- G. FTX –Team will be deployed to support a SAPD MFF squad reporting they are taking shots from the crowd and there are victims down. The Team will be required to respond and assess the situation. They will implement the proper plan of action and affect the rescue and arrest of active shooter.
 - 1. Assessment procedures:
 - i. Injuries/Medical aid awareness
 - ii. Establish zones if necessary
 - iii. Identification of any possible sniper situations
 - iv. Additional victims / assist fire if necessary
- H. Team debrief
 - 1. Identify strengths
 - 2. Identify weaknesses
 - 3. Conduct remediation
