

LOS vs VMT: Key Differences

	Level of Service (LOS)	Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT)
Use	Was the common CEQA threshold from 1980s until 2020	As of July 1, 2020—now the required CEQA threshold
Purpose	Reduce congestion	Reduce greenhouse gas emissions
Scale	Local	Regional
Measures	Travel Delay during peak hour	Distance driven in an average day
Metric	Letter Grade (A through F)	Miles Per Capita
Mitigation	Increase road capacity	Reduce number and length of car trips

City Council Direction on LOS and VMT

- Retain LOS for use in planning and development review
- Continue collecting traffic improvement fees based on trip generation
- Minimize the need for Council CEQA overrides/ exceptions for each project
- Avoid creating additional obstacles for housing
- Utilize OPR recommended metric of 15% below regional average for VMT
- Provide LOS exemption for Downtown San Rafael but continue to require traffic impact studies to evaluate and address impacts

Arts and Culture Element



- Libraries moved to CSI Element
- Historic Preservation moved to CDP Element
- Arts and Culture focused more explicitly on sustaining the arts in San Rafael
 - San Rafael as cultural hub of Marin
 - Arts as an economic driver
 - Inclusive, culturally diverse arts programming
 - Partnerships with the arts community
 - Public art and placemaking
 - Space for the arts
 - Special events
 - Arts-supportive environment
