- B. A resident on Mountain Ave. reached out concerning the Street Tree Program.
- C. Discussion of participation in the Adopt A Drain program.
- D. Consideration of planting a rain garden around East High and Culver Streets.
- E. Timarie reported Ava, our H.S social media representative, included the county shredding schedule on our sites and is working on information for free range eggs.
 - 1. Ava will be graduating in June. A high school student is needed to continue Ava's role as H. S. social media representative.
 - 2. Graduation gift will need to be purchased.
- F. Corie Papandrew of Babe Social NJ is hosting a town clean-up project for women.

III. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Geoff completed the EC recommended Tree Removal-Replacement Ordinance proposal.

- B. Downtown street tree update.
 - 1. DSA had a contract for the removal of a tree in front of Kyma at a cost of \$30,000.
 - 2. EC suggests using this as a pilot program by removing the planter surrounding the tree, remediating the roots and bricks instead of removing the tree.
