

Projects Timeline





The Knowledge Mobile: Bridging Gaps and Building Communities

The Knowledge Mobile showcases the importance of community outreach and the positive impact it has on our community. Over the past two years, the Knowledge Mobile has proven to be a beacon of accessibility and inclusivity. In 2023, the Knowledge Mobile made a total of 348 stops, issued 754 library cards, attended 29 special events, checked out 8,607 books and serviced 32,219 patrons across the City of Santa Ana.

Bookmobiles have long played a vital role in communities where access to essential services can be challenging. The Knowledge Mobile goes beyond traditional book lending, providing access to technology and programming for residents who may not live in close proximity to a brick-and-mortar library. With the upcoming renovation at the Main Library, the Knowledge Mobile will also help ensure that residents continue to have access to the resources and services they need.

In addition to offering books, the Knowledge Mobile provides access to wireless hotspots, Wi-Fi, robots, laptops, and items from our innovative Library of Things collection. By bringing these resources directly to the community, the Knowledge Mobile empowers residents with the tools they need to succeed in today's digital world. One of the most significant impacts of the Knowledge Mobile is its ability to reach those who are homebound or lack access to transportation. By traveling to senior centers, schools, and other areas where underserved populations reside, the Knowledge Mobile ensures everyone has equal access to library services.

With the addition of a second, larger Knowledge Mobile rolling out in 2025, the Santa Ana Public Library will continue to serve as an innovative educational and recreational resource for our community. 

Warmer weather is here and that means the butterflies are back. Guests can once again venture inside Flight! - A Live Butterfly Experience.

Explore a lush garden full of colorful foliage and flowers as hundreds of tropical butterflies flutter about you. Watch the butterflies emerge from their chrysalis next to the habitat in the Emergence Chamber. Capture memories with multiple photo spots both inside and outside the habitat. Discover your new favorite butterfly species through observation and educational signage.

The 2,000+ square foot aviary is home to butterflies from all around the world. Species from Central, South and North America, Asia, and Africa will be present throughout the warm months. The aviary is scheduled to open beginning May 1st and is projected to stay open until October, weather permitting.


Did you know there's a train, carousel, and Ferris wheel all within the Santa Ana Zoo? These rides are all fun, unique, low-cost, and best of all they're an easy way for guests to support the Zoo!

All these rides are operated by the Friends of Santa Ana Zoo (FOSAZ), a non-profit organization that provides financial and in-kind support for the Zoo. Proceeds are directed towards supporting animal care and education programs. Next time you're visiting the Zoo make sure to swing by and board one of these wild attractions.

The Zoofari Express train ride takes visitors on a ride around the Crean Family Farm and Tierra de las Pampas Habitats. Riders get a unique view of the new Goat Interaction Yard and may see rheas and guanacos up close in their grasslands habitat. The trains themselves are a unique bit of Southern California history, delighting visitors at other local attractions for over 40 years before coming to the zoo in 1999.

The Conservation Carrousel features unique and endangered species, including an Anteater created just for the Zoo! Installed in 2008, guests enjoy traditional music that changes seasonally. Keep an eye out for special Carrousel Cards distributed during Special Events at the Zoo.

The 50 Monkeys Ferris Wheel provides a view of the Zoo and surrounding areas from high above the trees! Read the history of the Santa Ana Zoo in the queue and board a gondola that features a special monkey species. What do all the monkeys have in common? They are endangered species and many of them were previously or are currently found at the Zoo!

Animal Spotlight:

The American LaMancha goat can be traced back to the early 1900s and is believed to be descended from goats brought to California by Spanish missionaries. They are easily recognized by their very small outer ears, which range from 1-2 inches in length and contain little to no cartilage.

Though their ears are small, their personalities sure are big! They are playful, smart, curious, observant, and affectionate goats. LaMancha goat "Pearl" can be found at the Santa Ana Zoo's newly renovated Goat Encounter where she lives with four Nubian goats and two Nubian - Saanen mixed goats. Twoyear-old "Pearl" was one of the first in the herd to try out the elevated goat trail and is often seen lounging on the suspension bridge in the afternoon sunshine. She loves to be brushed and has a calm, people-loving disposition. Come meet "Pearl" and the rest of the goat herd at the Santa Ana Zoo Goat Encounter and you are sure to fall in love, too.





CONSERVATION SPOTLIGHT

Treetops Toys introduces compostable shopping bags

Non-profit Friends of Santa Ana Zoo partners with the zoo in its efforts to save wildlife and wild spaces. While you can always bring a reusable bag to the zoo's gift shop, replacing traditional single-use plastic bags with compostable ones moves the zoo closer to its renewable resources goal.

Another way zoo visitors can always help is by separating their waste into landfill and recycling by following container labels. In Santa Ana, common waste items like hard plastics, paper, and metal can all be recycled.

ANIMAL WELLBEING PROGRAM AT THE SANTA ANA ZOO

What does wellbeing mean to you? Is it a word, or a practice? For zoos, it is both. Within the zoo community, we define wellbeing as "a state of being comfortable, healthy, and happy."

But how do we know if an animal is any of those things? At the Santa Ana Zoo, we just ask them! They may not respond in words, but they do answer us with things that we are trained to recognize, like their behavior, their vocalizations, or their appetites. The Santa Ana Zoo's Animal Wellbeing Program is a framework to monitor all animals at the zoo and make adjustments to their care when indicated.

The zoo wellbeing team performs routine wellbeing assessments for every zoo animal at least once per year, or more often when animals may be affected by events like a change of habitat, a new mate, or a nearby construction project (like the giant river otter habitat).

Each assessment contains a series of questions that several zoo team members answer. The questions help us "hear" what the animal is telling us about their happiness. Do they utilize most of the space in their habitat? Are they displaying a variety

of species-appropriate behaviors? Do they react positively to their caretakers? Everything the animals "tell" us with their behavior, also called outputs, are used to help determine their state of wellbeing.

Inputs are specific things the zoo team incorporates into an animal's daily life to positively affect their wellbeing. Inputs like enrichment, medical care, training, and a well-rounded diet are all measured on the wellbeing assessment each month. The Zoo's Behavioral Husbandry Program ensures that the animals can choose to participate in their own care through training, such as sitting on a scale to record their weight. And through environmental enrichment and habitat design, we ensure each habitat offers the diversity and stimulation to optimize wellbeing. The Zoo's animal nutritionist and exotic animal veterinarian also provide inputs to positively affect wellbeing.

Wellbeing is at the forefront of everything we do at the Santa Ana Zoo. The Animal Care Team is trained to provide inputs, to recognize outputs, and to identify when an animal is comfortable, healthy, and happy. Wellbeing is integrated to not only enhance the daily lives of the animals, but also Zoo visitors, who can be confident knowing that every animal's answers are listened to.


