Income units in its 136-unit residential development.

When the City of San Rafael enacted the ordinance lowering the City's affordable housing requirements from 20% to 10%, it did so to incentivize approval and construction of housing. Northgate Walk went through a lengthy approval process; the project had design and density changes that decreased expected revenue. Additionally, labor, materials, and construction costs have soared. Reducing the number of affordable units will help the project reduce costs and make construction feasible. The Northgate Walk's team has listed that "a requirement to provide 10% of a project's units as BMR could be a decisive factor to facilitate the actual construction of Northgate Walk."

The opportunity cost of Northgate Walk, an already approved project, not being realized into housing is significant. We recognize the dire need for housing and the efforts made to ensure this project becomes 136 places to call home for our community. While we want to ensure affordable housing gets built, this project stalling means no units are being built.

As a group of business leaders, union workers, environmental advocates, public servants, and educators living and working in Marin, we respectfully ask you to support the 10% affordable housing requirement. Let's get this housing built!
