## SUBJECT: LAFCO Project No. 2023-01 Dissolution of Reclamation District 2134

## Recommendation:

CONSIDER and ADOPT the attached LAFCO Resolution affirming that Reclamation District 2134 (RD 2134) is an inactive District, and;

INITIATE the dissolution of RD 2134 pursuant to Government Code (GC)§56879.

## Executive Summary:

In November 2022, the Solano Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) received a Notice of Inactive Special District from the State Controller's Office (SCO) (Attachment A) that identifies RD 2134 as an "inactive district" and, as such, should be considered for dissolution. If the Commission finds that the District is "inactive" the Commission is required to initiate RD 2134's dissolution using a streamlined process (SB 448).
Applying this method, the Commission can dissolve special districts with one public hearing following the adoption of a resolution initiating dissolution and forgo the conducting authority proceeding (protest hearing). In addition, LAFCOs are not required to identify a "successor agency" to assume any services.

In order to affirm that RD 2134 is inactive, the Commission must determine that all four of the following criteria are met (GC §56042):

1. The district is a special district as defined in Section $56036^{1}$.
$\checkmark$ RD 2134 was formed as a District by LAFCO Resolution 2000-21, adopted on December 12, 2000.
2. The special district has had no financial transactions in the previous fiscal year. $\checkmark$ According to the SCO and Solano County ACO, RD 2134 reported no financial

[^2]transactions in the previous year.
3. The special district has no assets and liabilities.
$\checkmark$ The SCO, Solano County ACO, and, by resolution, the RD 2134 Board report no assets or liabilities SB 448 specifically eliminated the need for a successor agency.
4. The district has no outstanding debts, judgments, litigation, contracts, liens, or claims.
$\checkmark$ Staff can find no outstanding debts, judgments, litigation, contracts, liens, or claims against RD 2134. Furthermore, the District resolution declares none

Based on the findings satisfying the four requirements, support from the RD 2134's Board of Directors (Attachment B), and that the landowners are still responsible for maintaining the levees, staff recommends that the Commission affirms that RD 2134 is inactive and initiates the dissolution.

Following is a discussion including background, environmental determination, public notice, and conclusion.

## I. Background:

RD 2134 was formed in 2000 as an independent public agency under the terms of the Reclamation District Law and is comprised of three parcels (APN 0046-120-120, APN 0048-020-040, and APN 0048-040-210) totaling approximately 852 acres. The District's primary property owner is the California Waterfowl Association (CWA Denverton LLC).

Additionally:

- RD 2134 is generally located within the Suisun Marsh bounded by Nurse and Denverton Sloughs.
- Landowners self-assess the cost of operating, repairing, and maintaining drainage facilities, roads, and levees within the boundaries of the District. The district receives no ad-valorem property tax.
- A primary reason for the District formation was to qualify for state
 and federal funding opportunities available to public agencies (i.e. FEMA).
- The land is designated as marshland and included within the Suisun Marsh Resource Conservation Overlay.
- There are no registered voters or residents within District boundaries and no expectations for growth or development of the District.


## II. Environmental Determination:

The dissolution of RD 2134 is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under section 15320 "Changes in the organization of local agencies." The dissolution of a district that provides no services would have no direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect impact on the environment and is therefore not considered to be a project.

It is recommended that the Commission find the subject dissolution exempt from CEQA pursuant to Guidelines Section 15320 where the changes do not change the geographical area in which previously existing powers are exercised.

## III. Public Hearing Notice

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56879(c), the Commission's action associated with this dissolution must occur following a public hearing. If found to be inactive, LAFCO will provide individual notice to the District landowners in accordance with State law and adopted Commission policies. (See Attachment C for copy of the notice). There are no registered voters residing within RD 2134 according to the information provided by the Registrar of Voters Office on December 22, 2022.

## IV. Conclusion

RD 2134 meets all the inactive district criteria set forth in GC §56042. Pursuant to GC §56879, within 90 days of receiving the SCO notice, the Commission initiates a proposal for the dissolution of RD 2134. After the adoption of the resolution initiating dissolution, the dissolution will come back to the Commission for a public hearing and action by the Commission on April 10.

However, if the Commission finds that RD 2134 does not meet the inactive requirements, a letter advising the SCO of the Commission's decision not to initiate dissolution will be sent.

NOW, THEREFORE, the COMMISSION DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER that:

1. ## SUBJECT: Notification of Inactive Special Districts in County

## Dear Rich Seithel:

Chapter 334, Statutes of 2017, also known as Senate Bill (SB) 448, added various provisions to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 regarding special districts that are inactive. It requires the State Controller's Office (SCO) to create a list of inactive special districts based on information in the special district's Financial Transactions Report (FTR), to publish the list of inactive special districts on its website annually, and to notify the local agency formation commission in the county or counties in which the inactive special district is located.

Pursuant to Government Code (GC) section 56042, an "inactive special district" must:

- Meet the definition set forth in GC section 56036;
- Have no financial transactions in the previous fiscal year; and
- Have no assets, liabilities, outstanding debts, judgments, litigation, contracts, liens, or claims.

Pursuant to GC 56879 , within 90 days of receiving this notice, the Commission is required to initiate dissolution of inactive special districts by resolution, unless the Commission determines that a district does not meet the criteria set forth in GC 56042. Additionally, the Commission is required to notify SCO if it determines that district does not meet the dissolution criteria in GC 56042 . Once the dissolution process is complete, please inform SCO using the contact information on page 2 .

## Recommendation:

CONSIDER and ADOPT the LAFCO Resolution determining that Reclamation 2034 (RD 2034) is not an inactive District, and;

DIRECT staff to inform the State Controller's Office of the Commission's determination.

## Executive Summary:

In November 2022, the Solano Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) received a Notice of Inactive Special District from the State Controller's Office (SCO) (Attachment A) that identifies RD 2034 as an "inactive district" and, as such, should be dissolved. If the Commission finds that the District is "inactive" the Commission is required to initiate RD 2034's dissolution using a streamlined process (SB 448) ${ }^{1}$. However, if the Commission finds that RD 2034 is NOT "inactive", the Commission is required to notify the SCO that it determines that the District does not meet the dissolution criteria.

In order to determine whether RD 2034 is inactive, the Commission must determine that the following four criteria are met (GC §56042):

1. That the district is a special district as defined in Section $56036^{2}$.
$\checkmark \quad R D 2034$ is an Independent Special District within the unincorporated area of Solano County. The District was formed under the general reclamation district laws of the State of California with the petition for formation being approved by the Solano County Board of Supervisors on April 7, 1919

2. That the special district has had no financial transactions in the previous fiscal year.
$\checkmark \quad$ According to the SCO and Solano County ACO, RD 2034 reported no financial transactions in the previous year.
3. That the special district has no assets and liabilities.
$\mathbf{x} \quad$ Staff has been advised that there are two agreements in the District's name that invalidate the inactive status: 1. a maintenance agreement with Solano Irrigation District Attachment B), and 2. 1950 Grant of Easements to RD $2034^{3}$ (Attachment C). These agreements create liabilities and obligations. In addition, the District has provided evidence that they have an active bank account that is considered an asset (Attachment D.)
4. The district has no outstanding debts, judgments, litigation, contracts, liens, or claims.
$\mathbf{x} \quad$ The two agreements and the bank account identified above violate the terms of this requirement.

In conclusion, based on RD 2034 not satisfying the four requirements outlined in GC §56042, staff recommends that the Commission: 1. determine that RD 2034 is not inactive, 2. adopt the attached LAFCO Resolution (Attachment C) determining that RD 2034 is not inactive, and 3. direct staff to inform the State Controller's Office of the Commission's determination.

WHEREAS, the Commission hereby determines that said District does not meet the inactive district status as defined; and,

Chapter 334, Statutes of 2017, also known as Senate Bill (SB) 448, added various provisions to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 regarding special districts that are inactive. It requires the State Controller's Office (SCO) to create a list of inactive special districts based on information in the special district's Financial Transactions Report (FTR), to publish the list of inactive special districts on its website annually, and to notify the local agency formation commission in the county or counties in which the inactive special district is located.

Additionally, the Commission is required to notify SCO if it determines that district does not meet the dissolution criteria in GC 56042 . Once the dissolution process is complete, please inform SCO using the contact information on page 2 .

## MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

THE SOLANO IRRIGATION DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as "Irrigation District", and RECLAMATION DISTRICT 2034, hereinafter referred to as "Reclamation District" do enter into the following agreement:

WHEREAS, there exists a generally unfavorable drainage problem in the area bounded by Chadbourne Road. Interstate Highway No. 80, and Suisun creek in Lower Suisun Valley; and

WHEREAS, the Irrigation District has prepared construction plans for the improvement and relocation of portions of the existing drainage channels whiah flow into a drain ditch constructed by the Reclamation District and shown on the accompanying location map and Dwg. No. M-2-275; and

WHEREAS, the Irrigation District will benefit from the aforesaid improvement of drainage facilities through the improvement of drainage on private property within the boundaries of the Irrigation District; and

WHEREAS, the Reclamation District will benefit from the aforesaid improvement of drainage facilities through the removal of surface water which aggravates the present high ground water condition along the north boundary of the Reclamation District,

NOW THEREFORE, it is hexeby agreed as follows:
I. The Solano Irrigation District will provide the necessary labor and equipment for weed control work in the Reclamation Distrjct drain ditch from a point immediately east of Suisun Creek to the tide gates, as indicated on the

Solano Irrigation District Map No. M-2-275. The Reclamation District will pay the cost of any chemicals which may be required for control of aquatic growth within the channel.
2. The Solano Irrigation District agrees to share in the cost of maintenance and repair of the ditch and levee along the Reclamation District's drain between the intersec-

引uIJUN CREK tion of the Reclamation District drain with the Ravines Drain as shown on the attached map, and the tide gates located east of Chadbourne Road. The Irrigation District's share of this cost shall not exceed $50 \%$ of the total, said participation by the Irrigation District in the maintenance and repair costs will be subject to advance approval by both districts of the extent and nature of the work to be performed and of the actual cost to be prorated to each district.
3. The Solano Irrigation District will install an additional flap gate at the tide gate location marked on the attached location map, M-2-275, to reduce the differential head across the present structure at high tides. The Irrigation District will also construct a concrete lined surface on the upstream and downstream slopes of the existing earth dam after additional pipe and flap gate have been installed. Cost of all modifications and additions described in this paragraph will be paid by Solano Irrigation District.
4. Both parties hereby agree that the tide gate structore east of Chadbourne Road will be jointly maintained by both parties with the cost of such maintenance to be shared equally.

## Dear Mr.Seithel:

We understand that LAFCO, as part of recent legislation to review special districts’ status to ensure they are "acting" as a district, may consider dissolution of Reclamation District (RD) 2034. The Solano Irrigation District (SID) currently has a Maintenance Agreement (attached) with RD 2034 for the cost sharing of maintenance activities for drainage facilities located within the RD 2034 boundary. Dissolution of RD 2034 would require that some responsible public agency take over the duty of administering, repairing and maintaining the drainage and levee facilities. Should dissolution of the District be pursued, a responsible public agency (acceptable to those parties) with the power to tax and charge the RD 2034 lands for their share of the benefit of maintenance and use of the drains would have to accept that responsibility.

Solano Irrigation District recommends RD 2034 remain a special district such that it may continue to perform the duties it was originally established and entered into agreement to do.

## RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission receive the FY 2022/23 Mid-Year Budget report.

## DISCUSSION:

The fiscal year (FY) 2022/23 mid-year (MY) budget status provides an overview of LAFCO's expenses and revenues through December 31, 2022. The Commission adopted a $\$ 1,048,788 \mathrm{FY}$ $2022 / 23$ operating budget on June 13, 2022. Attachment A is a table that depicts the approved budget by line item, mid-year actuals, comparison of the two, and year-end estimates.

## I. Approved Budget:

The $\$ 1,048,788$ FY 2022/23 Approved Budget categories include:

Expenses in the Final Approved Budget for FY 2022/23 were built around the anticipated tasks identified in the 2022/23 Workplan, see Attachment B. Major drivers were:

- The expected office relocation; which includes moving office furniture, mechanical and electrical equipment, file storage, and an increase in lease because of a larger space
- Hiring the approved office administrator/clerk; including purchasing new office furniture, new computer set-up, activating a phone line and software licenses, and an increase is salary and benefits;
- Anticipated high-profile projects expected to require third party consulting and assistance
- Biennial Audit


## II. Mid-Year Analysis:

At Mid-Year, expenditures total \$298,739 (29.73\%) and revenues total \$954,665 (94.99\%) of the approved budget.

A mid-year budget breakdown by line item is included as Attachment A. Below is an explanation of impacts to the mid-year budget that account for differences between the Approve Budget and the midyear actual.

1. Salaries and Benefits (1000 series):

At mid-year, salaries and benefits are at $\$ 212,588$, which is $36 \%$ of the salaries and benefits budgeted. The mid-year salaries and benefits items are less than $50 \%$ for the following reasons:

- Salaries/Wages (\#1110) - Mid-year is roughly 33\% of the Approved Budget. The budget anticipated hiring the Office Administrator/Clerk around September. However, because of the delay in the new larger location being available, hiring was delayed. Additionally, the departure of the LAFCO Analyst II/Sr Analyst was not anticipated. The year-end estimate includes budgeting for the new-hired LAFCO Analyst II, and for the Office Administrator/Clerk as soon as possible.
- Health and Benefits (\#1000's series) - The budget anticipated health insurance and other benefits for a staff of four persons. It took two months to replace the vacant analyst position. In addition, the delay in the new, larger office created a delay for the new Office Administrator/Clerk position. Thus, the total for health and benefits for the agency is only at $26 \%$ of the anticipated cost.


## 2. Services and Supplies (2000 series):

At mid-year, the Services and Supplies account (2000 series) is at $21 \%$ of the Approved Budget. The lower expenses can be attributed to:

- Lease Expense/Building - The current office space lease payment will not be charged until March, as it was last fiscal year. Additionally, LAFCO was expected to be relocated into a larger office space in fall 2022, which would was anticipated to result in a higher lease. However, the relocation space has not been completed yet. LAFCO is currently in negotiations with the County for the relocation space and lease contract.
- Other Relocation Expenses - The approved budget accounted for other relocation related expenses, such as moving the commercial printer, moving phones lines, moving internet connections, and moving furniture and onsite storage.
- New Hire Equipment Expenses - Hiring the new Office Administrator/Clerk not only incurs salary and benefits expenses, but also equipping a new work station. Computer equipment, office furniture, phone and internet connections, and software memberships will be necessary.
- Contracted Services / Project Related Expenses - The Approved Budget anticipated some significant project applications that would require third party assistance. Two high profile projects of significant regional concern were anticipated to be submitted in Fall 2022, but are reportedly delayed. And the Vacaville Municipal Service Review and Sphere of Influence Update is anticipated to begin in Spring 2023

The Solano Irrigation District Municipal Service Review scope of work and contract negotiation is underway with Milani and Associates. Continued work on the Rural North Vacaville Water District Municipal Service Review conditions and the Update to the Sphere of Influence is ongoing with the District and Milani and Associates.

- Travel Expenses - The Approved Budget anticipated 3 staff persons would attend the 2022 CALAFCO conference. However, circumstances resulted in only two staff persons attending and no Commissioners. The 2023 Staff Workshop is coming in April.
- Accounting \& Financial - The final budget included funding for the standard bi-annual audit. The Audit is underway and near completion, therefore the expenses will be reflected soon. Additionally, the Solano County Auditor Controller's Office (ACO), who processes vendor claims for LAFCO, invoices LAFCO for services in May typically.


## 3. Revenue (9000):

By mid-year, Staff was able to complete two small annexations into RNVWD. However, as of the end of January 2023, another RNVWD annexation and two SID detachments were completed. As such, $\$ 29,000$ in project application funds will be moved from the holding account to the revenue account ( 9200 - Licenses, Permits, and Franchise).

Staff is currently processing another RNVWD annexation. Staff is also anticipating two SID detachments, an SID annexation, and a Fairfield Island Annexation package within the next couple months. At the time of the FY 22/23 Approved Budget, there were several other large impending projects that LAFCO spoke with other agencies about, but have not come to fruition.

## Year-End Estimates:

The Commission's FY 2022/23 Budget continues to be financially sound. Each category is projected to be within their budgeted amounts at year-end, or slightly under. As calculated in Attachment A, staff forecasts year-end expenditures at $89 \%$ of the adjusted budget and revenues of $96 \%$.
