What is Complete Streets?


Integrated networks of streets that are safe and accessible for all people, regardless of age, ability, income, or transportation mode.





What is Complete Streets

Provides safe travel for people using any mode of travel, including bicycling, walking, riding transit, and driving.


- From a sea of possibilities, you distilled the five most important projects for Downtown Santa Ana



- 5th Street (.9 mi)
- Raitt Street (1.3 mi)
- St Andrews Place (1 mi)
- Bishop Street (.8 mi)
- Orange Avenue (2 mi)






Other Study Area Corridors

Recreational (Hike/Run/Bike) Data from Strava Prominent SART and downtown routes




Project Purpose & CAC Tasks




Option #1: Area Covered









Option #2: Area Covered
