**ORDINANCE #2733-24-0506**

**AMENDING ORDINANCE #2716-23-0717 CHAPTER 45, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, ARTICLE 1, LICENSING; REGULATIONS SECTION 7; FEES SUBSECTION A, PARAGRAPH 3, 7 & 8**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Somerville, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey amend Chapter 45; Alcoholic Beverages, Section 7 Fees of the Borough Code as codified, be amended in the following manner:

REPLACE: Section 7, Sub section A, Paragraphs 1, 2, 3 & 4 and add paragraphs 5, 6, 7 & 8 to read as follows:

- A. The licenses to be issued in the Borough pursuant to the provisions of the Article and the fees for such licenses which shall be paid in advance upon presentation of the application for a license are as follows:
  - 1) Plenary Retail Consumption License year commencing July 1, 2024 Two thousand two hundred forty four dollars (\$2,244.00)

- 2) Plenary Retail Distribution year commencing July 1, 2024 One thousand nine hundred twenty five dollars (\$1,925)
- 3) Club License year commencing on July 1, 2024 One hundred eighty eight dollars (\$188).
- 4) Special one (1) day social affairs license sixty dollars (\$60)
- 5) Catering Permit for one day sixty dollars (\$60) per day
- 6) Extension of Premise Permit one day forty dollars (\$40) per day.
- 7) Daily Seasonal Farm Market Permit twenty -five dollars (\$25) daily
- 8) Annual Seasonal Farm Market Permit one hundred twenty five dollars (\$125) annual

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, as follows:

- 1) That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- 2) This ordinance shall effect upon final publication and adoption in the manner provided by law.

### **ORDINANCE #2734-24-0506**

#### **AUTHORIZING A STANDING HISTORIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor of Somerville originally established the annually appointed an *ad hoc* Historic Advisory Committee (hereafter referred to as HAC) in 1994 to conserve, promote, preserve, and make accessible public information about the people, places, and events that comprise the shared heritage of all Somerville residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the HAC has served as an advisory committee over three mayoral administrations and continues to advise the Mayor and Council on preservation and conservation issues related to the Daniel Robert House, Somerville’s historic municipal building, and other real historic assets and issues; and

**WHEREAS**, the HAC has proved successful in achieving its initial goals by 1) placing Somerville’s Municipal building on the State and National Registers, 2) annually participating in Somerset County’s sponsored annual “Weekend Journey” heritage event, 3) creating and updating a history and tourism tab for the Borough’s website with the assistance of the Borough’s media consultant; 4) published two books on Somerville’s history [*Images of America: Somerville (Arcadia Press, 1998)* and *The County’s Handsomest House: The Story of an American Gothic Classic (KDP, 2020)*]; 4) creating and periodically updating an inventory of all plaques and monuments on public property; 5) worked with the County Library system to create a digital archive of Borough history and photographs in the Somerville branch library’s James Sommerville New Jersey Room; 6) maintaining a list of all Somerville Mayors and Councilpersons since 1909; and .

**WHEREAS**, the HAC continues to seek out funding for the conservation and preservation of the historic interior and exterior of Borough Hall, raising to date more than half a million dollars in grant funds to assist the Borough with preservation efforts; thereby sustaining the Borough’s ability to have a working, publicly accessible historic site; and

**WHEREAS**, as Somerville continues to advocate for compatible, sensitive, and appropriate development as well as the redevelopment and adaptive reuse of architecturally significant buildings in the Borough, to seek informed, historically informed advice from residents who are knowledgeable about Somerville’s history and current preservation opportunities at the county, state, and national level is increasingly necessary for Somerville’s and the Planning Board’s benefit; and

**WHEREAS** the mission and scope of responsibility of HAC need to be formally codified.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. the HAC is authorized to continue in its advisory role to the Mayor, Council, and the Planning Board as a standing committee of the Somerville Borough government. Up to 10, two-year staggered Committee appointments will be made by the

Mayor with Council approval with no limits on re-appointment. A member of HAC shall serve as Somerville's municipal representative to the county's Cultural and Heritage Commission's Municipal Advisory Committee. HAC is not a historic commission and will have no independent fiscal or regulatory authority.

Section 2. Members shall be Somerville residents, Borough employees, or Somerville business owners with interest in the preservation, and/or, document, artifact conservation, heritage education, architecture, heritage tourism, or who have enthusiasm for Somerville history. Formal training or experience in library science, museum services, education, archaeology, communication media, or preservation, or architecture are welcome, but not necessary for membership.

Section 3. HAC shall continue *"to promote, protect, and preserve the historic heritage, character, artifacts, and architecture of the Borough of Somerville, and to encourage remembrance of historic events by the Borough, to educate the public, and to advise the Mayor, Council, Administration and the Planning Board on historic matters."*

Section 4. The scope of HAC activities shall include but not be limited to:

- Advice and comment on all proposed interior and exterior work and structural alterations to Somerville Borough Hall, the National Register site known as "The Daniel Robert House", to ensure that the US Secretary of Interior's standards are adhered to in managing the building as required by the National Register.
- Maintaining and periodically updating the list of state and nationally recognized properties in the Borough accessible on the website.
- Maintaining and periodically updating an inventory of plaques, monuments, and public art in the Borough for insurance and replacement purposes on behalf of the Borough Administration.
- Maintaining a list of all Borough Mayors with biographical sketches and Councilpersons since 1909 for use by the Administrator, our public school system, or the public on request.
- Review and make recommendations regarding the acceptance and retention of any historic documents, photographs, artwork, or artifacts by the Borough in the Somerville branch Library's New Jersey Room Archive, owned by the Borough but managed in cooperation with the Somerset County Library System.
- Advise the Mayor and Council when it is appropriate and desirable for the Borough to apply for County, State, and Federal funds to support preservation projects in the Borough.

Section 5. The current administrative policy requiring the HAC to review any plans to dispose of any Borough property more than 50 years-old shall be continued by the Borough Administrator.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that if any portion of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid as a matter of law, such declaration shall not affect the remainder of said Ordinance.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.

#### **AMENDING ORDINANCE #2730-24-0318 ESTABLISHING A SALARY RANGE FOR EMPLOYEE TITLES TO BE PAID TO CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset, and the State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The salaries, wages or other compensation to be paid to the following officers and employees of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset, shall be fixed and determined from time to time by resolution of the Council, of the said Borough, at amounts or rates of not less than the respective minimum, nor more than the respective maximum amounts or rates hereinafter set forth opposite the title of the respective officers or employees as follows:

**§ 5-73 Department of Community Development.**

[Added 3-19-01 by Ord. No. 2104; 4-4-05 by Ord. No. 2187]

- A. Director and Code Enforcement Officer. There is hereby established a Department of Community Development, the head of which shall be the ~~Director of Community Development~~ Land Use Director who shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council for a term of one (1) year and until his a successor shall have been appointed and qualified. ~~He shall also serve in the position of the Code Enforcement Officer established in Section 5-46 of the Code of the Borough of Somerville.~~ The Director of Community Development Land Use shall also serve as the Borough of Somerville's Construction Zoning Official. The ~~Community Development~~ Land Use Director shall be responsible for the general

administration of the Department, for the supervision of all personnel assigned thereto, and if not specifically delegated by law to a different official, for the enforcement of all statutes, codes and ordinances referenced in Subsection B, hereof. [Amended 11-1-10 by Ord. No. 2343]
