3.3 Coronavirus Relief Fund Reimbursement Requests

Judge Dabulskis along with Debbie Hayden and Rita Wilson are compiling all of the costs associated with the Coronavirus. Reimbursements can be items such as County Counsel time, Judge Dabulskis' time, Health Managers' time, improving internet costs, extra costs for delivering meals, etc. The county received the paperwork on May 18th and it is due on May 22nd.

Jeff Wallace reported the permit necessary to bury Sherman County's fiber line under the BPA right-away near Rufus has been approved by BPA and he will now start working on the change order with Windwave.

Kelsi Phillips is working on creating the online surplus account for the police car.

There was a discussion about Windwave. A question came up about Frontier Telenet and whether or not they are paying Windwave \$42,000 a year? Commissioner Bird has additional questions for Windwave regarding the OSU Extension bill. Commissioner McCoy explained that Frontier Telenet has a termsheet with Windwave and that Sherman County does not have anything formally in writing with Windwave that it is our line. No one disputes that the line belongs to Sherman County but the county should have something in writing. Commissioner McCoy has a draft in writing but it has not been approved.

There was a discussion about the Warm Line. Unanswered questions were how is the warm line going and does anyone know the numbers of users?

Questions came up about Building Codes and if anyone has heard anything. No updates

Hot Spots – There is a hot spot in Grass Valley at the Pavillion. In Rufus the hot spot is at City Hall. In Moro, they hope to install the hot spot by the Sherman County Museum. They still need to connect with Bert Perisho to make final arrangements for the Moro hot spot. In Wasco they hope to install the hot spot by the Depot.
