What is the Housing Choice Voucher Program?

The Housing Choice Voucher Program (Section 8) is the federal government's largest program for assisting very low-income families, the elderly, and persons with a disability to afford healthy and safe housing in the private market. Housing assistance is provided on behalf of the family or individual, and participants are able to find their own housing.

The participant is free to choose any housing that meets the requirements of the program and is not limited to units located in subsidized housing projects.

What is the Housing Choice Voucher Program?

A family that is issued a housing voucher is responsible for finding a suitable housing unit of the family's choice where the owner agrees to rent under the program. This unit may include the family's present residence. Rental units must meet minimum standards of health and safety, as determined by SAHA.

Once the family finds an eligible unit, the Housing Authority will conduct an inspection. After the passed inspection, the Housing Authority and the landlord will execute a Contract to start the housing assistance.

The family is responsible for approximately 30% of their monthly adjusted income (minimum \$50) toward their rent and the rest is subsidized by the Housing Authority.

To qualify, the household income must be less than 50% AMI (Very Low Income) and meet other eligibility criteria.

Am I Eligible?

Eligibility for a housing voucher is determined by SAHA based on the total annual gross income and family size and is limited to U.S. citizens and specified categories of non-citizens who have eligible immigration status. In general, the family's income may not exceed 50% of the median income for the county or metropolitan area in which the family chooses to live. By law, SAHA must provide 75 percent of its vouchers to applicants whose incomes do not exceed 30 percent of the area median income. Median income levels are published by HUD and vary by location. The maximum income limits per family size are provided for you below:

Local Preferences and the Waiting List

Since the demand for housing assistance often exceeds the limited resources available to HUD and the Santa Ana Housing Authority, long waiting periods are common. In fact, SAHA will close its Waiting List on May 31, 2022 when it has more families on the list than can be assisted in the near future.

In the HCV Administrative Plan, the Santa Ana Housing Authority has established a local preference for U.S. military veterans and applicants who live or work in the City of Santa Ana. Veterans and families who live or work in the City of Santa Ana move ahead of other families on the Waiting List.

You must submit a pre-application online at santa-ana.org/housing between May 2, 2022 at 7:30AM and May 31, 2022 at 11:59PM (Pacific Standard Time)

What happens after I submit the pre-application?

Following the closing of the pre-application period (on Tuesday, May 31, 2022 at 11:59PM (Pacific Standard Time)), pre-applications will be selected for the 2022 HCV Waiting List using a computerized, random selection lottery process.

Once the lottery is complete, the applicants who have been randomly assigned numbers 1-7,500 will be placed on the 2022 HCV Waiting List. The remaining pre-applications will be rejected without the opportunity for an appeal.


Notice will be sent by mail and e-mail to all applicants informing them if they have or have not been selected through the lottery process to be placed on the 2022 HCV Waiting List before July 31, 2022.

What information is needed to apply online?

The online pre-application requires your full name, date of birth, mailing address, phone number, annual gross income and information for all of the household members who will reside in your household. The pre-application also requires your social security number. If you do not have a valid social security number, you can choose the "Opt Out" option. The pre-application process takes an average of 15 minutes to complete.

Am I guaranteed a place on the Housing Choice Voucher Program Waiting List?

The 2022 HCV Waiting List selection process (lottery) is random. It does not matter what date and time your preapplication is submitted. All pre-applications whether submitted at the beginning of the day on Monday, May 2, 2022 at 7:30AM until Tuesday, May 31,2022, at11:59PM (Pacific Standard Time) of the application period will be placed in random order by the third party software. Applying does not guarantee a place on the 2022 HCV Waiting List nor eligibility for the program.



If the Applicant already has an account, they can sign in. Or they can register for a new account

Also where Applicants will log in to check their status after submitting their Application





Registration collects basic information on the Head of Household (HOH)

- Email or phone number is required to register
- Username must be unique


Passwords must contain 12 characters, 1 uppercase, 1 lowercase and 1 number

To protect sensitive personal data


Applicants are also required to enter 3 security questions



The Applicant Page collects demographic information on the HOH, confirms contact information, & collects Supplemental Contact Information (HUD 92006)








- Multiple contact reasons may be selected

The Household tab also collects information on each of the household members






USPS Validation will compare the address entered by the Applicant to the USPS database

- If there is not an exact match, a suggestion will appear
- Applicant chooses to use the suggested address or continue with the address they entered
- Will not stop the Applicant from continuing due to a lack of an address match

Applicant Household Income Waiting Lists

Income is collected for all Applicants by default


Collection of Assets and Expenses is optional





For each income, the Applicant will enter the source and frequency

- Annual total is calculated automatically
- An info icon encourages Applicants to review the types of income sources





The Waiting Lists tab will display any certifications required from the Applicant



The Review page requires Applicants to confirm that all the information they have entered




Certification message displays at the bottom of the screen as well as on a pop-up



If the Applicant chooses to close the Application (at any time), they receive a message informing them that they must return and submit prior to the list close date



To continue later, the Applicant would visit your Application link and log back in with the credentials created





After submitting, they will be brought to the Application Receipt page.

- They will receive any ineligibility messages if the Application was unsuccessful
 - Duplicate
 - Under the Age of Majority
 - List Has Closed
 - Income Limits
- If Application was successful, they will see an initial status of Submitted
- We recommend having Applicants print this page



After submitting, Applicants may check their Application status by logging back into WaitListCheck with the credentials created during Registration

- Pending, Active, Inactive
- Customized messaging will instruct Applicants on the next steps
