By Mail: Completed registration forms can be mailed with full payment, check or money order, to 9184 State Route 43, Streetsboro, OH 44241. Make checks payable to: The City of Streetsboro.

Online: You can register online at www.cityofstreetsboro.com (for select programs). An additional \$1 convenience fee will be added.

Cancellations: SPRD reserves the right to cancel any class or program that does not meet the minimum required participants. If your class is cancelled, we will notify you by phone. You may transfer to another class or program, receive a credit for a later class or program, or receive a refund. Program dates and times are subject to change on short notice.

Refund Policy: Refunds will be granted if request is made 5 working days in advance of the first program date. A \$5 administrative fee will be withheld. Refunds will not be granted once a program begins. Acceptable exceptions are an injury that prohibits participant's involvement or a doctor's statement of participant's inability to participate. Please allow 3-4 weeks for refund by mail. Refunds or credits will be given for classes cancelled by SPRD.

Programs cancelled by the Streetsboro Senior Center you will receive a full refund of program fees. If you must cancel for any reason including illness, please give at least 7 days notice prior to the program date. Refunds will be given only if no expenses/ticket purchases have occurred. Approved refunds will be applied as a program credit for future programs. If a refund check is requested, there will be a \$5 processing fee. Any cancellations within 7 days of the program will not receive a credit or refund. You are welcome to have someone take your place.

Deadline Policy/Fee: If a program is registered for after the noted deadline, SPRD reserves the right to add a fee. If there are not enough participants registered by the noted program deadline, SPRD reserves the right to cancel the program. Please contact SPRD for applicable fee amounts.

Errors and Mistakes: Although our staff works hard to ensure each program guide is free from mistakes, there are moments when errors in dates, times, rates or registration information occurs. We will do everything possible to make corrections, and we thank you for your understanding when these situations arise.

Streetsboro Fire Department

Winter time means lots of indoor cooking, lots of entertaining, and unfortunately, lots of opportunities for home fires to occur. The Streetsboro Fire Department and Ohio Division of State Fire Marshal urges families to pay particular attention to fire safety during the winter and holiday season.

On average, 120 people die in accidental residential fires across Ohio each year. Many of these fires occur during the winter heating season.



The following are a few safety tips from the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) to ensure a happy and fire-safe winter season:

- Never plug more than one heat producing appliance into an outlet at a time and never overload outlets with adapters.
- Extension cords should never be used on heat producing appliances; never run through doors or windows or under rugs.
- Turn off lights and decorations before going to bed or leaving the home.
- Replace old or worn-out appliances and electrical cords immediately.

Fireplaces and Heaters

- Always use a screen in front of the fireplace. Also consider using a fire-resistant carpet or mat (made for fireplaces) on the floor in front of the fireplace.
- Keep all combustible materials at least three feet away from any heater - space heaters need space.
- When plugging in electric heaters, make sure that the outlet was designed to handle the load. Be safe.

One of the best ways to protect yourself and your family from a house fire is by having working smoke alarms in your home. By providing early warning of fire, smoke alarms can double your chances of escaping a fire safely. Annually, there are about 13,000 fires in Ohio, in the place we feel safest - our homes. Follow these tips to keep you, your family and your belongings safe from fire:

- Check your smoke alarms monthly. Only a working smoke alarm can save your life.
- Replace the batteries in your smoke alarms twice a year. When you change your clocks for Daylight Savings, change your batteries. If you have smoke detectors with permanent, long-life batteries, check the expiration date.
- Install smoke alarms on each level of your home and sleeping areas and sleep with your bedroom door closed.
- Make sure overnight guests also know your fire escape plan.
- Install a carbon monoxide detector if you have any appliance or device that has a flame - stove, water heater, furnace, fireplace, space heater, etc.
- Do not use your stove or oven to heat your house.

Keep them Clear

Can we ask a favor? If you have a fire hydrant in front of or close to your home, please consider shoveling the snow away from it: 3 feet in all directions. This will help us get to the hydrant much faster in case of fire. We sincerely appreciate everyone's help. Together, we'll keep Streetsboro safe! #ClearedMyHydrant

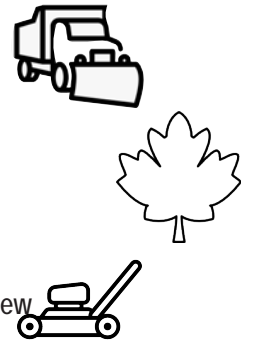

Eligibility:

Eligibility is based on age and/or a documented disability, income, living in a single family owner occupied home and year round residency in the home.

Income eligible applicants will either be:

- Someone at least 65 years of age and be the property owner of record residing at the address on the application.
Or
- A property owner living with a disability that prevents them from raking leaves, mowing their yard or removing snow.

To be income eligible, the following guidelines apply:

- If you are a one person household, your annual gross income (before taxes) must be at or below \$42,750.
- If you are a two person household, your combined annual gross income (before taxes) must be at or below \$48,850.
- If you are a three person household, your combined annual gross income (before taxes) must be at or below \$54,950.

In addition to documents verifying income, all applicants must provide:

- Proof of age with a current Ohio Driver's License, State of Ohio ID card or Birth Certificate.
- If disabled, a medical certification in the form of a letter from their physician as proof of disability is required.

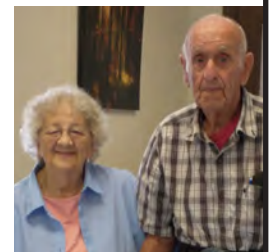


LONG TIME MEMBER!

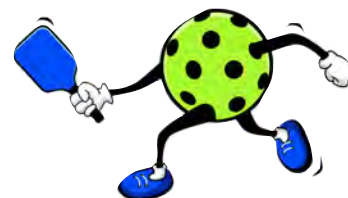

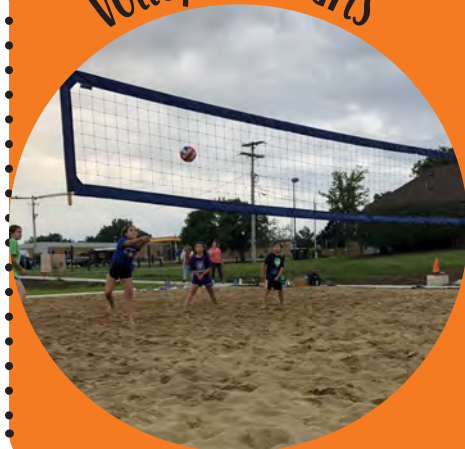

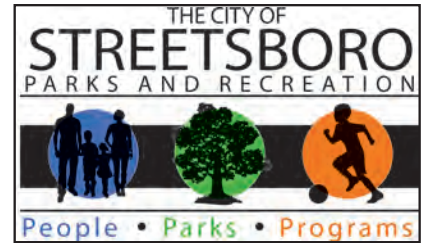
Parent Volunteer Coaches Needed!

Bench Dedication - Call for current pricing (330) 626-3802

This includes the bench, installation and a commemorative plaque. Benches are installed at approved sites in the order requests are received.

Installation depends on the time of year received and the number of preceding orders. Benches can be requested to be placed at most Streetsboro Parks, until they reach maximum capacity.

Dedication park benches must be placed on solid, flat ground. The price includes the cost of the bench, engraving, freight, installation, and maintenance. Upon receipt, it will take approximately six weeks to complete installation of the park bench. Benches can be installed spring through fall.

CITY PARK, 8980 Kirby Lane

City Park serves the residents of Streetsboro as a true “Community Park.” Conveniently located within the Streetsboro City School’s campus, City Park is enjoyed year round for a variety of recreational activities and events.

Facilities: 9 baseball / softball diamonds, numerous multi-use fields, 2 basketball courts, 2 tennis courts, 4 pickle ball courts, 2 restroom facilities, concessions area, 2 sand volleyball courts, 2 pavilions, skate park, playground, swings, walking trails and open space

Size: 116 acres

WILCOX MEMORIAL PARK, 825 ST. RT. 303

Wilcox Memorial Park is located north of ST. RT. 303 and west of Route 43. The park consists of playgrounds for children ages 2-5 and 5-12. Parents and guardians can relax on benches while their children play! Numerous natural resources are present on the site including floodplain and wet-land areas, tributary of Tinkers Creek and upland hillsides.

PAVILION RENTAL INFORMATION

Any person or organization wanting to reserve the pavilion at City Park shall obtain a permit from the Parks & Recreation Department. The fee for the use of the pavilion by a Streetsboro resident, business or organization located within the City is \$30 per rental, up to one day. The fee for the use of the pavilion by a non-resident, business or organization not located within the City is \$50 per rental, up to one day.

Please follow the guidelines listed below when confirming a rental:

- All rental fees are due at the time of the reservation
- Rentals will be granted on a first come, first serve basis
- Residents of Streetsboro may make pavilion rentals up to 1 year in advance
- Non-residents may make pavilion rentals 6 months in advance
- A \$25 additional cleaning fee may be assessed if the facility is not found in a clean condition

Pets

All pets must be on a leash at all times when on City property (with exception of the Dog Park). Pets and owners may be asked to leave and not return at the discretion of the Parks & Recreation staff at any time.

Smoking Policy

Fans/spectators are reminded that there is no smoking permitted within 100' of any City-owned playing field or event. (C.O.S. 2014-108)
