The meeting was called to order at 2:06 P.M. by Chair Phillips.

1. OPEN PERIOD - No persons were present to address the Board.

2. MINUTES OF MARCH 13, 2019.

MOTION by Director Rice, seconded by Chair Phillips, to approve the minutes of the March 13, 2019, meeting as presented.

3. PAYMENTS

MOTION by Director Rice, seconded by Chair Phillips, to approve the payments for March 2019 in the amount of \$1,125,527.94 for maintenance and operation of the District and for capital improvements.

4. OLD BUSINESS

a. Consider approval of the Amended CMSA Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement.

District Manager Toy gave a brief recap on what had taken place at the February 2019 Board meeting. She reported that the City of Larkspur had sent a letter to CMSA stating its desire to withdraw from the CMSA JPA, and the JPA Agreement had been amended to reflect the changes associated with Larkspur's withdrawal. She also reported that she had brought a copy of the Amended JPA to the SRSD February meeting for Board approval, and the Board was fine with the Amended JPA but felt that Larkspur should have a separate agreement with the JPA member agencies. Next, Manager Toy reported that although some progress had been made toward the preparation of an agreement between Larkspur and the JPA member agencies, it was never adopted because the attorneys could not agree upon the language; and it was decided that the revised CMSA JPA would be sufficient. CMSA Manager Dow then reported that the CMSA Board was fine with the amendments to the CMSA JPA but that SRSD Director Bushey felt that there should also be a separate agreement between Larkspur and the JPA member agencies, which would provide for the member agencies to grant approval of Larkspur's withdrawal from the JPA and for indemnification of the member agencies regarding any financial issues associated with the withdrawal. CMSA Manager Dow reported that he had approached Larkspur with this request, and Larkspur decided that they would not have a separate agreement with the JPA member agencies because they felt that approval of the Amended JPA was sufficient. However, Larkspur was agreeable to having an agreement just between Larkspur and CMSA, but that agreement was never approved because SD2's attorney had some issues with the language. CMSA Manager Dow then reported that SD2's attorney was okay with the Amended JPA, which was then approved by Corte Madera's Town Council. Chairman Phillips then reported that he would prefer to table this matter until Director Bushey is able to attend the meeting.

MOTION by Director Rice, seconded by Chair Phillips, to table approval of the Amended CMSA Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement until Director Bushey is able to attend the meeting.

5. NEW BUSINESS

a. Adopt resolution authorizing the District Manager/District Engineer to sign an Amendment to Agreement with Nute Engineering for additional design and construction related services for the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project.

District Manager Toy reported that back in October 2016 the District entered into a Professional Services Agreement with Nute Engineering for design and construction related services for the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project, which includes

the replacement of a gravity sewer line that connects to the pump station from Marina Boulevard. She reported that the bid opening was held in April 2017, and the lowest bid was 35% above the Engineer's Estimate. She then reported that the Board had rejected all bids, and the project was rebid in the winter when there were more competitive bids. She also reported that the replacement of the gravity sewer line was performed as a separate project and had since been completed. Next, Manager Toy reported that when the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project was rebid in December 2017, it was awarded to Valentine Corporation, and it too had been completed. She then reported that because the replacement of the gravity sewer line was performed separately and removed from the original project, Nute Engineering had to spend additional time revising and repackaging the rebid for this project, which increased their costs. She then reported that Nute had requested an increase of \$21,978.00 over their original contract amount of \$265,081.00 due to the additional work performed.

MOTION by Director Rice, seconded by Chair Phillips, to adopt the resolution authorizing the District Manager/District Engineer to sign an Amendment to Agreement with Nute Engineering for additional design and construction related services for the San Pedro Pump Station Improvements Project for an additional amount of \$21,978.00.

b. Consider a sewer lateral ordinance.

District Manager Toy reported that she had done some research to compare the average summer flow with the average winter flow being sent from SRSD to CMSA because of the large amount of rain that was received in February 2019. She reported that the average flow for last summer was approximately 3.5 million gallons per day, which would be approximately 100 million gallons per month; and the average flow in February 2019 was approximately 10.9 million gallons per day, which would be approximately 300 million gallons per month (approximately three times the amount of the summer flow). Manager Toy reported that the additional 200 million gallons of flow in February was due to inflow and infiltration (I/I). She then referred to a diagram and reported that inflow comes from illegal tie-ins, such as roof drains, sump pumps, uncapped cleanouts, etc.; and infiltration comes from broken pipes or pipes with cracks or separated joints, etc. She also reported that for the past seven years the District has been replacing lower laterals as part of its capital improvement projects as well as offering property owners the option of having their upper laterals replaced (at their cost) while the contractor is already on site, which gives them a better price. Manager Toy then reported that approximately one third of the sewer lines within the District are laterals. She also reported that over the past seven years, the District has replaced approximately 4% of the laterals (as part of its Capital Improvement Program), while property owners have replaced approximately 9% of the laterals, which does not amount to much headway in the elimination of I/I. She reported that the District would like for property owners to become more involved in the replacement of their sewer laterals. Manager Toy reported that LGVSD and SRSD have been working together to update their Sewer Lateral Standards and Specifications and

would also like to work together to develop a sewer lateral ordinance, since LGVSD is currently working on this. She then reviewed some triggers for inspection and testing of sewer laterals that were developed by LGVSD that could be used in the lateral ordinance if the Board chooses to proceed with this proposal. They are as follows: A remodel above a certain value or an illegal connection, a change in use, the sale of a property/transfer of a title, a private sanitary sewer overflow, or a pool overflow. It was also reported that SRSD is a co-permittee on the CMSA NPDES permit, and the compliance schedule includes the consideration of a sewer lateral ordinance. Director Rice then reported that she feels it is best practice to have something in place to reduce the I/I. Chair Phillips then expressed concern in regard to an ordinance that would require a lateral inspection at the point of sale, and Manager Toy reported that SRSD and LGVSD would be proposing a two-year grace period for the repair/replacement of a sewer lateral so that the sale of a property would not be delayed. She also reported that SRSD and LGVSD would be meeting with the Marin Association of Realtors to discuss the possibility of having a point-of-sale lateral inspection requirement. Director Rice then suggested learning more about RVSD's point-of-sale requirements and bringing that information back to the Board before meeting with the realtors.

c. Consider canceling May 8th meeting and rescheduling.

District Manager Toy suggested cancelling the regular May 8th Board meeting, since it would be coming up next week, and scheduling a meeting for the end of May instead. Director Rice reported that she would be gone from May 18-31 and the last week of June, but the next meeting could be held without her. Chair Phillips reported that he too might be gone part of that time and recommended that the next meeting be scheduled for the next available date. Manager Toy then reported that she wanted to bring a draft budget to the next meeting so that the Board could adopt the final budget in June.

6. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

a. Update on the SMART project.

District Manager Toy reported that the concrete pad over the existing force main had been completed and that a sleeve for the new pipe had been installed underneath the railroad tracks (approximately 50 feet from the current pipe) for the future installation of a new pipe. She also reported that the Grant of Underground Easement from SMART for the existing pipe had been recorded and that the District was waiting on an easement for the new sleeve.

7. DIRECTOR REPORTS/REQUESTS FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS.

Director Rice requested an update on the retaining wall on Bret Harte Road, and Manager Toy reported that she had planned to budget for this work. Director Rice also requested an update on the sewer issue on Alpine Street, and Manager Toy reported that staff had been working on getting the District's insurance company more involved. She also reported that the District's Legal Counsel, Jack Govi, had sent letters to the insurance companies involved

and that she had met with the property owners and their attorney. She then reported that the District is making headway on this matter. Chairman Phillips then inquired whether the District is on schedule with its Capital Improvement Program, and Manager Toy reported that the projects had slowed down due to a shortage of personnel.

8. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting of April 29, 2019, was adjourned at 2:35 P.M. The next meeting of the San Rafael Sanitation District scheduled for Wednesday, May 8, 2019, was canceled; and a special meeting was later scheduled for Friday, June 7, 2019, at 9:00 A.M. at San Rafael City Hall.

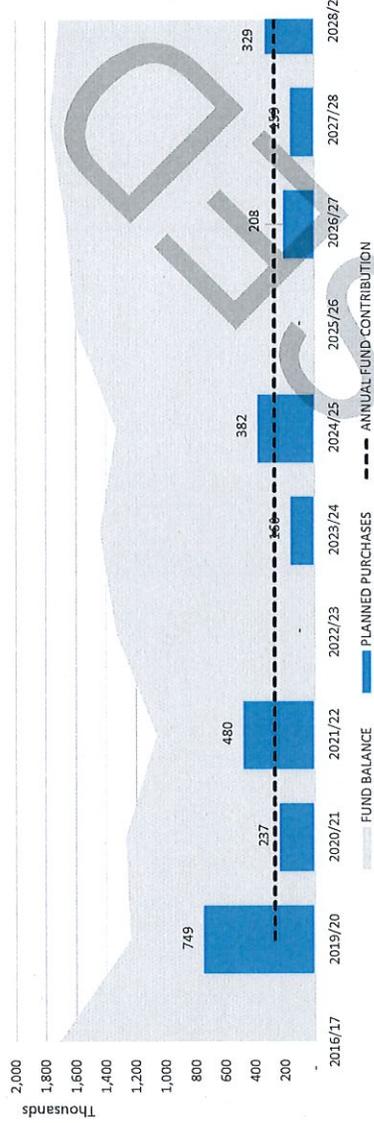
