#### **ORDINANCE #2720-23-1016**

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #2702 PROVIDING FUNDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL PURPOSES FOR THE BOROUGH

# OF SOMERVILLE AND APPROPRIATING \$1,668,800 FOR SUCH PURPOSE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Ordinance of the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey (the "Borough") entitled "An Ordinance Providing Funding For Various Capital Purposes For The Borough Of Somerville And Appropriating \$1,668,800 For Such Purpose" finally adopted on April 3, 2023 (the "Ordinance") is hereby incorporated by reference in its entirety.

<u>Section 2</u>. Section 2 of the Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

"The amount of \$1,668,800 is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in Section 1 of the Ordinance and which amount was funded from (a) the Capital Improvement Fund in the amount of \$1,252,300 (\$793,800 of said amount expected to be derived from a NJDOT grant), (b) Capital Surplus in the amount of \$300,000 and (c) Developer Infrastructure Trust Fund in the amount of \$116,500.".

<u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

<u>Section 4</u>. This amendatory ordinance shall take effect immediately upon due passage and publication according to law.

**WHEREAS,** the Borough of Somerville has received grants from the New Jersey Historic Trust in the amount of \$218,907.00 and from the Somerset County Historic Preservation Grant in the amount of \$124,031.00 for the City Hall historic preservation, including the Portico Restoration Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Somerville desires to pre-qualify bidders for the Portico Restoration Project so that the project may be undertaken by a contractor with the skill and experience to perform the scope of work as defined; and

**WHEREAS,** New Jersey local Public Contract Law <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 11-1 et seq. has set forth the proper procedures for the pre-qualification of bidders at <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 11-25; and

**WHEREAS,** the project architect, HMR Associates, 821 Alexander Road, Suite 115, Princeton, New Jersey 08540 has been contracted by the Borough of Somerville and has prepared the Pre-Qualification Regulations and Bidder's Qualification Statement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Pre-Qualification Statement has been reviewed and approved by the State of New Jersey Department of Community Affairs; and

**WHEREAS,** the Borough of Somerville advertised as per Local Public Contracts Law and conducted a public meeting on October 16, 2023, and said public hearing, included all comments, shall be recorded in the official minute book for said hearing; and

WHEREAS, after properly conducting the hearing and meeting all the requirements, it has been determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough of Somerville to adopt the Pre-Qualification Regulations for the Borough of Somerville Portico Restoration Project is adopted and directs the Municipal Clerk to provide all necessary information to the State of New Jersey as required.

#### RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AN APPLICATION FOR AN HDSRF GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,074,230.00 FOR THE REMEDIATION OF PORTION OF THE LANDFILL BDA REDEVELOPMENT AREA, LOCATED ON ROUTE 206 NORTH IN THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE

**WHEREAS,** the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville (the "Borough") is committed to the redevelopment and remediation of a portion of the Landfill BDA Redevelopment Area located on Route 206 North in the Borough of Somerville (the "Property") for the purpose of creating a Community Solar energy generating facility; and

**WHEREAS,** the Borough has determined that there has previously been a discharge of hazardous substances and/or hazardous waste on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Borough intends to apply for a grant from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP") Hazardous Discharge Site Remediation Fund ("HDSRF Grant") to fund the continuation of remediation of certain areas within the Property comprising approximately 29.5 acres within the Landfill BDA Redevelopment Area, which areas are designated on the official tax map of the Borough as Block 124, Lots 17.01 and 21, and are identified in the draft Landfill Closure and Post Closure Care Plan prepared by Geosyntec Consultants for Hathaway Solar LLC, dated July 2021 to be submitted to the NJ DEP for approval; and

**WHEREAS,** the draft Landfill Closure and Post Closure Care Plan refers to the Remedial Investigation Report/Remedial Action Workplan, dated June 23, 2011 (RIR/RAW), which was approved by the NJDEP September 21, 2011; and

**WHEREAS**, the closure of this portion of the landfill will be through the installation of a "cap and cushion" layer (cap) as specified in <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 7:26-2A9 (e)(4)(ii), consisting of a geotextile cushion, polyethylene geomembrane and synthetic turf to isolate the underlying fill material; and

**WHEREAS**, this remediation is estimated to cost \$13,432,307.00 which is intended to be funded through HDSRF Grants as identified below in the total amount of \$10,074,230.00, funding 75% of the total estimated remediation costs, and the developer and Borough will contribute the remaining estimated remediation cost balance of \$3,358,076.81; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough previously applied for and received two HDSRF Grants in 2021 and 2022 totaling \$8,000,000.00 which is to be applied by the Borough toward the funding of the estimated remediation costs; and

**WHEREAS,** the HDSRF Grant application authorized to be submitted by this Resolution is for the sum of \$2,074,230.00 and will bring the total HDSRF Grant amounts to the sum of \$10,074,230.00.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville that it hereby authorizes the submission of an application to the NJDEP for an HDSRF Grant to fund the continuation of remediation of certain areas of the Landfill BDA Redevelopment Area.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Borough Administrator are authorized and directed to sign and submit to the NJDEP a HDSRF Grant application and any and all associated documents for a HDSRF Grant in the amount of \$2,074,230.00 which HDSRF Grant funds are to be utilized by the Borough to fund the remediation of certain areas of the landfill.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

T. Mitchell - Weekend Journey Into the Past was a successful program.

<u>G. Stravic</u> - Check out the borough website to see the current job openings at Borough Hall. The Environmental Commission discussed the need to educate the public on composting leaves. They have also been working on tree ordinances and the upcoming tree planting at Walck Park that is being funded by a grant.

<u>R. Vroom</u> - This past Saturday was Inspection Day for the Fire Department. This event capped off Fire Prevention Week and a series of educational programs for Somerville students. All the schools in the borough had fire drills.

<u>G. Brady</u> - The borough received \$7 million for the sewer sale and is no longer responsible for maintaining sanitary sewers.

<u>T. Bonner</u> - The Recreation Department is accepting registration for these fall programs: Pre-Season Wrestling Clinic, the Spookyville decorating contest, and the Somerville 5K Turkey Trot. Registration is open for the winter programs: RIB Basketball League, DST Beginner Basketball Clinic and Youth Wrestling. The Halloween Spooktacular will be held on October 31 and the Recreation Department will have a pumpkin patch on the courthouse lawn for the kids to choose a pumpkin to decorate.

The Department of Public Works is working with the Environmental Commission and the Arbor Day Foundation to plant trees at Walck Park. Phase 1 of the PSE&G paving project is almost complete. Curbside leaf pickup starts on Monday, October 30.

The Youth Services Commission shared that Somerset County is offering a virtual workshop to explore strategies to speak out against bias, harassment and discrimination. This event will be held on October 27.

<u>R. Pitts</u> - Congratulations to the Downtown Somerville Alliance and 3 Summers Creative who won an award for creative website design.

<u>Mayor Sullivan</u> - Please keep leaves out of the gutter so they don't end up in the storm drain. Call Public Works if you need leaves picked up.

## Public Comments

<u>D. Chang 31 S. Davenport Street</u> - Parking is very limited on the streets surrounding the Avalon Somerville Station development. I have a petition, signed by 156 homeowners, requesting the highlighted streets be deemed residential permit parking only.

<u>Mayor Sullivan</u> - When we approved these development projects, the parking requirements were intended to be met onsite. We just approved a short-term lot until an additional parking deck is ready in the last phase.

<u>C. Driver, Redevelopment Director</u> - These streets have not been dedicated to the public yet because there are certain elements that need to be completed. We hope to own the roads by the end of the year and that is when we will have restricted parking, which will be determined by the council.

<u>G. Stravic</u> - We will need some time to investigate and figure out a plan with our team of professionals, but we can't do it tonight.

<u>Mr. Chang</u> - Also, people are not cleaning up after their pets. We need signage to address this issue.

Jennifer Loughran, 716 Falcon Road, Bridgewater - Expressed comments in support of building a skatepark in Somerville.

<u>S. Herrera, 3rd grader at Van Derveer Elementary School</u> - Please build a skatepark in Somerville so my friends and I can skate.

<u>Alex Alb, 14 Drysdale Lane, Bridgewater -</u> I'm here to advocate for the Somerville skateboard project. I urge you to consider the positive impact a skateboard park can have on this community.

<u>Geoff Keiser, 23 Vanderveer Avenue -</u> The Somerville Environmental Commission, at the request of the Borough Council, reviewed the report about the property where Parkview is going to build a playground. This report is based on old data and old environmental standards. We've identified areas of concern and urge you to investigate further. The soil at this property should be tested for contamination and construction should not start until the property is deemed clean and safe.

Larry Cleveland, 34 Grant Avenue - We should err on the side of caution and test the soil.

Cooper Regan, Bridgewater - I would love to help build a skatepark.

<u>Jordan Gaskow, Garrison Road, Bridgewater</u> - I came tonight to support the idea of a skatepark. We need one locally so kids don't have to travel so far. There is a need for this in Somerville.

<u>Carrie Herrera, 114 W. Cliff Street</u> - I'm also here to support the skatepark. This would be an amazing destination for our Somerville youth and the surrounding communities.
