Marin Commission on Aging

Purpose:

Qualifications: According to the Older Americans Act, membership shall be

(a) a majority of persons 60 years or older;

(b) service providers;

(c) members who reflect the geographic, racial, economic, and social

complexion of the area they represent; and

(d) at least one member who represents the interests of the disabled. The Marin County Commission on Aging is a 23-member federally

mandated advisory council to the Marin County Board of Supervisors. The Commission works closely with the Aging and Adult Services on behalf of Marin's older adults. Commissioners are appointed to three-

year terms by either the Board of Supervisors or the 11 incorporated Cities and Towns in Marin. In addition, Marin County's Senior Assembly Member and Senior Senator, representatives of the California Senior Legislature (CSL), also serve as ex-officio

members for a four-year term.

Oath.

health and welfare of the communities it serves from mosquitoes and vector-borne diseases by utilizing cost-effective, environmentally

responsible integrated vector management practices. The
