

Reimagining the Main Library

When the doors to the Santa Ana Public Library (SAPL) opened on May 1, 1960, the 40,557 square foot structure rightfully took its place as the community hub. For 62 years, the Main Library on Civic Center Drive (formerly 8th Street) has stood as a pillar of support for residents, acting as the pivotal connection point between people, information, services, and opportunity.

PRESENT

Although the internal layout of the library has changed over time, with several reconfigurations and one major renovation, its core purpose to inspire, inform, educate and nurture has remained unwavering. Today, SAPL continues to bring important information, innovative technologies and services to people of all ages through programs featuring tutoring, coding, making, socializing, and much more.

FUTURE

As SAPL looks to the future, intent on evolving to continue to serve the needs of the local residents, it has become clear that the renovation and modernization of the historic structure are essential. Over the next few years, the Main Library will undergo a transformation to ensure its ability to support the community for generations to come. While there will be a period of closure, there will be no lapse in the provision of services. The Library will continue to service residents in other locations and the Knowledge Mobile will continue to make stops throughout the City.

Past, present and future, the Santa Ana Public Library exists to serve the community. For that reason, input from residents is critical to re-imagine the resources, services, and spaces offered within the marble walls. A brief survey is available online in English, Spanish and Vietnamese.

The Knowledge Mobile (Know-Mo) has officially hit the streets of Santa Ana and will be visiting schools, parks, and community centers, bringing needed services and programs to residents! The Know-Mo is a combination of a traditional bookmobile and techmobile, featuring free public Wi-Fi, computers, gaming, STEAM technologies and much more. The Knowledge Mobile will allow community members, especially youth and young adults, to connect, create and learn with the latest technology, computers, arts, crafts, music, games, audiovisual materials, electronic resources and books in print and digital format. Featured programs will also be designed for neurodiverse youth and include low sensory play and specialized robots that provide assistive learning and behavioral support.

FEATURE STORY:

Career Online High School

At the Santa Ana Public Library, providing access to education outside the traditional school system is essential, and opportunities for lifelong learning are integrated into all aspects of the institution. Whether it be tutoring and homework help for youth, test preparation books for checkout, or eResources for personal and professional growth, individuals of all ages have access to continuing their educational journey at the Santa Ana Public Library.

One program SAPL is proud to present for adult residents is Career Online High School, a flexible, online program designed to prepare individuals to enter the workforce while earning a high school diploma. Participants are supported through the self-paced program, which must be completed in 18 months, but can be done in as few as five.

Education is a journey, and individual experiences are extremely personal. A

direct path from kindergarten through high school and onto college is not always as simple as a straight, paved road. For many, the educational journey features roadblocks, detours, and even alternative routes. The first SAPL Career Online High School graduating class featured individuals from many walks of life, each with a unique journey that led to the library.

Alejandro experienced housing insecurity beginning at a young age. The library became his safe place, and he relied on many programs and services to help him survive. While his need to work impacted his ability to finish school, he never lost sight of his goal to earn his high school diploma. During his graduation speech, Alejandro explained what the library means to him.

"One of the most amazing things I've found about the Santa Ana Public Library is their constant ability to inspire and nurture entire generations...I can't think how my life would have turned out had I not had the support and the environment and the help and resources that the Santa Ana Public Library has provided for me."

The decisions made to continue their education and the determination of the graduates to obtain their diplomas is inspiring and a true testament to the importance of lifelong learning opportunities at the library. WHAT DO YOU CALL A GROUP OF BUTTERFLIES?

Groups of animals go by different names like a colony of ants or crash of rhinoceroses; butterflies are known as a kaleidoscope. A kaleidoscope certainly represents the incredible colors of the butterflies the zoo hosted over the summer. July through September, hundreds of beautiful butterflies from Costa Rica filled the "Flight" aviary with their fluttery brilliance.

Butterflies go through a complex life cycle starting from an egg, hatching into a hungry, hungry caterpillar, spinning a chrysalis, and eventually emerging as an adult butterfly. Our butterflies started out on sustainable family farms in Central America and were shipped to Santa Ana each week. Animal care staff carefully unpacked, prepared, and displayed chrysalis so visitors could watch the emergence process. Adult butterflies were then released into the Flight aviary where visitors could experience them up close. The aviary is full of nectar-rich flowers to provide lots of food for the active butterflies. What isn't in the aviary are host plants, the plants butterflies lay their eggs on and caterpillars eat. Because the butterflies at the zoo are not native to California, zoo staff take careful steps to prevent accidental release or reproduction.

Many pollinator attracting plants are planted throughout the zoo including native milkweed in the farm area, the host plant for endangered monarch butterflies. Interpretive signage around the zoo teaches about the life cycle of monarch butterflies and provides tips on how you can encourage pollinators at home. Important pollinators, like butterflies, bats, bees, and hummingbirds are critical for sustaining our ecosystems and pollinating our fruit and vegetable crops so they continue producing food. While the butterfly experience is now closed for the winter, look for it to return in Spring 2023. This park project was made possible with City of Santa Ana youth benefit improvement funds.

There is more excitement to come with many new projects in the works including the Amazon's Edge: Giant River Otter Habitat and Primate Trails. This new area creates a home for otters and monkeys and many animal encounter zones. In the farm the Goat Trails project will create a fun, new space for the community to closely interact with zoo's goat herd. Along First Street, the zoo is receiving an upgrade with enhanced signage, lighting, and landscape improvements.



MEET THE NEWEST ADDITION TO OUR PRIMATE FAMILY, MERCY!

Mercy is a female black howler monkey (*Alouatta caraya*) native to South and Central America. Confused by the name of her species due to her coat color? Your eyes aren't deceiving you. Black howler monkeys are one of the few primate species in which the coat color is different among the sexes. Black howler monkeys are blond at birth, but males turn black as they mature, while females stay blonde their entire lives.

Duly named for their distinct sound that can reach up to 128 decibels, howlers are considered the loudest land mammal in the world. Under the right conditions, some have even been heard up to 3 miles away! These loud guttural sounds are thanks to an enlarged hyoid bone in their throat that acts as a resonating chamber to amplify their sounds.

Mercy may be a little shy as she settles in with her new friends, but you can catch her climbing high in the trees munching on leaves.



SANTA ANA YOUTH ARE WORKING AT THE ZOO!

What happens when local youth have the opportunity to learn job skills at their local zoo? A whole lot of good for the youth, the community and the zoo! The Santa Ana Youth Employment Program ("SAY" for short) is administered by the Santa Ana WORK Center and provides paid work experience to youth ages 16 – 21 who live in Santa Ana.

SAY at the Zoo work in areas throughout the zoo including the goat yard, butterfly habitat, outreach events, special events, and even education programs. Youth learn basic job skills including completing a time sheet, keeping a set schedule, working with coworkers, upholding safety practices, being dependable and reliable and taking initiative. At the zoo, youth become part of the Zoo family by completing training in interacting with guests, helping guests find their way around the zoo, and keeping both animals and people safe in spaces where they can interact, such as the goat yard. Youth learn all about the animals at the zoo, how they are cared for and how they represent animals in the wild. Since joining the program in July 2021, 18 youth have completed their SAY experience at the zoo and 2 have been hired as Zoo Staff! Floss Silk Tree - Palo Borracho In fall the large and prickly South American floss silk trees (Ceiba speciosa) lining the zoo entry walkway transition from an active period of growth towards winter dormancy. During this time, they take center stage with massive umbrellas of pink flowers, one of the most dramatic floral displays at the zoo. After flowering the trees develop fruit pods resembling large green sausages. As the fruit matures it eventually splits open releasing fluffy white fiber, an adaptation to distribute its seeds in the wind. Floss silk trees are a water-wise tree requiring limited irrigation once established but aren't well suited for small spaces because they may grow up to 60 feet tall. Check out the floss silk tree and over 100 other species of interesting and unique trees on your next visit.

The Southern Mountain Yellow-Legged Frog Rana muscosa

Amber Suto (AS), Zoo Program Coordinator, is a key member of a recovery program dedicated to the survival of the Southern Mountain Yellow-Legged Frog (MYLF).

AS: "People overlook frogs. But they're here, they're important, and if we don't help them, they'll disappear. For anyone who thinks amphibians are gross or creepy: the more you learn, the more interesting and beautiful they are. Unlike butterflies, every step of their metamorphosis - from a completely aquatic existence to living on land – is visible. It's mind-boggling. I can't imagine what it would be like to undergo such a transformation."

What are the big factors that contribute to the drastic decline in this frog population? How serious are the threats?

AS: "Fewer than 200 adult frogs are estimated to live in the wild. Drought conditions in MYLF habitats started the recovery program's first rescue operation. The San Gabriel, San Bernardino, and San Jacinto mountains might seem far from Santa Ana, but we share the Santa Ana River Watershed. Partners traveled to find frogs and tadpoles before their water sources disappeared. Where there is water, invasive species have changed MYLF habitats. Fish-stocking lakes and rivers has created more predators. Trout are voracious: they eat tadpoles and outcompete adult frogs for food. African clawed frogs and American bullfrogs can carry deadly chytrid fungus."

What can people do to help?

AS: "Responsible pet practices go a long way toward keeping invasive species out of wild habitats. You can help by never releasing pets into the wild. And anything you can do to reduce global warming helps keep water and temperatures where they need to be for healthy frog habitats. Because MYLF live in cold temperatures at mountain elevations, they develop very slowly. In an especially cold year, they might spend up to nine months living under ice underwater. They're one of the longest-living frog species. A tadpole can take up to four years to become an adult, and they need water that entire time to survive."

What is the Santa Ana Zoo doing?

AS: "Rescued MYLF homed at Los Angeles Zoo have become a breeding population; the Santa Ana Zoo headstarts (raises) tadpoles from that population, and hopes to release juvenile frogs back into the wild by next year. With our recovery program partners, we are deeply invested in the goal to reach twenty wild stable populations with at least fifty frogs apiece. That doesn't solve everything, but it will help ensure species survival for at least 100 years.

Can zoo visitors see the frogs?

AS: "CA Dept. of Fish & Wildlife does not allow display of Rana muscosa, but visitors can see into the windows of the Frog Pod (the lab in which we rear the frogs). They might see zoo staff monitoring water temperatures, testing water quality, feeding, cleaning, and doing health checks. During the winter, they may notice it is dark inside and tanks are blacked out to replicate hibernation conditions."

What do you love about working with MYLF?

AS: "This is legitimately my dream job. I always wanted to work in conservation, and this has a direct and meaningful impact. Plus, it is so fun watching them grow up. This little one right here is just getting back legs. I'm so proud of them!





Green Practices Highlight
