Sheriff Robert Jonsen Bio

Sheriff Bob Jonsen has been in law enforcement since 1986. Before being elected as the 29th Sheriff of Santa Clara County, he was the Chief of Police for the Palo Alto Police Department (2018–2022). He was also the Chief of Police for the Menlo Park Police Department for five years, leading the organization to receive the IACP/Cisco Community Policing Award. Most of Sheriff Jonsen’s career was with the Los Angeles County Sheriff’s Department, where he worked for 27 years. Sheriff Jonsen knew early on that law enforcement was a natural course of action. His father served San Francisco as a police officer in the 1960s and a firefighter in the ‘70s. His great-great uncle was Santa Clara County’s 11th sheriff from 1887 to 1891.

Sheriff Jonsen was instrumental in bringing mindfulness and resiliency training to law enforcement and collaborated with the Compassion Institute in developing “Courageous Heart – The Human Behind the Badge,” now offered to law enforcement agencies in California. As the Chair of the California State Sheriff’s Association’s Health and Wellness Committee, Sheriff Jonsen hopes to inspire and empower the next generation to pursue their dreams, contribute to their communities, and make a positive difference in the world while maintaining a healthy lifestyle throughout their career.

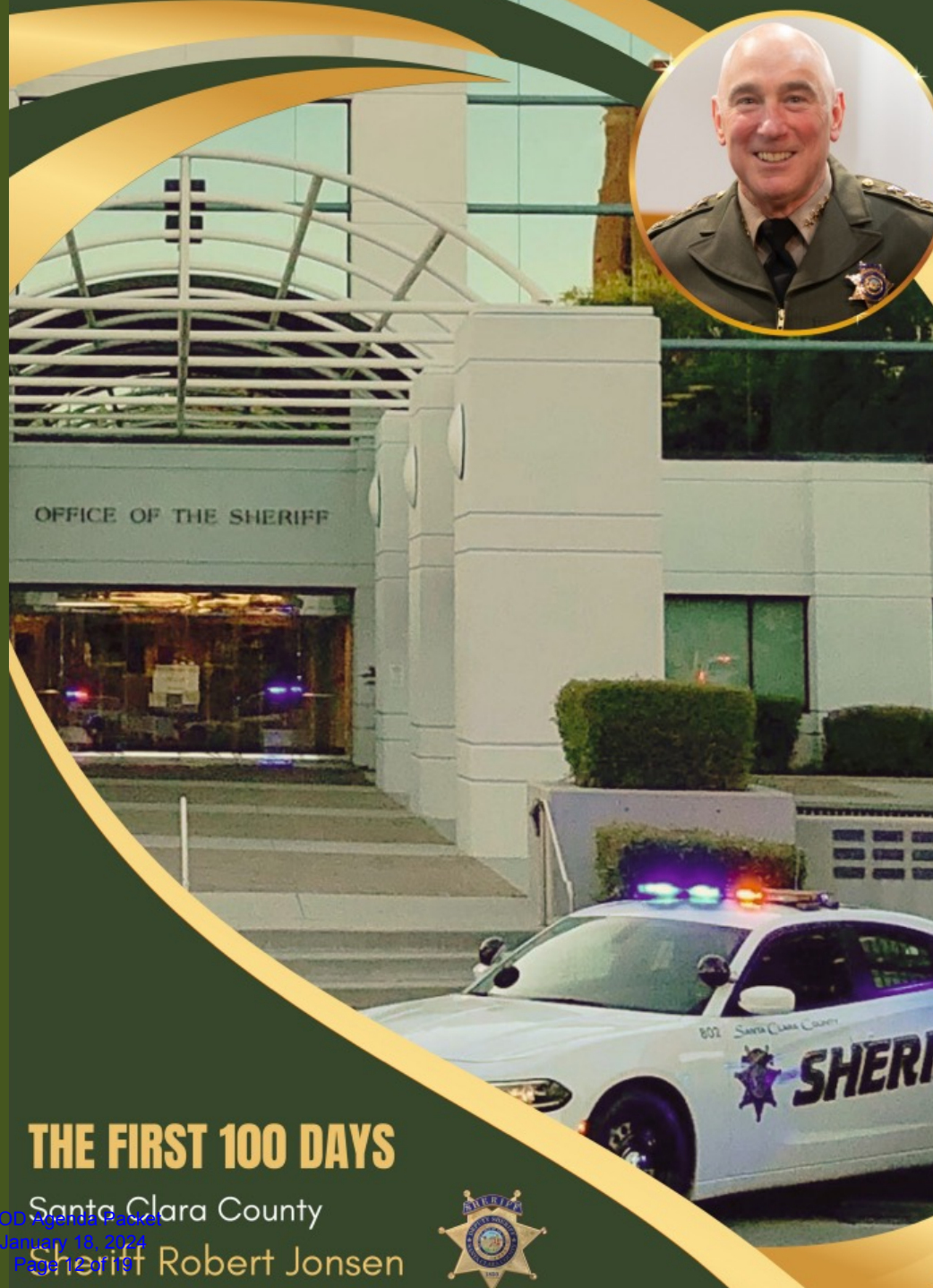

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Transparency Portal

Senate Bill 1421 and Senate Bill 16 require law enforcement agencies to release records certain records of law enforcement officer misconduct, which include:

- The discharge of a firearm at a person.
- The use of force against a person that resulted in death or in great bodily injury.
- A sustained finding involving unreasonable or excessive force.
- A sustained finding that an officer failed to intervene against another officer using force that is clearly unreasonable or excessive.
- A sustained finding that a peace officer or custodial officer engaged in sexual assault involving a member of the public.
- A sustained finding involving dishonesty by a peace officer or custodial officer directly relating to the reporting, investigation, or prosecution of a crime, or misconduct by, another peace officer.
- A sustained finding that a peace officer or custodial officer engaged in conduct involving prejudice or discrimination against a person on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status.
- A sustained finding that the peace officer made an unlawful arrest or conducted an unlawful search.
- A record relating to a sustained finding that the peace officer made an unlawful arrest or conducted an unlawful search.

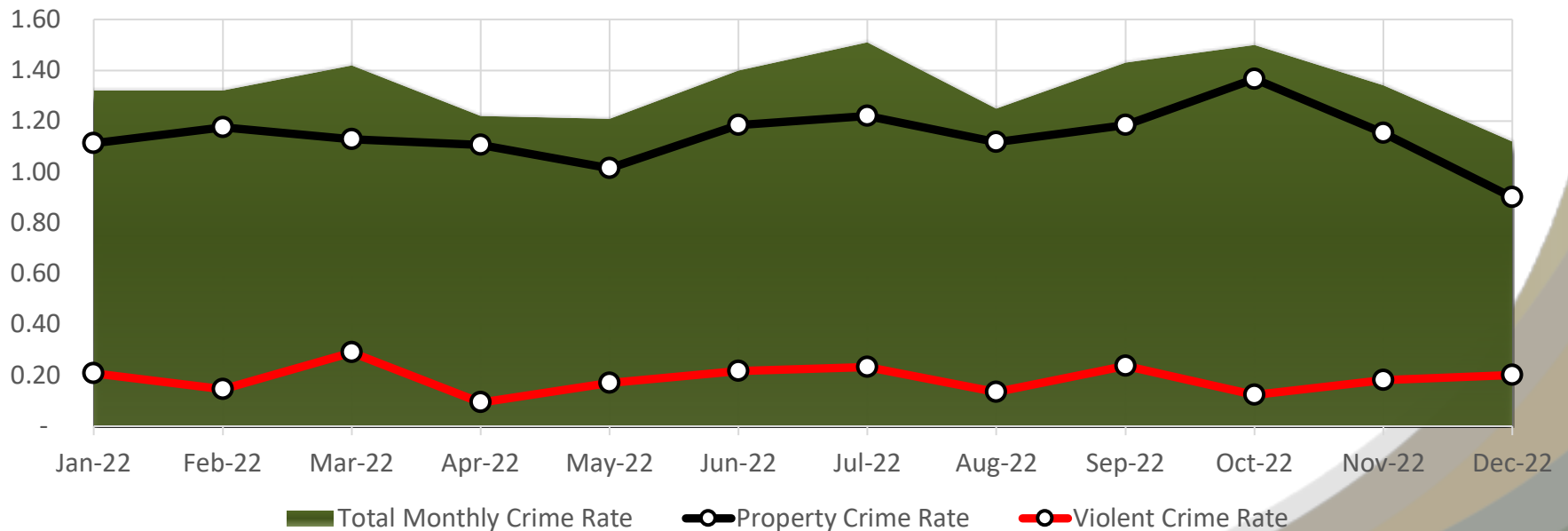
