| Agency | The California Legislature created the Air District in 1955 as the first regional air pollution control agency in the country. The Air District is tasked with regulating stationary sources of air pollution in the nine counties that surround San Francisco Bay: Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, southwestern Solano, and southern Sonoma counties. It is governed by a 24-member Board of Directors composed of locally elected officials from each of the nine Bay Area counties, with the number of board members from each county being proportionate to its population |

| Role | The Board of Directors oversees the Air District as it develops policies, plans, rules, permits, enforcement, outreach, and grant programs to protect air quality, public health, and the global climate. Each county's population determines the number of representatives on the Board, as follows: • Marin and Napa: 1 representative each |

Rules and regulations are adopted by a majority of the Board, with public hearings required before rules are changed or adopted. |

Chief Operating Officer Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority The Santa Clara County Operational Area (Op Area) consists of the County of Santa Clara, cities, towns and special districts within Santa Clara County. The County Office of Emergency Management is a hub for communications and coordination between local, regional and state emergency operations centers.

Emergency Operational Area Council (EOAC)

The purpose of the EOAC is to enhance Op Areawide emergency planning and preparedness for large-scale emergencies by fostering:

- Partnerships within the Op Area for greater consistency and efficiency;
- Increased participation by cities, towns and special districts;
- Public-private partnerships.

The EOAC also makes recommendations for funding priorities and serves as the County's Disaster Council.

EOAC Functional Roles & Responsibilities

- Coordinate information, resources and priorities and inform decisions for Op Area-level emergency response actions.
- Review and discuss Op Area emergency and mutual aid plans, disaster response policies and procedures.
- Ensure unity of purpose in emergency plans, policies and procedures.
- Facilitate an effective flow of information and emergency preparedness through training, planning, response plans and policies.
- Review annual training and exercise plans for the County's Disaster Service Worker (DSW) program and recommend approval to the Board of Supervisors.
