Dear Members of the Selection Committee:

I would be excited to represent the Cities Association of Santa Clara County on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC). The combination of my professional experience and my varied leadership roles on regional boards provides a strong background for the position.

Professionally, I have been a CPA and have been a business owner for 30 years. I have been on Mountain View's City Council for 6 years and have been the Mayor, and Vice Mayor. Before City Council I was on the Planning Commission for 5 years. I have a skill set in which I'm very comfortable with detailed and comprehensive analysis. I've had considerable experience in creating, analyzing and overseeing budgets at all levels.

I am currently on the Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) Board of Directors, National League of Cities (NLC) and League of California Cities (LCC) Advisory Committees, and SR85 Corridor Policy Advisory Board. Previously I was on the VTA Policy Advisory Committee.

I take my fiduciary responsibilities very seriously. As a VTA board member, I wrote a memo about the huge cost of expanding and operating Light Rail, and that decisions made over 18 years ago, may not be relevant today. We need to take politics out of making investment decisions when it comes to spending tax payers' dollars.

MTC appears to have a history of overspending, and just recently spent over \$29,000 for a lavish retreat for the current Board of Directors in Sonoma Valley, which sends the wrong message to constituents. I am strongly motivated to help ensure the MTC budget is both fiscally responsible and in alignment with the MTC goals.

I am well acquainted with the challenges of regional and local transit systems, to serve the many different stakeholders and achieve the goals of effectiveness, efficiency, and affordability. I have been a strong advocate for comprehensive regional and local transit systems.

As Mayor in 2015, along with Mayor Sinks of Cupertino, we formed a coalition of 12 North and West County cities, to have a comprehensive transportation study done by VTA. Traffic congestion on SR 85, 101 and 237 is horrendous. Commutes are long, neighborhood cut-through traffic has increase, and greenhouse gas emissions are on the rise.

When Measure B came up for a ballot vote, this coalition morphed into a strong advocates group for a fair share of Measure B money. The group was able to negotiate over \$1 billion for transit infrastructure, \$350 million to find a traffic solution on SR 85, and \$750 million for Caltrain grade separation.

As a former Mayor and councilmember of Mountain View, I would contribute some unique perspectives and attributes. Mountain View has been on the forefront with policies that address the housing crisis, and solutions for funding for local transit. We are building a new transit center that will be mixed use, hosting Caltrain, Light Rail line, VTA and corporate shuttles as well as housing.

Mountain View has started a study of how to connect downtown with employee-rich North Bayshore, using cutting edge technology (i.e., Aerial Guideway Transit). I've had the opportunity to connect a major employer with VTA to fund a study on how to use the Light Rail station at NASA/Ellis St., to run a transit option into North Bayshore.

I have the added benefit of Mountain View's very experienced transportation staff (4 professionals) that I can turn to and rely on.

I believe a well-planned and implemented regional transit system can solve many of the Bay Area's social problems, from affordable housing, to traffic congestion, greenhouse gas emissions, improving the quality of life of area residents.

Transportation solutions is my number one goal.v It drives me crazy (no pun intended) to see thousands of commuters sitting in traffic. Current transit agencies are not getting the job done. The timing is right for MTC to push all local transportation agencies to stop thinking parochially and work together. I have proven that I can build coalitions and work collaboratively to find solutions, as I did as a founding member of Silicon Valley Clean Energy and building the North/West Cities Coalition. I am not afraid to ask the hard questions. I have no political agenda, I just want results.

I have the benefit of traveling to many national conferences, the NLC, LCC, and had the opportunity to see firsthand what transportation solution exist in other cities. I have met our fellow elected officials and learned their best practices. This knowledge makes me better prepared to find solution that work.

I would be honored to be your Representative to MTC.

I am respectfully requesting reappointment as the cities of Santa Clara County representative to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC).

MTC is both the metropolitan planning agency for the nine-county bay area (federal designation) as well as the regional transportation agency (state designation). It serves as the agency responsible for allocating state and federal funds to regional transportation projects. MTC transportation plans, development and funding must align with long-range plans that guide transportation and housing development. I believe Santa Clara County cities are best served by having a representative who has experience and leadership, is well connected, understands the challenges and linkages between land use and transportation needs, has worked effectively and collaboratively with fellow Santa Clara County representatives County Supervisor Cortese and Mayor Liccardo, and has the respect of all other members of the MTC.

I am well versed and respected in the transportation arena. I've served in multiple capacities with the Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) over the past six years, including the Policy Advisory Committee for three years (2013-2015) and on the Board for three years (2016-2018). The business plan assesses the benefits, impacts and costs of different service visions, building the case for investment and implementation. This type of long-range planning is essential to addressing our transportation needs.

I've served on MTC for the past two years. In the two years I have served on MTC I have learned the importance of having a representative that not only has a solid background and strong voice for transportation planning and investment, but also the soft skills to be an effective collaborator. My colleagues on the commission appreciate the perspective I bring, my willingness to challenge the status quo and my knack for saying what they themselves are thinking. With the retirement of Steve Heminger, the Commission will be onboarding a new Executive Director. Selection of the new ED is one

of the most critical decision the Commission will be making. As a member of the Executive Director Selection Committee it is my hope that I will be able to see this task through.

Transportation, jobs and housing are all intertwined and must be addressed holistically. Over the next year or two key decisions will be made and directions set. With the experience, character, leadership and continuity I bring to the position, I have what it takes to tackle the challenges and complexities of the imbalances we face.
