b. Review Budget Status Report for the period 7-1-17 through 3-31-18.

District Manager Toy reported that this is the third quarter report through March 31st. She reported that the full amount of the sewer service charges had not yet been received because they are paid in December and April; the sewer connection fees received were approximately \$86,000, which were mostly from the new Andy's Market, the new Public Safety Center, and Fire Station No. 52 on Third Street; property taxes received were approximately \$895,000 (55% of budget). In response to inquiries by the Board regarding public outreach and utility costs, she reported that thus far she had not had the time to work on public outreach this year and that electric costs vary from year-to-year, depending on how much rain is received since the pumps must run more frequently during storms. Director Bushey then suggested using the website, Next Door, or Face Book for public outreach in lieu of mail service, and Manager Toy thought this was a good idea.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt resolution authorizing the District Manager/District Engineer to recruit a Junior Engineer.

BACKGROUND

For Fiscal Year 2018-19, the District has a \$4.8 million 80-Year Life Cycle Sewer Replacement Program to replace a portion of the 130 miles of gravity pipe and a \$1.9 million Pump Station and Force Main Capital Improvement Program to improve portions of its 13 miles of force main and 33 pump stations. In two to three years, the District will complete its scheduled list of projects for both of these programs and will need to develop a new list of projects for the next five to ten years.

ANALYSIS:

The District has a very lean engineering staff, which consists of one Senior Civil Engineer, one Associate Civil Engineer, and one Construction Inspector. The Associate Civil Engineer has been assisting the Senior Civil Engineer with capital projects as well as plan reviews and other engineering related tasks.

I recommend that the District recruit a Junior Engineer to help develop the next five to ten year list of projects for both the 80-Year Life Cycle Sewer Replacement Program and the Pump Station and Force Main Capital Improvement Program and to assist with the current capital improvement projects.

The Junior Engineer is an entry level engineer that requires a BS degree in civil engineering and does not require any formal work experience or engineering certification.

At the present, the District is in the process of recruiting for an Assistant/Associate Civil Engineer to fill a vacant position that has been vacant since January. The District was unsuccessful with the first round of recruitment. When District began the second round of recruitment last month, it was expanded to include the position of Junior Engineer. On August 14th, the District interviewed four applicants for the Assistant/Associate Civil Engineer position

and five applicants for the Junior Engineer position. District staff is planning to invite the top three candidates in each job classification for a second interview on August 28th and 29th.

I would like to fill the Assistant/Associate Civil Engineer position and would also like to hire a Junior Engineer.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Junior Engineer would cost the District between \$110,000 to \$135,000 per year, which would include wages and benefits. The District has sufficient funding to cover this cost, since an additional engineer was included in the 2013-2018 Sewer User Fee rate increase.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is the recommendation of District staff that the Board authorize the District Manager/District Engineer to recruit a Junior Engineer.

Dear Directors,

I request that you conduct two closed sessions during your regular meeting on **August 27**, **2018**, to discuss the following matter: (1) significant exposure to litigation pursuant to California Government Code §54956.9(d)(2). In my opinion, public discussion of this matter would prejudice your position.

The specific reasons and the legal authority for the closed session are:

Government Code Section 54956.9(d)(2). A legislative body of a local agency may hold closed sessions with the local agency's designated representatives when a point has been reached where, in the opinion of the legislative body of the local agency on the advice of its legal counsel, based on existing facts and circumstances, there is a significant exposure to litigation against the local agency.

It should be noted that Government Code Section 54954.5 requires the Board to post a Closed Session item on the Board Agenda. With respect to the above referenced matter, you should include the number of potential cases and the fact that the Board will be meeting with counsel regarding the anticipated litigation. Please note that disclosure of the facts of this matter may, in my opinion, prejudice the District.
