1.1 9:00 a.m. Sheriff Lohrey, Sheriff's Office Quarterly Report

Present: Verna McClennan, Audrey Ihrke, Drew Messenger, Brittany Wood, Nate Stice, Carrie Pipinich, Michelle Colby, Brad Lohrey, Times Journal

Brad Lohrey stated that in nine months he will be retiring as Sheriff of Sherman County. Brad stated that Undersheriff James Burgett is the only person running for Sheriff, therefore, Brad has started training James on Budget and is allowing James to complete the budget process this year for the 2024/25 fiscal year. In July, Brad also plans to start stepping down from the boards that he sits on. James will replace Brad on some of those boards but not all of them. New Deputy Marc Peck will start work next Wednesday, April 10, 2024. Deputy Marc Peck is already marine trained and certified and will be able to work the river this summer.

Brad mentioned the Western States Sheriff's Association 2023-2024 Sheriff of the Year award that he received in March. County Court congratulated him on a job well done. County Court stated that Brad and his entire office do a great job protecting and serving our community.

Brad mentioned that one of the new patrol cars are in the shop getting fitted with all the gear necessary to make the car road ready for the office to use.

Brad mentioned that Undersheriff James Burgett is helping lead snipper school this week at the fairgrounds in Sherman County. There are about 8 people taking this week long training.

Present: Michelle Colby, Carrie Pipinich, Brittany Wood, Drew Messenger, Audrey Ihrke, Verna McClennan, Times Journal

Carrie Pipinich introduced Michelle Colby as a new MCEDD staff member who will be providing primary support for Sherman County moving forward. County Court welcomed Michelle.

Carrie gave highlights from her quarterly reports as follows:

- MCEDD EPA Brownfields Grant: MCEDD is working through the final pieces before we can kick off
 the program. It will be a wait while the consultants get quality assurance plan approved by EPA but all
 others pieces are in place to go live in April. This will allow us to start accepting applications with an
 approximate timeline from project acceptance to completion of two to three months for work to be
 completed on individual sites.
- Solar + Storage Planning Project at the School: Sherman County and Sherman County School
 received planning funds previously from Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE) to obtain a Micro grid
 Feasibility Report. Staff had conversations with project manager Alan Hickenbottom, to get familiar
 with the project and discuss next steps. These include potential for applying to ODOE Energy
 Community Renewable Energy Grant Program for construction funding as well as exploring alternate
 sources for backup power for the well.
- Staff has been working with Sherman Co Emergency Management to explore the best projects to submit to the new Resilience funding at ODHS.

• Organizational support:

- o Four Cities Meetings: Meeting of City administrators in March focused mainly on budget with Kathryn Greiner from Condon serving as a guest to talk about how she approaches their city budget. Staff participated and introduced new MCEDD staff, Michelle Colby
- o City of Grass Valley:
 - Wastewater: Staff is working closely with the City and their engineer to support developing a DEQ Planning Grant application to support moving forward some of the needed next steps as the City works toward developing its full funding package for the project.
 - Water: The City submitted a Sustainable Infrastructure Planning Projects (SIPP) Application to Business Oregon for Water Master Plan update.
 - City Park: Staff helped the City develop a short park survey to gather input on where the City should focus improvements. This is in preparation for submission to the Oregon Park and Recreation Department's Local Government Grant Program for priority improvements in May.

o City of Wasco:

- Staff worked with the City to explore a SIPP application for a water master plan but determined it would be best to wait until the fall funding round to provide time to work with an engineering firm to create an appropriate scope of work for the \$20,000 grant.
- Staff also explored potential grant resources for adding a telemetry system to the City's wells and discussed procurement for engineering services.
- Staff has reached out to Kid Zone to get tour of facilities and discuss needed support.

- o City of Moro: Staff worked with the City to support submission of an application to the Water/Waste Water funding program at Business Oregon for their water tank repair project.
 - Staff is working with Little Wheats on grant applications.
- O Staff supported Sherman Veterinary Associates with a USDA grant application to support purchasing large animal equipment, another mobile vet truck, some specific training, and to support providing educational opportunities in the community.
- Housing Assistance: Staff worked with one new applicant and handled several inquiries. There is also one project nearing completion. The budget for the program shows that there is approximately \$85,000 not committed to projects yet.

Motion by Commissioner Miller, second by Commissioner Bird, to approve changing the Housing Rehabilitation and Housing Property Preparation Grant Application from a one year to an 18-month completion requirement and approve the changes to the terms and conditions section of the grant applications.
