Registration Reminder: SPRD can not take payment over the phone or hold a registration space without payment. Registration is available online at www.cityofstreetsboro.com, in person or by mail.

In Person: SPRD office is located at 1951 Annalane Dr, Streetsboro.

By Mail: Completed registration forms can be mailed with full payment, check or money order, to 9184 State Route 43, Streetsboro, OH 44241. Make checks payable to: The City of Streetsboro.

Online: You can register online at www.cityofstreetsboro.com (for select programs).

Cancellations: SPRD reserves the right to cancel any class or program that does not meet the minimum required participants. If your class is cancelled, we will notify you by phone. You may transfer to another class or program, receive a credit for a later class or program, or receive a refund. Program dates and times are subject to change on short notice.

Refund Policy: Refunds will be granted if request is made 5 working days in advance of the first program date. A \$5 administrative fee will be withheld. Refunds will not be granted once a program begins. Acceptable exceptions are an injury that prohibits participant's involvement or a doctor's statement of participant's inability to participate. Please allow 3-4 weeks for refund by mail. Refunds or credits will be given for classes cancelled by SPRD.

Programs cancelled by the Streetsboro Senior Center you will receive a full refund of program fees. If you must cancel for any reason including illness, please give at least 7 days notice prior to the program date. Refunds will be given only if no expenses/ticket purchases have occurred. Approved refunds will be applied as a program credit for future programs. If a refund check is requested, there will be a \$5 processing fee. Any cancellations within 7 days of the program will not receive a credit or refund. You are welcome to have someone take your place.

Deadline Policy/Fee: If a program is registered for after the noted deadline, SPRD reserves the right to add a fee. If there are not enough participants registered by the noted program deadline, SPRD reserves the right to cancel the program. Please contact SPRD for applicable fee amounts.

Errors and Mistakes: Although our staff works hard to ensure each program guide is free from mistakes, there are moments when errors in dates, times, rates or registration information occurs. We will do everything possible to make corrections, and we thank you for your understanding when these situations arise.

• ALL GIFTS MUST FIT in one 11"W X 16"L X 4"D bag per household (example: if you have 3 children, you buy 3 gifts, and ALL 3 gifts MUST FIT in the single bag provided). Large gifts will be refused.

• Label all gifts with child's name & address in visible marker.

Gift Delivery Instructions

Please have your child (accompanied by an adult) waiting at the end of your driveway on your delivery day. Santa cannot wait.

In case of Severe Weather...We will make every effort to deliver gifts on Saturday, December 16, but in the case of severe weather it may be necessary to delay, postpone, or cancel delivery. In this case:

• Gifts for routes that are canceled will be delivered on Sunday, December 17, 2023.

• The Department will send TEXT MESSAGES notifying participants of the cancellation (If we do not have an updated contact number on file then you will NOT receive the message, so please update your contact info.).

Special Note: We understand that not everyone may be available to participate on the SNOW DAY listed above, but it is the best and only alternative. If your family will not be home on Sunday, December 17 for delivery; please make arrangements to pick up your gifts at the Parks & Recreation Office during regular business hours.

The City will not purchase or wrap gifts. Participants must live within Streetsboro City limits. Gifts will not be accepted if dropped off at the Fire Department, City Hall or given to the Fire Truck during the event. If you do not register, you do not participate.

Fall & Winter Safety Guide

Your Streetsboro Firefighters want to help you prepare for a season of cold weather safety!

Prepare Your Home:

- ❖ Have your home heating system serviced professionally to make sure it's working properly and is properly ventilated to the outside.
- ❖ Ensure all smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are in proper working order.
 - Learn the symptoms of CO poisoning: headache, dizziness, weakness, vomiting, chest pain, confusion.
 - If any of these symptoms occur, call 9-1-1 for assistance. If you suspect a CO problem, get out of the home and into fresh air immediately.

Prepare Your Vehicle:

- ❖ Make sure your vehicle is winter ready with regular routine maintenance.
- ❖ Ensure adequate tire tread to make it through snowy conditions.
- ❖ Use windshield washer designed for winter weather.
- ❖ Prepare an emergency kit for your vehicle. Include the following items in your kit:

Cell phone, portable charger, extra batteries.	Extra warm items such as hats, coats, blankets...
A change of clothes in case yours get wet.	Booster cables, warning flares and a tire pump.
Sand or kitty litter for traction.	First aid kit.
Plastic bags for trash and sanitation.	Food and water for extended trips..

Prepare Your Emergencies:

- ❖ Remain alert to the weather and potential for changing conditions. Wear appropriate clothing for the weather you will be in.
- ❖ Stock food items that require no cooking or refrigeration, and water in clean containers.
- ❖ Battery operated devices such as flashlights, Weather radio, and lamps with extra batteries.
- ❖ First aid kit with extra medicines as needed.
- ❖ Other items specific to family members with other needs (very young, elderly, special needs).
- ❖ If using a home generator, test it regularly and always keep it at least 20 feet from the home when operating, and never near an air inlet.

In case of emergency or other immediate need for assistance from the fire department, call 9-1-1.

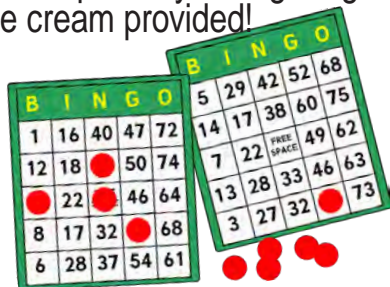

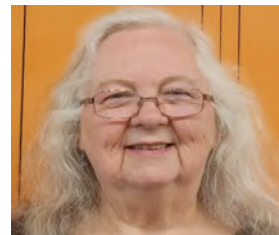

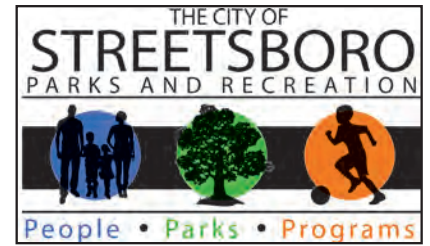

Dedication park benches must be placed on solid, flat ground. The price includes the cost of the bench, engraving, freight, installation, and maintenance. Upon receipt, it will take approximately six weeks to complete installation of the park bench. Benches can be installed spring through fall.

WILCOX MEMORIAL PARK, 825 ST. RT. 303

Wilcox Memorial Park is located north of ST. RT. 303 and west of Route 43. The park consists of playgrounds for children ages 2-5 and 5-12. Numerous natural resources are present on the site including floodplain and wet-land areas, tributary of Tinkers Creek and upland hillsides.

PAVILION RENTAL INFORMATION

Any person or organization wanting to reserve the pavilion at City Park shall obtain a permit from the Parks & Recreation Department. The fee for the use of the pavilion by a Streetsboro resident, business or organization located within the City is \$30 per rental, up to one day. The fee for the use of the pavilion by a non-resident, business or organization not located within the City is \$50 per rental, up to one day.

North Pavilion Size 32 x 48: 12 picnic tables appx. seating for 72 people.

South Pavilion Size: 31 x 31: 10 picnic tables appx. seating for 60 people.

Please follow the guidelines listed below when confirming a rental:

- All rental fees are due at the time of the reservation
- Rentals will be granted on a first come, first serve basis
- Residents of Streetsboro may make pavilion rentals up to 1 year in advance
- Non-residents may make pavilion rentals 6 months in advance
- A \$25 additional cleaning fee may be assessed if the facility is not found in a clean condition

Pets

All pets must be on a leash at all times when on City property (with exception of the Dog Park). Pets and owners may be asked to leave and not return at the discretion of the Parks & Recreation staff at any time.

Smoking Policy
