Cancellations: SPRD reserves the right to cancel any class or program that does not meet the minimum required participants. If your class is cancelled, we will notify you by phone. You may transfer to another class or program, receive a credit for a later class or program, or receive a refund. Program dates and times are subject to change on short notice.

Refund Policy: Refunds will be granted if request is made 5 working days in advance of the first program date. A \$5 administrative fee will be withheld. Refunds will not be granted once a program begins. Acceptable exceptions are an injury that prohibits participant's involvement or a doctor's statement of participant's inability to participate. Please allow 3-4 weeks for refund by mail. Refunds or credits will be given for classes cancelled by SPRD.

Programs cancelled by the Streetsboro Senior Center you will receive a full refund of program fees. If you must cancel for any reason including illness, please give at least 7 days notice prior to the program date. Refunds will be given only if no expenses/ticket purchases have occurred. Approved refunds will be applied as a program credit for future programs. If a refund check is requested, there will be a \$5 processing fee. Any cancellations within 7 days of the program will not receive a credit or refund. You are welcome to have someone take your place.

Deadline Policy/Fee: If a program is registered for after the noted deadline, SPRD reserves the right to add a fee. If there are not enough participants registered by the noted program deadline, SPRD reserves the right to cancel the program. Please contact SPRD for applicable fee amounts.

Titus Street

- **1798** Titus Street receives deed for land in the township from the Connecticut Land Company. Streetsborough--as it was originally called until sometime when the 'ugh' was dropped -received its name from Titus Street, who was originally from New Haven, Conn. held the original deed to the 15,279 acres that made up the township.
- **1821** First extensive surveying of land. Divided into 100 tracts which is sold for \$2.00 to \$6.00 per acre. All major roads were planned at this time.
- 1822 Stephen Myers constructs cabin, establishing first settlement.
- **1825** First frame house erected in Streetsboro by Daniel Johnson. Titus Street donates 840 acres of his land for a turnpike from Cleveland to Wellsville. Land was also donated for a town square and a cemetery. The turnpike is now known as State Route 14.
- **1826** The oldest frame home, the Singletary House began construction in 1826 and completed in 1828 is still standing. Originally located on the NW corner of town square, served for many years as a tavern and stage coach inn on the turnpike, relocated to the Defer property in 1971 and has since been moved to Singletary Drive, now home to the Streetsboro Heritage Foundation.

- **1826** First school in Streetsboro Township was built at Johnson's Corners (corner of old S.R. 14 and Aurora- Hudson Rd.) in 1826. It was a slab school house and eight students attended the school. At age 18, Clarinda Case became the first school teacher. It was located in northwest corner of township.
- **1827** The township of Streetsboro is officially organized. Last town ship in county to do so.
- **1851** The famous Old Methodist Church was designed and constructed. Many years later, the steeple is destroyed by a tornado in 1956. The church was moved to Hale Farm and Village (Bath, OH) in 1973 and has been restored.
- **1890** The primary industry in Streetsboro during the 1800's was Dairying. This was done on local farms and by the mid-1890's the Streetsboro Creamery Co. was established - and built it's factory, shipping a large portion of its milk to Cleveland, Ohio. Along with Streetsboro's dairy industry, cheese factories were established throughout Streetsboro township and by 1885 the township had five factories up and running. A main purchaser of Streetsboro's dairy was The Feeder Dam Factory, owned by C.R. Doolittle which was located just over the Shalersville border and much of the cheeses produced by them would be shipped to New York.
- 1922 Streetsboro celebrates its 100 year Centennial.

Economic News for Streetsboro

The City of Streetsboro has recently welcomed two new international companies. Gebheardt International has announced that they plan to take over the space formerly occupied by Ferguson HVAC Supply (10040 Aurora Hudson Road). The company, based in Germany, is a manufacturer of intralogistics components and will create 60 – 80 jobs. Moffett, a subsidiary of Hiab, will be relocating a portion of its manufacturing from Ireland to Streetsboro and will share space with Waltco at 1777 Miller Parkway. Moffett makes three wheeled forklifts that attach directly to the underbed of a semi-tractor trailer. 80 – 100 new jobs will be created.

The Economic Development Department also recently was honored with a national professional award for the deal struck with the Geis Companies for the spec building on SR 43. The deal guarantees a minimum payroll of over \$9 million, creates a new scholarship for the students of Streetsboro and new revenue for the schools with 25% of the abated tax returning to the administration. It should be noted, that often people think that abatement reduces school's revenue but a majority of their funding comes from levies which are designed to collect a set dollar amount and abatement does not materially affect this. The award also factored in the creation of a new park, over \$50k for the park system, and a \$10k donation for our upcoming bicentennial. The Director will attend the forum in Chicago this December to receive the award and interact with new deal sources to hopefully bring back even more jobs to our community.

Streetsboro Building Department Updates

Dear Residents of the City of Streetsboro,

The City of Streetsboro Building Department was established in 1993 to assist with massive development taking place in the City. The purpose of the Building Department is to oversee both commercial and residential construction. The City requires that all contractors and subcontractors performing work in the City be registered. Furthermore, in addition to being registered, most projects being performed in the City will require a permit, whether it be Building, HVAC, Electrical, or Plumbing.

Due to the number of calls that the Building Department has been receiving in the recent months concerning building projects that have been incomplete or completed defectively, we are issuing this letter as a helpful guide. If a contractor is not registered and a permit is not pulled, the Building Department is left not being able to assist the homeowners.

Upon investigation of these calls, the common issue seems to be that a permit was not obtained for the work, and/or, the contractor is not registered within the City of Streetsboro to perform such work.

Residents hiring contractors to complete work on their property are encouraged to visit www.cityofstreetsboro.com, click on building, click on applications, click on citizenserve, click on reports. All registered contractors within the City of Streetsboro will be listed.

Put A Freeze On Winter Fires:

Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February and are responsible for about 20% of all home fire deaths. Keep your family safe all winter by following these simple steps:

- Keep at least 3-foot clearance between heat producing appliances and anything that can burn.
- Only use portable generators outside, away from windows, and as far away from the home as possible. Only use the generator in accordance with manufacturers specifications.
- Install carbon monoxide alarms and test them at least monthly.
- If you have a fireplace, have a professional clean and inspect your chimney yearly, and store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container outside, at least 10 feet from the home.

Winter Weather Safety

This winter remain prepared by staying up on the latest weather



on the latest weather forecast. When winter weather strikes, only

travel when necessary and give yourself additional time to travel.

When working outside during the winter, make sure you stay warm from head to toe to avoid hypothermia. Signs of hypothermia can include confusion, shivering, difficulty speaking, sleepiness, and stiff muscles. Take regular work breaks and warm up indoors. If you think you or someone you're with is experiencing hypo-

thermia, call 9-1-1 immediately.

Eligibility

Eligibility is based on age and/or a documented disability, income, living in a single family owner occupied home and year round residency in the home.

Income eligible applicants will either be:

- Someone at least 65 years of age and be the property owner of record residing at the address on the application. Or
- A property owner living with a disability that prevents them from raking leaves, mowing their yard or removing snow.

To be income eligible, the following guidelines apply:

- If you are a one person household, your annual gross income (before taxes) must be at or below \$42,750.
- If you are a two person household, your combined annual gross income (before taxes) must be at or below \$48,850.
- If you are a three person household, your combined annual gross income (before taxes)must be at or below \$54,950.
 In addition to documents verifying income, all applicants must provide:
- Proof of age with a current Ohio Driver's License, State of Ohio ID card or Birth Certificate.
- If disabled, a medical certification in the form of a letter from their physician as proof of disability is required.

PAVILION RENTAL INFORMATION

Any person or organization wanting to reserve the pavilion at City Park shall obtain a permit from the Parks & Recreation Department. The fee for the use of the pavilion by a Streetsboro resident, business or organization located within the City is \$30 per rental, up to one day. The fee for the use of the pavilion by a non-resident, business or organization not located within the City is \$50 per rental, up to one day.

Please follow the guidelines listed below when confirming a rental:

- All rental fees are due at the time of the reservation
- Rentals will be granted on a first come, first serve basis
- Residents of Streetsboro may make pavilion rentals up to 1 year in advance
- Non-residents may make pavilion rentals 6 months in advance
- A \$25 additional cleaning fee may be assessed if the facility is not found in a clean condition

Pets

All pets must be on a leash at all times when on City property (with exception of the Dog Park). Pets and owners may be asked to leave and not return at the discretion of the Parks & Recreation staff at any time.
