1.2 9:12 a.m. OSU Extension – video and storage

Present: Cindy Brown

Cindy Brown, Sherman County Extension and Amy Derby, Wheeler County 4-H/Livestock agent were selected to do a presentation at the national 4-H agent conference in Boise in October, which has now been changed to virtual. By September 30, they are to submit a video (up to 1 GB, which is about 20-30 minutes) as part of the zoom meeting which the conference organizers will set up. The topic is "Food Fire Fun: All in One, Why and How to Teach Outdoor Cooking at Youth Events".

Cindy requested that they be allowed to use part of the unused travel budget (since unable to travel for OSU since mid-March) and/or the \$26,438 carryover balance of Sherman Extension to hire Immense Imagery to do a professional quality video for this project. Wheeler County Extension also has unused travel funds that may be available to help with the cost of a professional video. A video with music,

text, still photos, excellent videography, and professional editing. This would best represent Sherman and Wheeler County Extension and OSU at the national conference

Cindy mentioned extensions storage needs. The Safety Committee noted at their last meeting that the extension storage is getting too full and needs to be addressed. Cindy has moved the top tier of items into an unused office for the time being, but needs to find a more permanent home for the overflowing storage. Cindy is going to talk to Amy Asher to see how much Prevention recently paid for their new storage shed. Cindy is also going to talk to the OSU Experiment Station to see about putting a storage shed on that property and share the shed with them.

Cindy mentioned that the OSU Extension Office is open with modified operations. OSU is encouraging staff to use a low-density (not very many people around), mixed-modality (work remotely as much as possible, minimize in-person activities) work approach during these modified operations. Volunteers are encouraged to continue working remotely.

Cindy has been able to do a few day camps with a small number of participants. Sherman County Extension has been approved to have an after school program two days a week for a small number of participants.

1.3 9:37 a.m. Brad Baird, Anderson Perry and Associates Inc. Present: Brad Baird, Amy Asher, Merrie von Borstel

Brad Baird, from Anderson Perry and Associates, gave an update for the Biggs Service District Water System Improvements project. Brad said that the well was initially drilled to 164 feet, and the driller lost his drill bit. The driller tried for a day and could not retrieve it. The well had to be abandoned in place and filled with concrete. The District does not pay for this situation, as it was the well driller's responsibility. The well was moved about 10 feet to the east, and is now down to 250 feet. The upper 10-inch casing is being installed and will be grouted in place soon. Drilling for the lower water bearing hole will then commence. The target depth is 400 feet.

Brad discussed the timeline for the remaining improvements. Brad said that he is wrapping up the remaining design. The draft design will allow the ODOT permit to be finalized. Brad also said that it would be preferable to have the well yield known (flow rate) before we go out to bid on the remaining improvements, and this information is getting close to being known with the well drilling progress. Bidding can occur this fall with construction this winter and spring, assuming a favorable winter. It would be preferable to get this out to bid as soon as the well is done so the water system can be constructed this winter and spring, so it is online prior to summer 2021.
