

Recovery from the Pandemic

- Revive Funding Allocated: \$7,500,000
- Active/Ongoing:
 - COVID-19 Emergency Response (OCFA)
 - Sanitization & Prevention Programs
 - Feasibility of Public Health Department
- Upcoming/Under Development:
 - Expansion of Critical City Communications Methods
 - Mental Health Recovery
- Completed:
 - Bus Shelter Sanitization





Sanitization & Prevention Program

- Revive Funding Allocated: \$2,300,000
- Proactive right-of-way cleaning & sanitizing throughout the city's qualified census tracts
- Focus on high-traffic pedestrian/bicyclist areas








Sanitization & Prevention Program

- Since January 2022: 4,069 locations have been cleaned by 4 crews of 3 staff members each.
- Each crew covers about 4 miles/day







Direct Assistance Programs


- Revive Funding Allocated: \$29,732,101
- Active/Ongoing:
 - Food Supply/Distribution Programs
 - Business/Non-Profit/Artist Assistance Programs
 - Resident Direct Assistance Program
 - Rent Stabilization & Just Cause Eviction Program
 - Youth Violence Prevention Programs
- Upcoming/Under Development:
 - Early Childhood Support, Head Start, and Child/Day Care Programs
 - After-School / Youth Sport Programs
 - Sexual Assault Intervention/Reentry Programs





Rental Assistance Program

- Funding Allocated: \$36.5 million
- \$25,952,160 distributed
- \$10.5 million remaining
- Applications closing March 31st for new applicants
- Starting April, staff will begin recertifying all previously assisted households and provide up to 3 months of additional assistance payments, as needed







Public Health & Safety

- Revive Funding Allocated: \$20,350,000
- Active/Ongoing:
 - Rapid Response Homeless Services SMART Team
- Upcoming/Under Development:
 - First Street Pedestrian Safety Project
 - Addition of Park/Open Space
 - Healthy Food Access
 - Property Compliance/Assistance Program
 - Upgrade Park Restroom
 - Security Cameras for Parks/Community Centers
 - Addition of Public Health Plaza to Civic Center
- Completed:
 - 5k Run
 - Santa Ana Winter Village (Ice Rink)





Rapid Response Homeless Services

The Santa Ana Multi-disciplinary Homeless Response Team


- Operates 7 days a week
- From 8:00 am to 9:00 pm
- Calls to the Police and Fire Departments regarding noncriminal or non-emergency homeless related situations are transferred to CityNet dispatch
- Specially trained response teams are dispatched to address and engage with the homeless population






Updated FY 21-22 Measure X Spending Plan - Recurring vs One-Time \$79 million


One-Time 21% 16,959,250 Recurring 79% 62,041,044




Updated FY 21-22 Measure X Spending Plan – by Category

PROGRAMS

\$725K

Bookmobile-ongoing costs for staffing, a new collection of books and materials, computers, 3D printers. Planned roll out is for Summer 2022!

Youth Services

- -Staffing for the Library's youth tutoring program
- -Rollout of 500 Google Chromebooks with built-in SIM cards

Digital Hotspots- more than 300 mobile hotspots are available for residents to check out at both Main and Newhope Library

-New Digital Content-

Hoopla (movies, music and entertainment)
Mango Language (learn a new language online)
Ancestry Library Edition (local history and genealogy).

PROJECTS \$1.3M

- -Project is in process for the renovation of Newhope Library
- -Improvement of the internet connectivity in the new Children's Play and Learn Patio at the Main Library <u>now open</u>

Cannabis Public Benefit Fund-Parks and Recreation

PROGRAMS: \$664.6K

- -Youth Services- Funded six non-profits that offer dance, music, STEM kits, media arts and domestic violence prevention.
- -Annual Zoo and You- A series of programs(Nature Lab, Wild Wednesday Storytime) and experiences for Santa Ana youth of all ages to build direct connections between the diverse community and the Zoo.
- -Year-round aquatics at Memorial Pool and seasonal aquatic programs with over 300 enrollments.
- -Free monthly excursions to over 250 Santa Ana youth. Excursions include whale watching, amusement parks, sports events, and the theatre.
- -Youth paid internships in partnership with the Santa Ana Youth (SAY) Employment Program administered by the Santa Ana WORK Center. A total of 500 youths have been assisted and 127 are enrolled.

PROJECTS: \$1.5M

- -Splash Pads at various sites-Project is in the design phase
- -Seven fitness courts have been installed, three are in progress.
- -A new 2592 sq.ft. butterfly exhibit will be installed at the zoo with an estimated opening date of April 15, 2022.
- -Zoo Goat Escape-Project is in the design phase

Cannabis Public Benefit Fund-Parks and Recreation Upcoming.....

PROGRAMS:

- -Recreation Mobile- Purchase a vehicle for mobile recreational programming
- -Nature Center-Renovate the Nature Center at Santiago Park
- -Traveling Zoo Exhibit -Free program, Zoo staff travel to various park locations and present various topics.
- -Youth Sports Coalition Scholarship-Create a Youth Scholarship Application and distribute to participants that are unable to pay the registration fee.

-Santa Anita Park-Project to build a new soccer field






