Mayor's Report

Mayor Broska asked to appoint three people to the Parks, Recreation and Conservation Advisory Committee (PRCAC) for a three-year term. Sheri Gestring and Keith Smith were reappointments and joined the meeting by Zoom teleconferencing and Chris Yonish was a new appointment and was in attendance. There was a few minute delay while Mr. Smith reconnected to Zoom from work. Mayor Broska presented the candidates and asked Council if they had any questions for the appointees. There were no questions.

Mayor Broska reminded everyone that Police Chief Darin Powers had resigned/retired and moved on to another opportunity back in July and the administration had started the process to find and hire a new Police Chief. He said he was very happy that Streetsboro had always been able to find the next Police Chief within the Department and he was always very happy to promote from within. He felt Chief Powers had done a tremendous job getting his two Lieutenants ready for the Chief position and he felt the Lieutenants would do a great job getting the Sergeants ready for their next position as it came along. After the written exams and the assessment center review one candidate rose to the top and that candidate was Lt. Patricia Wain. She had been with the Streetsboro Police Department since 1995 and had progressed through the ranks and had always shown herself to be a great team player and a great leader and Mayor Broska was confident in her abilities to move the Streetsboro Police Department forward.

He asked Council to appoint Patricia Wain as the new Chief of the Streetsboro Police Department, but Mr. Ruediger reminded him that according to Section 8.04 of the City Charter the Mayor as Director of Public Safety shall appoint the Police Chief in accordance with the Civil Service Laws and Council did not need to confirm the appointment. Mayor Broska appointed Patricia J. Wain as Police Chief of the City of Streetsboro and then swore her in [applause]. Her husband, Officer Terry Wain, pinned her new badge on her [more applause].

Mayor Broska also announced that Officer Stan Siedlecki had been promoted to the position of Sergeant in the Streetsboro Police Department [applause].

Mayor's Report (cont.)

Mayor Broska said Mr. Lampa and some members of the administration (Katie Harrison, Shawna Lockhart-Reese) had been working hard on the on-line bill pay feature of the new website and it was moving ahead and would be ready to go within the timeframe that had been discussed.

Mayor Broska also reported that Ravenna Road and Page Road were currently being resurfaced in a multi-stage process. The final surface coat was expected to be done at the end of this week, then the berms, then the street striping. The 2020 City paving project had some delays but Karvo should start soon; they had already started the Miller Parkway portion of the project.

Citizens' Comments

None.

Reports/Communications from Depts/Boards/Commissions

Chief Reinholz gave an update for the Fire Department. He said they hired one part-timer. There were four part-timers that left the department for other full-time departments; he hoped they would still come to Streetsboro to work part-time even with fewer hours. Streetsboro was constantly hiring part-timers. The firefighters had been to Mantua twice in the last two weeks for a house fire and an industrial fire.

The Fire Department had been awarded an AFG grant for \$221,000 for SCBA equipment and had finally received the bids this week, so the department would be moving forward to select a manufacturer and acquire the air packs soon.

Captain Grimm had put out a video today of the construction work on the new fire station with aerial views as well. Chief Reinholz appreciated Council's participation in the Thursday morning station update meetings.

Chief Reinholz reported that Streetsboro was holding its own regarding COVID-19 because the citizens were taking the necessary precautions although Portage County was at the red level mostly because of the university population. The City of Kent had about 8 times the cases that Streetsboro had.

Chief Wain reported the Police Department was working on hiring to fill two openings and may have a third opening with an upcoming retirement. She said they had completed interviews last week and had some standout applicants that were going through background checks, but the candidate list had dropped to less than 10 so the City would probably have to test again. She was pleased that there were so many standout applicants because normally they lose a lot in the interview process that are not truly prepared. She said the police academy allowed open enrollment regardless of whether the student would meet the qualifications afterward.

Mr. Miller reported that the service garage construction had begun about $1\frac{1}{2}$ weeks ago; the foundation appeared to be done and it was moving forward. He announced that brush pickup started this week and would be 2-3 weeks and then leaf pickup would begin.

She said she heard many compliments from visitors to the baseball tournaments she attended on the condition of City Park. She thanked Mr. Mytinger, his staff and City Council for all the improvements.

Mr. Lampa thanked the Parks and Recreation Department and the Beautification Committee for the successful Clean Up Day over the weekend. They filled two 40' dumpsters full of trash and an 80' dumpster full of scrap. He suggested doing this Clean Up Day each spring and fall. He also reported that the Parks and Recreation Department was having a City-wide Scavenger Hunt this fall with a new search each weekend in October. Ms. Wagner said she also had heard positive things about the Clean Up Day event.

Mr. Hannan agreed the City Park looked very good. He thanked Sal Ruffo and Tyler Baughman for their hard work on all the park properties. Mr. Hannan said Mr. Ruffo and Mr. Baughman had been very helpful preparing the courses for the Cross Country team events.
