Funding 3301 Kerner gives us a chance to continue to address chronic homelessness swiftly by utilizing an existing building and prioritizing housing our most at-risk adults, children, and families. This site would help accelerate the success of our Coordinated Entry System, which has housed nearly 300 of our community's most vulnerable, chronically homeless people over the last three years. Rafael meet it's very low-income RHNA allocations through an exemplary collaboration

with the County and the State's Project Homekey program. If we do not move forward, we miss the opportunity to utilize millions in state funding to address our housing crisis.
