AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITHOUT COMPETITIVE BIDDING WITH INSURANCE SPECIALISTS GROUP, INC. dba LOVE INSURANCE AGENCY FOR THE CITY'S CYBER SECURITY LIABILITY INSURANCE FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 2025; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN CONTINUITY OF COVERAGE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Streetsboro, Portage County, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract without competitive bidding with Insurance Specialists, Inc. dba Love Insurance Agency, on the basis of its recent proposal, for the professional services necessary to manage the City's Cyber Security Liability Insurance coverage, for a period of one year commencing January 1, 2025.

SECTION 2: The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make payment for the same from the General Fund, Account No. 101.81.5521.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

SECTION 4: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the residents of this City for the reason that continuity in provision of cyber insurance services to the City is necessary for the proper functioning of the municipality, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Streetsboro, Portage County, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract without competitive bidding with Insurance Specialists, Inc. dba Love Insurance Agency, on the basis of its proposal, for the professional services necessary to manage the City's risk management and insurance program, including purchase of comprehensive public entity insurance coverage, for a period of one year commencing January 1, 2025.

SECTION 2: The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make payment for the same from the General Fund, Account No. 101.11.5522 and 101.81.5521.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

SECTION 4: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the residents of this City for the reason that continuity in provision of engineering services to the City is necessary for the proper functioning of the municipality, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2023-156, THE 2024 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE. [#13]
