Eric Akin, Veteran Services Officer, presented highlights from his quarterly report.

Susan Davis, Columbia Gorge Community College Foundation Executive Director, came to County Court for a meet and greet and to give a brief over view of highlights for this year.

The Columbia Gorge Community College Foundation continues to expand their scholarship programs with more than \$240,000 awarded, providing over 174 scholarships. These scholarships were awarded in half-year and full-year increments to support students with tuition, books and fees.

Columbia Gorge Community College (CGCC) offers an Aviation Maintenance Technology program that provides comprehensive, FAA-approved, training in aircraft maintenance, covering both airframe and power plant systems. Specialized certificates in Aviation Airframe and Aviation Power plant allow you to scaffold your educational journey and take FAA licensure exams as you complete each area of training. Individuals who have successfully passed their Airframe and Power plant licensure exams are in high demand as studies are showing that a large number of currently employed mechanics are reaching retirement age, making the field of Aviation Maintenance rich with opportunities for interested individuals. Successfully passing the exam can launch a career into this exciting industry full of adventure and growth. Starting at an average of \$30/hour and growing to over \$100K inside of the first 8 years. CGCC proudly announces the addition of a second cohort to the Aviation Maintenance Technology (AMT) program. This second cohort will add an additional 16 students per year to this program and classes will start September 25th, 2024. In addition to starting a second cohort, CGCC is moving the program's hands-on workspace to the Columbia Gorge Regional Airport in Dallesport.

CGCC is working with partner agencies to come up with a solution for childcare issues. The vision is to have a full-time daycare off campus and to have early education practicum students come do their hands-on practicums at the daycare. This idea is still in the planning phase.

Susan invited County Court to participate in the 24th Annual Founders Cup Golf Tournament, being held September 7, 2024 to support Columbia Gorge Community College student scholarships as they pursue career, education, and lifelong learning goals.

Columbia Gorge Community College is proud to announce its official acceptance into the Northwest Athletics Conference (NWAC) with the launch of its first sports teams, Men's and Women's Cross Country, entering the conference in the Fall of 2024.

Exhibit A Section 5.3.c. The County shall inspect all Mobile Food Unit great traps quarterly. (Should it say The County or designee)?

Exhibit A Section 6.1 Mobile Food Units are prohibited within 100 feet of a gas station. (A conversation came up about 100 feet and if there should be a qualifier to this. What if within 100 feet is a different landowner who wants a mobile food unit on their land or other scenarios)?

Exhibit A Section 7.1 First line saysmust no obstruct and it should saymust not obstruct.

Commissioner Bird will send this proposed ordinance to the Health Department for review.

2.4 Biggs Service District Funding

Judge Dabulskis told County Court that the Biggs Water project was coming to a close and the final bills were coming in. One of the final bills is the 5% retainage which is \$289,112. Biggs Service District does not have the money to pay this bill. Judge Dabulskis stated that the Sherman County Budget Committee last year made a motion to grant \$1,000,000 to be used out of SIP to finish this project and those funds have not been used. The Judge noted that with the other bills to be paid, we will use the one million dollars and may need to use some of the other COVID related funds that we still have available.

Judge Dabulskis is going to sign the paperwork to get the bills paid, get final numbers on this project and bring back to County Court.
