I have had the opportunity to work directly on issues of water quality, air quality, hazardous waste and land use.

For USEPA nationally I served as Director, Municipal Wastewater System Permitting and Director, Transportation and Land Use Policy, Air Quality Programs. As Special Assistant to the USEPA Regional Administrator in San Francisco I was responsible for coordinating all EPA programs in California. My responsibilities also included managing EPA's Integrated Environmental Management Program in Santa Clara County and managing EPA's Southern California Hazardous Waste Management Project. As Director of Policy for the California Hazardous Waste Program I reported to the Director of the CA Department of Health Services. As Toxics Coordinator for Santa Clara County, reporting directly to the County Executive and the Board of Supervisors, I was

responsible for overall implementation of all local hazardous waste and materials programs and policies.

I helped found the Center for Energy and Environmental Studies at Princeton University in 1974 and taught and led research projects there until moving to California in 1982. Later I taught part-time at various universities including UC-Berkeley, UC-Santa Cruz, Stanford and the Claremont Graduate School. As a World Bank consultant I was responsible for air quality and hazardous waste management projects in Mexico and for hazardous waste management efforts in Russia. As a World Wildlife Fund consultant I wrote an environmental plan for Thailand.
