General Information *Main Street Trees*

- ~85 Trees along 0.75 miles of NJ Route
 28
- War Memorial (western boundary) to Fire Engine #1 (eastern boundary)
- Majority planted 15-20 years ago
- ~60% Honey Locust, 30% Asian Zelkova, 10% Japanese Tree Lilac or Callery Pear
- Protection fences and buried electrical utility wires on western Main St. allows larger tree species
- No fences and overhead electrical utility wires along eastern Main St.

Current Conditions Main Street Trees

Majority in good condition

• Pruning needed to remediate some conditions

 Some have reached or are nearing "Limited Remaining Life Expectancy" and should be removed

 Heaving pavers are a tripping hazard

 Tree fences remain and protect trees, but are large and obstructive





Current Conditions Main Street Trees

• Recent plantings in past 3-5 years are in poor condition

• Eastern Main St. is missing tree fences/grates

• New development properties are placing few and undersized trees for the area







What's next?

Main Street Trees

- Update tree inventory and assessment
- Create and implement long-term tree service plan
- Create plan to reset heaving pavers and replace or remove tree protection fences
- Adopt tree replacement construction specifications
- Update approved species list
- Ensure Planning Board is vetting approved trees
- Follow 2023 Capital Improvements Plan as guide

Short Term Plan - Recommendations

Main Street Trees

Next 12 months

<u>DPW</u>

- ✔ Remove ivy completed
 - Begin necessary pruning at advice of consultant LTE
 - Remove and replace priority dead or unsafe trees

<u>EC</u>

- ✓ Compile list of replacement tree species for review with DSA and Administration completed
- Finalize best practices for removal and replacement with help of LTE – ongoing
- Compile list of replacement tree fence and grate options

Council to Budget

- Hiring of consultant Licensed Tree Expert (LTE)
- Replacement plan of 3 5 trees / year

1 to 3 years, Fall 2025 - Fall 2027

EC and Administration

- Remove and replace 3 5 trees / year with as needed technical assistance from LTE
- Develop urban forestry plan with LTE

Administration and DSA

- Budget and perform removal of tree fences and suitable replacements
- Budget and perform sidewalk paver repairs
- Create Adopt-A-Tree program with EC

<u>DPW</u>

- Manage replacement and removal operations
- Implement long-term tree service plan at advice of LTE



Long Term Plan - Recommendations

Main Street Trees

3 - 10 years, Fall 2027 - Fall 2034

Administration and EC

- Budget for consultant LTE to conduct tree assessment every 3 – 5 years
- Take actions based on consultant LTE recommendations

DPW

- Manage replacement and removal operations
- Prune trees as necessary
- Remove ivy as necessary

<u>EC</u>

 Re-assess lists of replacement tree species, best practices for removal and replacement, replacement tree fence and grate options







Conclusion

- Street trees enhance mental health, provide shade, and create more walkable, vibrant streetscapes
- They improve air quality, reduce stormwater runoff, and lower temperatures in our town
- Healthy street trees beautify our town, increasing property values, attracting visitors who support businesses, and reduce energy costs overall
