addressed to the parties intended to be notified. Notice shall be deemed given as of the date of personal delivery or, if mailed, upon the date of deposit with the United States Postal Service. Notice shall be given as follows:

17. INDEPENDENT CONSULTANT

For the purposes and for the duration of this Agreement, CONSULTANT, its officers, agents, and employees shall act in the capacity of an Independent Contractor, and not as employees of the DISTRICT. CONSULTANT and DISTRICT expressly intend and agree that the status of CONSULTANT, its officers, agents, and employees be that of an Independent Contractor and not that of an employee of DISTRICT.

18. ENTIRE AGREEMENT -- AMENDMENTS

- A. The terms and conditions of this Agreement, all exhibits attached, and all documents expressly incorporated by reference represent the entire Agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- B. This written Agreement shall supersede any and all prior agreements, oral or written, regarding the subject matter between the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT.
- C. No other agreement, promise, or statement, written or oral, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement shall be valid or binding except by way of a written amendment to this Agreement.
- D. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall not be altered or modified except by a written amendment to this Agreement signed by the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT.
- E. If any conflicts arise between the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the terms and conditions of the attached exhibits or the documents expressly incorporated by reference, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall control.

19. SET-OFF AGAINST DEBTS

CONSULTANT agrees that DISTRICT may deduct from any payment due to CONSULTANT under this Agreement any monies which CONSULTANT owes DISTRICT under any ordinance, agreement, contract, or resolution for any unpaid taxes, fees, licenses, assessments, unpaid checks, or other amounts.

20. WAIVERS

The waiver by either party of any breach or violation of any term, covenant, or condition of this Agreement or of any ordinance, law, or regulation, shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other term, covenant, condition, ordinance, law, or regulation or of any subsequent breach or violation of the same or other term, covenant, condition, ordinance, law or regulation. The subsequent acceptance by either party of any fee, performance, or other consideration which may become due or owing under this Agreement, shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any preceding breach or violation by the other party of any term, condition, or covenant of this Agreement or any applicable law, ordinance, or regulation.

21. CITY BUSINESS LICENSE/OTHER TAXES

CONSULTANT shall obtain and maintain during the duration of this Agreement a CITY business license as required by the San Rafael Municipal Code. CONSULTANT shall pay any and all State and Federal taxes and any other applicable taxes. CONSULTANT's taxpayer identification number is 68-0486438, and CONSULTANT certifies under penalty of perjury that said taxpayer identification number is correct.

Hi Doris,

Pursuant to your request, WorkSmart Automation is pleased to submit this quotation for the above mentioned project. This quotation was generated based the contract documents we received from Mark Wilson via DropBox (dated 4-18-17 and 4/20/17) and our conference call with SRSD on 3-29-2017.

Overview

WorkSmart Automation shall supply the programming and assist with startup of the PLC and OIT Panel system in accordance with the contract documents specified in Section 16100 - Electrical Requirements and 17200 - Control Descriptions. We shall utilize our own licensed copies of the development software required to program these devices.

The following outlines WorkSmart's scope of work for this project:

Programming

The programming scope of tasks for WorkSmart Automation involves the following:

- PLC Ladder Logic Programming (4 PLCs) Provide programming for four (4) new PLCs in order to provide the control features specified and required to operate the new pump station and as specified. The four PLCs are as follows:
 - 1. Main San Pedro Pump Station PLC (referred to as SPPS)
 - 2. Pump 1 Control PLC
 - 3. Pump 2 Control PLC
 - Pump 3 Control PLC

The SPPS PLC shall execute programming logic that monitors Pumping Pit levels / float switches. Based on the level of the Pumping Pits, the SPPS PLC will send requests to each of the three Pump Control PLCs to start and stop their respective pumps as needed.

The Pump Control PLCs will execute their own programming logic that monitors the status of the float switches. This allows the individual Pump Control PLC to start/stop its own pump in the event of SPPS PLC failure. Each Pump Control PLC essentially replaces a large portion of the hardwired relay logic that was present in each pump control cabinet in past SRSD Pump Station designs.

OIT Programming

Provide programming for the new OIT (operator interface terminal) located at the new MCC panel to provide graphical control, alarm and indication features specified and required to operate the new pump station locally.

SCADA Programming

Provide programming and configuration for the FactoryTalk SCADA system to provide graphical control, alarm, and indication features specified and required to operate the new pump station from a remote location such as the corporate yard.

Alternate Communications Methodology

Per our discussion during our meeting at SRSD on April 18, 2017, WorkSmart shall design and implement an alternate communications methodology between SCADA and the SPPS in an effort to reduce the amount of radio bandwidth used. WorkSmart shall program the SPPS PLC to make its data available to SCADA via the Modbus TCP protocol, which is more efficient than the native Ethernet IP protocol used by CompactLogix PLCs.

The FactoryTalk View SCADA software does not have built-in capability to communicate via Modbus. A company called Kepware manufactures a suite of communications drivers that can be used by any SCADA system. One of the included communications drivers is Modbus TCP.

For the San Pedro Pump Station project, WorkSmart shall perform the following tasks:

- Install and configure the Kepware Modbus TCP Communications driver on the FactoryTalk View SCADA Server. Kepware can be run in demo mode for two hours at a time on a trial basis.
- Configure a new Digi-One protocol converter to add Modbus TCP capability. This will
 require an additional Digi-One protocol converter (in addition to the Digi-One protocol
 converter that is currently specified the currently specified Digi-One is used strictly for
 communications with the alarm annunciator panel).
- Design the San Pedro SPPS PLC programming logic to map data to Modbus style addressing
- 4. Design the Factory Talk View screens for San Pedro to use the Modbus style addresses

WorkSmart shall query radio statistics using the existing RSLinx Enterprise communications driver and query radio statistics using the Modbus TCP communications driver. The results from both metholds shall be compared in an effort to prove (or disprove) the effectiveness of Modbus versus Ethernet IP. If Modbus communications results in significant reduction of radio bandwidth used, this communications method can be reused as a template for future pump station designs. If Modbus communications does not result in any improvement, WorkSmart shall configure San Pedro PS to communicate using the RSLinx Enterprise communications driver to match existing stations.

In the event the alternate Modbus method is used, a fully licensed copy of the Kepware Modbus server and a 2nd Digi-One adapter will be required—this will be the responsibility of SRSD.

Testing

A representative of WorkSmart Automation will attend and participate in the required testing as specified and required for pump station operation for the following specified tests:

- Factory Test
 - WorkSmart Automation will attend and participate in the factory testing as specified and required for pump station operation.
- Field Functional Acceptance Test (FAT)
 WorkSmart Automation will participate in the field functional acceptance testing as specified and required for pump station operation.

Training

WorkSmart Automation shall provide operator/user training on the devices we program (PLC, OIT, and SCADA) during a 1—day visit consisting of two sessions. The first session shall be on-site at the pump station where we will review the program logic and discuss the operation and review the OIT graphics and how to operate the station using the available OIT displays. The second session will be on-site at the Corp yard where we will review the SCADA displays for the pump station and how to operate the station using the available SCADA displays.

Project Meetings

WorkSmart Automation will attend up to three (3) project meetings on-site as requested by CONTRACTOR or DISTRICT throughout the course of the project.

Warranty

WorkSmart Automation will warrant our programming and SCADA configuration for a period of one year from the date of acceptance as specified. We will correct any programming errors uncovered during this time at no additional charge. This warranty excludes operational changes and new features or changes to the PLC program, OIT and SCADA displays.

Assumptions / Exclusions

- WorkSmart will contract directly with owner (DISTRICT).
- No hardware or installation of hardware or wiring is included in this quote.
- No PLC or OIT programming and development software licensing is included in this quote.
- All Testing Plans and Testing Forms required throughout the course of the project are to be provided by the CONTRACTOR.
- All Training manuals and study materials required for training throughout the course of the project are to be provided by the CONTRACTOR.
- No O&M material or Submittals are included in this quote. We assume these tasks will be provided by the CONTRACTOR.
- Any work requested outside the scope of this project will be quoted separately at WorkSmart's current labor and travel rates.
- WorkSmart carries \$1,000,000 in General liability insurance, \$1,000,000 in Professional Liability, and \$1,000,000 in Automobile Liability insurance for our clients. Amounts requested above these limits may require a change in contract price.

Total costs for these services shall be \$39,000 lump sum.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt resolution authorizing the District Manager/District Engineer to sign an Agreement with Nute Engineering for design related services for the 36-Inch Trunk Sewer Relocation Project for the Caltrans San Rafael Harbor Bridge Replacement Project.

BACKGROUND:

On February 1, 2018, several Caltrans engineers met with SRSD staff to explain their upcoming project, the "San Rafael Harbor Bridge Replacement Project." This project consists of replacing the bridge section at the Highway 101 Central San Rafael northbound off-ramp due to the scoured pier foundation, which includes widening and realigning the bridge. The District has a 36-inch trunk sewer line from Second Street to the North Francisco Pump Station, located on the east side of the off-ramp, which carries the flow from central and west San Rafael and the Dominican area. When Caltrans replaces its bridge, a section of the 36-inch sewer line that is currently on the west shoulder of the off-ramp will be in the first left lane. This future location will cause difficulties in maintaining the sewer facilities due to heavy traffic (see attached sketch).

SRSD and Caltrans staff have been working together and discussing options for the relocation of the sewer facilities and have arrived at two conceptual alternatives:

- 1. Relocate approximately 60 feet of sewer facilities to the west, parallel to the existing sewer alignment.
- 2. Install new sewer facilities that cross the off-ramp in a skewed alignment and abandon the existing sewer.

Caltrans is planning to finish its design of the Bridge project by June 2018 and will begin construction in the spring or summer of 2019. Because of their tight timeline, Caltrans staff prefers that the District design and relocate its facilities prior to the start of the Caltrans project. Again, due to the tight schedule, District staff requested Nute Engineering to participate in its most recent meeting with Caltrans on February 16th. After the meeting, District staff requested Nute Engineering to provide a proposal for the design of the two alternatives referenced above.

ANALYSIS:

Nute Engineering has submitted a proposal describing the two alternatives. The first alternative consists of replacing the sewer line located parallel to the existing line on a time-and-materials basis for a cost not to exceed \$44,000. The second alternative is to design a new pipe across the off-ramp for a cost that will not exceed \$55,000.

In the past couple of meetings with Caltrans, they advised District staff that they would reimburse the District for its design and construction costs. District staff then requested Caltrans to state that in writing. However, on March 13th, the District received a letter from the Caltrans Right-of-Way Division requesting documentation showing that either the sewer facilities were there first or that a utility agreement had been signed with Caltrans in order to determine liability. District staff found a drawing showing the sewer facilities at the off-ramp in 1954, which is prior to the State's ownership in the 1960's and submitted this drawing to Caltrans on March 14th. District staff is currently waiting for Caltrans to respond.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This project will be funded under the 80-Year Life Cycle Sewer Replacement Program from the current 2017-18 Budget with the possibility of full reimbursement from the State of California.

ACTION REQUIRED:

Option 1.

That the Board adopt the resolution authorizing the District Manager/District Engineer to sign an Agreement with Nute Engineering for design related services for the 36-Inch Trunk Sewer Relocation Project for the Caltrans San Rafael Harbor Bridge Replacement Project. Staff recommends this option.

Option 2.

That the Board adopt the resolution authorizing the District Manager/District Engineer to sign an Agreement with Nute Engineering for design related services for the 36-Inch Trunk Sewer Relocation Project for the Caltrans San Rafael Harbor Bridge Replacement Project pending receipt of a letter from Caltrans stating that they will fully reimbursement the District for the relocation of its sewer facilities. With this option, the District will be taking a chance on whether it will be able to meet the Caltrans schedule. If the District cannot comply with the Caltrans schedule, Caltrans will need to incorporate the sewer relocation in its Bridge project.

Option 3:

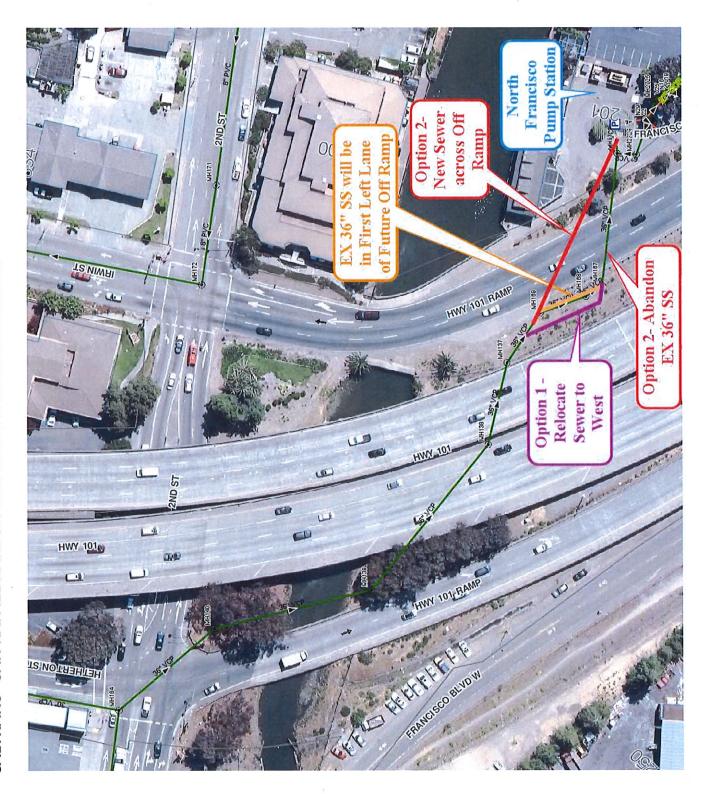
Do nothing.

- a. If the Board waits for the letter from Caltrans stating that it will fully reimburse the District and then adopts the resolution authorizing Nute to provide design services at its April 23rd meeting, the District will not be able to meet the Caltrans schedule. Caltrans will then have to include the sewer design into their project.
- b. If Caltrans determines that it is the District's responsibility to relocate its facilities, the Board can then decide at a future meeting to do nothing, which will then result in the District facilities being located in the new off-ramp or relocating the sewer facilities after the Caltrans Bridge Project has been completed.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR DESIGN RELATED SERVICES FOR THE 36-INCH TRUNK SEWER RELOCATION PROJECT FOR THE CALTRANS SAN RAFAEL HARBOR BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

This Agreement is made and entered into this 16th day of March, 2018, by and between the SAN RAFAEL SANITATION DISTRICT (hereinafter "DISTRICT"), and *NUTE ENGINEERING* (hereinafter "CONSULTANT").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT has selected *NUTE ENGINEERING* to perform the required design related services for the "36-Inch Trunk Sewer Relocation Project for the Caltrans San Rafael Harbor Bridge Replacement Project" (hereinafter "PROJECT"); and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT has offered to render certain specialized professional services in connection with this Project.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

DEFINITIONS.

DISTRICT and CONSULTANT have outlined the scope of services to be provided, and related expenses as described in Exhibit "A" attached and incorporated herein.

PROJECT COORDINATION

- A. DISTRICT. The District Manager/District Engineer shall be the representative of the DISTRICT for all purposes under this Agreement. The Senior Civil Engineer is hereby designated as the PROJECT MANAGER for the DISTRICT, and said PROJECT MANAGER shall supervise all aspects of the progress and execution of this Agreement.
- B. CONSULTANT. CONSULTANT shall assign a single PROJECT DIRECTOR to have overall responsibility for the progress and execution of this Agreement for CONSULTANT. *MARK WILSON* is hereby designated as the PROJECT DIRECTOR for CONSULTANT. Should circumstances or conditions subsequent to the execution of this Agreement require a substitute PROJECT DIRECTOR for any reason, the CONSULTANT shall notify the DISTRICT within ten (10) business days of the substitution.

3. DUTIES OF CONSULTANT

CONSULTANT shall perform the duties and/or provide services as follows; the CONSULTANT agrees to provide professional services as an Engineering Consultant to prepare work outlined in the Proposal from CONSULTANT dated March 13, 2018, marked Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The CONSULTANT agrees to be available and perform the work specified in this Agreement in the time frame as specified and as shown in Exhibit "A".

DUTIES OF THE DISTRICT

DISTRICT shall perform the duties as described and incorporated herein.

5. COMPENSATION

For the full performance of the services described herein by CONSULTANT, DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT on a time-and-materials basis for services rendered in accordance with the rates shown on the current fee schedule as described in Exhibit "A" attached and incorporated herein. The total payment will not exceed \$55,074.

Payment will be made monthly upon receipt by PROJECT MANAGER of itemized invoices submitted by CONSULTANT.

6. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall be from the date of execution until the Project is complete.

7. TERMINATION

- A. Discretionary. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice mailed or personally delivered to the other party.
- B. Cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement for cause upon ten (10) days written notice mailed or personally delivered to the other party, and the notified party's failure to cure or correct the cause of the termination notice, to the reasonable satisfaction of the party giving such notice, within thirty (30) days of the receipt of said notice.
- C. Effect of Termination. Upon receipt of notice of termination, neither party shall incur additional obligations under any provision of this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other.
- D. Return of Documents. Upon termination, any and all DISTRICT documents or materials provided to CONSULTANT and any and all of CONSULTANT's documents and materials prepared for or relating to the performance of its duties under this Agreement, shall be delivered to DISTRICT as soon as possible, but not later than thirty (30) days after termination.

8. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

The written documents and materials prepared by the CONSULTANT in connection with the performance of its duties under this Agreement shall be the sole property of DISTRICT. DISTRICT may use said property for any purpose, including projects not contemplated by this Agreement.

9. INSPECTION AND AUDIT

Upon reasonable notice, CONSULTANT shall make available to DISTRICT, or its agent, for inspection and audit, all documents and materials maintained by CONSULTANT in connection with its performance of its duties under this Agreement. CONSULTANT shall fully cooperate with DISTRICT or its agent in any such audit or inspection.

ASSIGNABILITY

The parties agree that they shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement nor the performance of any of their respective obligations hereunder, without the prior written consent of the other party, and any attempt to so assign this Agreement or any rights, duties or obligations arising hereunder shall be void and of no effect.

11. INSURANCE

- A. During the term of this Agreement, CONSULTANT shall maintain, at no expense to DISTRICT, the following insurance policies:
- 1. A commercial general liability insurance policy in the minimum amount of one million (\$1,000,000) dollars per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate for death, bodily injury, personal injury, or property damage;
- 2. An automobile liability (owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles) insurance policy in the minimum amount of one million (\$1,000,000) dollars per occurrence;
- 3. If any licensed professional performs any of the services required to be performed under this Agreement, a professional liability insurance policy in the minimum amount of one million (\$1,000,000) dollars to cover any claims arising out of the CONSULTANT's performance of services under this Agreement.
- B. The insurance coverage required of the CONSULTANT by Section 11. A., shall also meet the following requirements:

- 1. The insurance shall be primary with respect to any insurance or coverage maintained by DISTRICT and shall not call upon DISTRICT's insurance or coverage for any contribution;
- 2. Except for professional liability insurance, the insurance policies shall be endorsed for contractual liability and personal injury;
- 3. Except for professional liability insurance, the insurance policies shall be specifically endorsed to include the DISTRICT, its officers, agents, and employees as additionally named insureds under the policies;
- 4. CONSULTANT shall provide to PROJECT MANAGER, (a) Certificates of Insurance evidencing the insurance coverage required herein, and (b) specific endorsements naming DISTRICT, its officers, agents and employees, as additional insureds under the policies;
- 5. The insurance policies shall provide that the insurance carrier shall not cancel or terminate said insurance policies except upon thirty (30) days written notice to DISTRICT's PROJECT MANAGER:
- 6. If the insurance is written on a Claims Made Form, then, following termination of this Agreement, said insurance coverage shall survive for a period of not less than five years as long as the insurance is reasonably affordable and available;
- 7. The insurance policies shall provide for a retroactive date of placement coinciding with the effective date of this Agreement;
- 8. The insurance shall be approved as to form and sufficiency by PROJECT MANAGER and the County Counsel.
- C. If it employs any person, CONSULTANT shall maintain Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance, as required by the State Labor Code and other applicable laws and regulations, and as necessary to protect both CONSULTANT and DISTRICT against all liability for injuries to CONSULTANT's officers and employees.
- D. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions exceeding \$20,000 in CONSULTANT's insurance policies must be declared to and approved by the PROJECT MANAGER and the County Counsel. At District's option, the deductibles or self-insured retentions with respect to DISTRICT shall be reduced or eliminated to DISTRICT's satisfaction, or CONSULTANT shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, attorney's fees, and defense expenses.

12. INDEMNIFICATION

CONSULTANT shall indemnify, release, and hold harmless DISTRICT, its officers, and employees against any claim, demand, suit, judgment, loss, liability, or expense of any kind, including attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting in any way from any negligent acts or omissions or negligence of CONSULTANT or CONSULTANT's officers, agents, and employees in the performance of their duties and obligations under this Agreement.

13. NONDISCRIMINATION

CONSULTANT shall not discriminate, in any way, against any person on the basis of age, sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin or disability in connection with or related to the performance of its duties and obligations under this Agreement.

14. COMPLIANCE WITH ALL LAWS

CONSULTANT shall use due professional care to observe and comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, codes, and regulations in the performance of its duties and obligations under this Agreement. CONSULTANT shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with these laws, ordinances, codes, and regulations.

15. NO THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES

DISTRICT and CONSULTANT do not intend, by any provision of this Agreement, to create in any third party any benefit or right owed by one party, under the terms and conditions of this Agreement, to the other party.

16. NOTICES

All notices and other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement, including any notice of change of address, shall be in writing and given by personal delivery or deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, addressed to the parties intended to be notified. Notice shall be deemed given as of the date of personal delivery or, if mailed, upon the date of deposit with the United States Postal Service. Notice shall be given as follows:

17. INDEPENDENT CONSULTANT

For the purposes and for the duration of this Agreement, CONSULTANT, its officers, agents, and employees shall act in the capacity of an Independent Contractor, and not as employees of the DISTRICT. CONSULTANT and DISTRICT expressly intend and agree that the status of CONSULTANT, its officers, agents, and employees be that of an Independent Contractor and not that of an employee of DISTRICT.

18. ENTIRE AGREEMENT -- AMENDMENTS

- A. The terms and conditions of this Agreement, all exhibits attached, and all documents expressly incorporated by reference represent the entire Agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- B. This written Agreement shall supersede any and all prior agreements, oral or written, regarding the subject matter between the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT.
- C. No other agreement, promise, or statement, written or oral, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement shall be valid or binding except by way of a written amendment to this Agreement.
- D. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall not be altered or modified except by a written amendment to this Agreement signed by the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT.
- E. If any conflicts arise between the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the terms and conditions of the attached exhibits or the documents expressly incorporated by reference, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall control.

19. SET-OFF AGAINST DEBTS

CONSULTANT agrees that DISTRICT may deduct from any payment due to CONSULTANT under this Agreement any monies which CONSULTANT owes DISTRICT under any ordinance, agreement, contract, or resolution for any unpaid taxes, fees, licenses, assessments, unpaid checks, or other amounts.

20. WAIVERS

The waiver by either party of any breach or violation of any term, covenant, or condition of this Agreement or of any ordinance, law, or regulation, shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other term, covenant, condition, ordinance, law, or regulation or of any subsequent breach or violation of the same or other term, covenant, condition, ordinance, law or regulation. The subsequent acceptance by either party of any fee, performance, or other consideration which may become due or owing under this Agreement, shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any preceding breach or violation by the other party of any term, condition, or covenant of this Agreement or any applicable law, ordinance, or regulation.

21. CITY BUSINESS LICENSE/OTHER TAXES

CONSULTANT shall obtain and maintain during the duration of this Agreement a CITY business license as required by the San Rafael Municipal Code. CONSULTANT shall pay any and all State and Federal taxes and any other applicable taxes. Dear Doris:

In response to your request at the San Rafael Sanitation District, Caltrans and Nute Engineering conference call on February 16, 2018, Nute Engineering is pleased to submit the following proposal for the preparation of plans and technical specifications for the relocation of a portion of the 36 inch trunk sewer main located on the west side of the Caltrans Central San Rafael exit ramp at the intersection of Second and Irwin Street in San Rafael. This relocation is being required as portions of the existing sewer are within planned Caltrans reconstruction of the exit ramp and San Rafael Canal Bridge.

The District's 36 inch trunk sewer crosses from Central San Rafael on the west side of the 101 Freeway. This sewer pipeline brings most of the west side wastewater to the North Francisco Pump Station on the east side of Highway 101.

BACKGROUND

The City of San Rafael is bisected by the State Highway 101. Historically, this highway was not multi-lane but the presence of this right of way was cause for the Sanitation District to minimize and modify their sewer highway crossings. Today, there are two highway sewer crossings: a smaller diameter sewer crossing at Third Street which serves the northeast side of San Rafael, conveying sewage to the Second Street trunk sewer system by crossing the highway from east to west; and the large diameter, 36 inch trunk sewer which crosses the highway, from the west to the east, near Second Street.

The Second Street trunk sewer is the main sewer running east and west and serving all of central and west San Rafael between Miracle Mile and eventually via the 36 inch diameter trunk sewer leading to the District's North Francisco Pump Station, which pumps directly to the CMSA Treatment Plant.

SCOPE OF WORK

Any excavation in the vicinity of the existing trunk sewer will likely encounter high groundwater and alluvial or bay mud ground conditions. Therefore, the construction Contractor will need to employ careful shoring methods to prevent trench wall caving. During the February 16th conference call two alternate sewer relocation plans were discussed:

- Relocate trunk sewer line parallel to existing trunk sewer towards the west, widened Caltrans ramp.
- Trench across off-ramp to construct new trunk sewer to North Francisco Pump Station and abandon existing trunk sewer within planned Caltrans ramp. (This alternative will require a skewed alignment crossing of a Caltrans right of way and Caltrans ROW Department approval.)

The scope of work to prepare design for rehabilitation of the sewers listed above will consist of the following:

Alternate Design Services - Schedule A - Preparation of Plans and Specifications for the Parallel Realignment of 36 inch Pipeline on West Side of Tracks

- 1. Investigate the planned construction of approximately 100 feet of a new 36" pipeline parallel and west of the existing trunk sewer and review pipeline constructability issues, including utility conflicts, freeway bents conflicts and overhead structure conflicts, ramp closure and traffic control, and sewer bypass design during construction. After Caltrans/District staff meeting, summarize findings in a written letter report.
- 2. Conduct our own topographical survey, tying in CALTRANS control points and add existing pipeline and utility depth data.
- 3. Prepare plan drawings showing the sewer pipeline relocation, sewer bypass directions, traffic control and construction details, freeway bents conflicts and overhead structure conflicts.
- 4. Prepare technical specifications and/or contract documents as necessary for the project.
- 5. Confer with San Rafael Public Works staff and Caltrans regarding traffic control requirements necessary for this work alongside the Central San Rafael exit ramp. Incorporate the agreed upon requirements and possible night time work requirements into the plans and specifications.
- 6. Based on the construction plans and specifications, prepare a final estimate of the project construction cost.

- 7. It is our understanding this design will also be reviewed by Caltrans and the District and there will be minimum one (1) planning meeting related to the implementation of this project and will require additional coordination time to address comments received from the agencies.
- 8. We will attend two (2) meetings with District staff to review the planned project.

Alternate Design Services - Schedule B - Preparation of Plans and Specifications for the Realignment of 36 inch Pipeline by New Crossing of Central San Rafael Exit Ramp to North Francisco Pump Station

- 1. Investigate the alternate project of crossing the Central San Rafael Caltrans Ramp and review pipeline constructability issues, including utility conflicts, ramp closure and traffic control, and sewer bypass design during construction. After Caltrans/District staff meeting, summarize findings in a written letter report.
- 2. Conduct our own topographical survey, tying in CALTRANS control points and add existing pipeline and utility depth data.
- 3. Prepare plan drawings showing the sewer pipeline relocation, sewer bypass directions, traffic control and construction details.
- 4. Prepare technical specifications and/or contract documents as necessary for the project.
- 5. Confer with San Rafael Public Works staff and Caltrans regarding traffic control requirements necessary for this work alongside the Central San Rafael Exit Ramp. Incorporate the agreed upon requirements and possible night time work requirements into the plans and specifications.
- 6. Based on the construction plans and specifications, prepare a final estimate of the project construction cost.
- 7. It is our understanding this design will also be reviewed by Caltrans and the District at one (1) planning meeting related to the implementation of this project and there will be comments from the agencies which will need to be addressed.
- 8. We will attend two (2) meetings with District staff to review the planned project.

SCHEDULE

The construction of the Caltrans San Rafael Way Bridge and Exit Ramp Project is to be undertaken during the 2019 construction season. However, Caltrans has indicated that they need the District's Plans by June 1, 2018. The following is the proposed schedule for the project design:

Trunk Sewer Main Relocation Project - 2018

- SRSD Board approves proposal Second week of March, 2018
- 35% submittal, preliminary plans April 9, 2018
- 90% submittal, plans and specifications May 7, 2018 (District staff one week review)
- 100% submittal, full size plans, specifications and engineer's estimate –
 May 28, 2018

SERVICES NOT INCLUDED IN THIS PROPOSAL

It is understood that the following services are outside the scope of this proposal and will need to be provided by others as necessary or advisable.

- 1. Geotechnical engineering and soil contamination investigation services. (It is possible that Caltrans has already conducted geotechnical investigations and the District may be able to obtain a copy for their own use.)
- 2. Hazardous materials investigations, assessment or removal.
- 3. Locating or potholing of underground utilities.
- 4. Existing pavement evaluation. District, or Caltrans will provide specific pavement restoration guidance from Public Works to Nute Engineering for the design as necessary. For purposes of this proposal pavement restoration will consist of trench excavation pavement plug.
- 5. Environmental review or preparation of an environmental impact report of the project.
- 6. Necessary permit applications and application fees.
- 7. Legal services in connection with the project.
- 8. Acquisition of rights of ways, rights of entries or permits. Moving the trunk sewer main will likely move it out of the existing right of way and a new Caltrans and City encroachment permit may be required.
- 9. Printing of plans and specifications for bidding purposes and for the Contractor's use.
- 10. Clerical time to send bid documents out to bidders.

ENGINEERING FEE

We propose to do all the work on a time and materials basis to be billed according to the Schedule of Hourly Rates attached hereto as Attachment A. The following are budgets for the engineering fees for the various schedules outlined above:
