### **ADA Access Advisory Committee**

**Qualifications:** The majority of members of the Committee shall be residents of the City who have significant experience in the disability community. At least 5 members shall be both residents of San Rafael and persons with disabilities. Some members of advocacy groups or social service providers may also be appointed, but no more than three organizations will serve on the Committee. Also, one member of the Committee shall represent the San Rafael business community interest.

**Purpose:** The ADA Access Advisory Committee provides valuable input in determining disability policy for the City of San Rafael. The ADA Access Advisory Committee provides input, advises the City on matters relating to people with disabilities, and is a primary public networking resource between persons with disabilities, disability service agencies, representatives from government agencies, and others. Members of the committee represent a broad cross-section of members of the community with disabilities, reflecting multiple disabilities, and the cultural and gender diversity of the wider disability community. The ADA Access Advisory Committee works in conjunction with the City of San Rafael.

At least two (2) members shall be licensed architects or licensed building designers; at least one member shall be a licensed landscape architect; at least one of the five (5) members shall have background or experience in urban design; and the alternate member may have qualifications in any of the above fields of expertise.

Purpose: The Design Review Board (DRB) consists of design professionals appointed by the City Council to provide advice on new development projects and most exterior changes to existing buildings. Applications are evaluated based on our General Plan and Zoning Ordinance design policies and criteria, with the goal of having new projects harmonize with the natural environment and surrounding area.

Purpose: The Measure 'E' TUT Oversight Committee ensures that all revenues received from the voter-approved local Transactions and Use Tax (Measure 'E') are spent only on permissible uses, as outlined in Ordinance No. 1913. The Committee does not have any budgetary decision authority, does not allocate financial resources, and does not make budget or service recommendations to the City Council. The Committee meets once each fiscal year.

1. Members of the Committee shall be at least 18 years of age, except for the youth member which shall be a minimum age of a first-year high school student
2. At least four (4) members of the Committee shall reside within the Canal neighborhood

3. One (1) member of the Committee must be a City of San Rafael resident but may reside outside of the Canal neighborhood.

Purpose: The Pickleweed Advisory Committee provides valuable input in representing and advocating for the Canal area resident's needs and wishes for programs and services; and is a primary public networking resource between the Canal residents, representatives from governmental and non-profit agencies, and others. The Pickleweed Advisory Committee works in conjunction with the City of San Rafael.

**San Rafael Representatives on Marin County Boards**

**Marin Commission on Aging**

Qualifications: According to the Older Americans Act, membership shall be composed of:

- (a) a majority of persons 60 years or older;
- (b) service providers;

(c) members who reflect the geographic, racial, economic, and social complexion of the area they represent; and  
(d) at least one member who represents the interests of the disabled.

Purpose: The Marin County Commission on Aging is a 23-member federally mandated advisory council to the Marin County Board of Supervisors. The Commission works closely with the Aging and Adult Services on behalf of Marin's older adults. Commissioners are appointed to three-year terms by either the Board of Supervisors or the 11 incorporated Cities and Towns in Marin. In addition, Marin County's Senior Assembly Member and Senior Senator, representatives of the [California Senior Legislature \(CSL\)](#), also serve as ex-officio members for a four-year term.

**Hazardous & Solid Waste Mgmt. JPA Local Task Force**

Qualifications: San Rafael representative must be residents of the City of San Rafael.  
Purpose: The Local Task Force serves as an advisory board to the Marin County Hazardous and Solid Waste Management Joint Powers Authority (JPA). The Local Task Force provides viewpoints and concerns from different geographical, interest based and industry associated members. Seats on the Task Force include public members from different areas of the County, solid waste haulers/facility operators, special districts, and members from environmental organizations. The Task Force specifically assists in the review of the JPA's Integrated Waste Management Plan for all areas of Marin County to help the County reach its zero waste goals.

**Marin/Sonoma Mosquito and Vector Control District**

Qualifications: Each member of the Board appointed by the governing body of a City or Town shall be an elector of the City or Town from which he/she is appointed, and a resident of that portion of the city/town which is in the District. Trustees are required to file a Statement of Economic Interest with the State of California, Fair Political Practices Commission, within (30) thirty days after assuming office (and each subsequent year). The District assists trustees with the necessary paperwork. Each Trustee is sworn in and he or she signs a Loyalty Oath.

Purpose: The Marin/Sonoma Mosquito and Vector Control District protects the health and welfare of the communities it serves from mosquitoes and vector-borne diseases by utilizing cost-effective, environmentally

responsible integrated vector management practices. The Marin/Sonoma Mosquito & Vector Control District is governed by a Board of Trustees. Each member represents his or her city of residence or a county at large. Trustees are appointed by their city council or county board of supervisors and serve a two or four-year term.
