This Regular Meeting of Council was called to order on Monday, November 13, 2023 at 7:03 p.m. by Jon Hannan, Council President.

Mr. Hannan skipped to the Mayor's Report on the agenda so the Mayor could make some appointment and the candidates would not have to sit through the other meetings tonight.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Broska said he had four appointments to make tonight. They were still trying to get in touch with someone who was interested in joining the Planning Commission. Keith Smith was to be reappointed to PRCAC, but he was ill tonight and would attend a future Council meeting.

Mayor Broska asked Council to approve the appointment of Schonda Grays to the Civil Service Commission. He had reviewed her resume and felt she would make a great fit with the Civil Service Commission. Mr. Ring thanked her for stepping up to join the Commission.

MOTION: TO CONFIRM THE APPOINTMENT OF SCHONDA GRAYS TO THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

Moved by Mr. Ring, seconded by Mr. Michniak. Upon roll call vote, **motion carried unanimously**. Mayor Broska swore-in Ms. Grays [applause].

Mayor Broska had three appointments for the Board of Zoning and Building Appeals (BZBA). Marvin Woods was serving as BZBA At Large, but he would switch to the Ward 3 seat and the Mayor would appoint Andria Ostapowicz (who lived in Ward 1) to the then vacant At Large seat (both seats had the same term). Mayor Broska would also appoint Jason LaGuardia to the BZBA Ward 1 seat to take over for Aaron Hatzo who left the Board in August 2023. Mr. LaGuardia had been recommended by Mr. Hannan. Mr. LaGuardia said he had lived in Streetsboro for almost 20 years and was married with two daughters in high school; he was a union electrician by trade. Mayor Broska explained that the BZBA was a quasi-judicial body that decided variances, etc. and required a lot of thought and consideration by the Board Members, so he appreciated all these people that volunteered to join the Board.

Mr. Hannan confirmed that he had recommended Mr. LaGuardia for this Board. Mr. Hannan had known Mr. LaGuardia's family for a long time and coached his daughters in Cross Country. Mr. Hannan and Mr. LaGuardia discussed City issues and zoning concerns often and when this position came open, Mr. Hannan had recommended Mr. LaGuardia apply for a position to get involved with the City.

MOTION: TO CONFIRM THE MAYOR APPOINTMENT OF JASON LAGUARDIA TO THE BZBA WARD 1 SEAT.

Moved by Mr. Michniak, seconded by Mrs. Field. Upon roll call vote, **motion carried unanimously**.

Mayor Broska asked to appoint Andria Ostapowicz to the BZBA. He said she had been on other boards and commissions in Streetsboro; most recently she was on the Master Plan Review Commission and provided good insight, questions, and thoughts. Mr. Hanan thanked Ms. Ostapowicz for her dedication to the City to serve in multiple different roles. Ms. Ostapowicz said she had served on the Planning Commission in the 1990s, moved out of town, and then moved back to Streetsboro about five years ago and had missed being involved so she offered to join the Master Plan Review Commission, and now would like to serve on the BZBA.

MOTION: TO CONFIRM THE APPOINTMENT OF ANDRIA OSTAPOWICZ TO THE BZBA AT LARGE SEAT.

Moved by Mr. Ring, seconded by Mr. Michniak. Upon roll call vote, **motion carried unanimously**.

Mayor Broska thanked Mr. Woods for switching from the BZBA At Large seat to the Ward 3 seat. He thought Mr. Woods was in his second term on BZBA and Mr. Woods had run for a City Council seat in the past. Mr. Woods congratulated all the candidates that won their elections recently. Mrs. Field said Mr. Woods was a great "team player" and supporter of Streetsboro, and she hoped he would run for City Council again in the future.

MOTION: TO CONFIRM THE APPOINTMENT OF MARVIN WOODS TO THE BZBA WARD 3 SEAT.

Moved by Mr. Michniak, seconded by Mrs. Field. Upon roll call vote, **motion carried unanimously**. Mayor Broska swore in the three new BZBA members [applause]. Mr. Cieszkowski commented that the next BZBA meeting on November 21, 2023 had a rather large agenda and would be a rather long evening for their first meeting.

Reports/Communications from Depts/Boards/Commissions

Mr. O'Malia reported that the Happy Moose restaurant was closing. The owner, John Napier, wanted to assist his current employees in finding other employment so he was doing a job fair on Monday after Thanksgiving from 9-11 a.m. that would be open to the whole community. There was an email about this that the Council Members could share on their social media accounts.

Mr. Mytinger reported that this week was present drop off for the Santa is Coming to Town program to have presents delivered by Santa from a fire truck.

Chief Wain said on October 25, 2023 Officer Bartholomew was recognized as the CIT Champion of the Year for Portage County, a well-deserved honor. December 9, 2023 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. will be Shop With a Cop; they were always looking for volunteers to help the kids shop. Saturday, November 18, 2023 would be Fill a Cruiser from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. to accept donations for a regional food bank.

Mr. Czekaj told Mrs. Field that Hudson had a connectivity program and was installing the sidewalks at 100% their own funds. He also reported that the Department of Development was releasing the next round of grants for waterlines and he hoped to apply shortly for funding for the Arrowhead neighborhood project. The project at the City Center was proving troublesome with many unexpected discoveries under the ground. The waterline there has been found to be in poor condition. He will approach Council at the next Council Meeting to approve a change order to replace the waterline from SR 43 to where the connection was needed. If this was not done now, he feared there would be a water main break under the new roadway/oval after it was installed. He said if the change order was approved for this project, he could cover the cost of the spoils and construction debris that were dug out and trucked to the back of the site with the contingency funds. The waterline change order would be covered under the project funding from 401- and not the Water Fund since it was not a waterline along the main road, but a lateral to a property site.

Chief Reinholz said on Sunday, November 5, 2023 the firefighters attended First Baptist Church for a First Responders Celebration. There had been some mental health awareness issues recently. Cancer, heart attacks and suicides were the three leading causes of death in the fire service, so the department was trying to be proactive with these concerns. It's been very busy; there was a fire last Thursday along with 3-4 squad runs all at the same time. The Fire Department had provided extinguisher training to Berry Plastics. There will be a live burn on November 30, 2023 with other local departments to practice working together. Tomorrow will be an "after action" report regarding the active shooter drill to review the incident. Fall housecleaning deep cleaning of the fire station will start soon. The activity report had been sent by email to keep Council up to date.

Mayor Broska thanked Julie Field for her 12 years of outstanding service to the community as Council Member, and he appreciated her courage to stand up for him in some contentious times with some previous Council Members. He wished her well in the future enjoying more time with her sons [14, 12 and 10 years old].

Mr. Hannan also congratulated all the winners of the recent election and thanked everyone that ran for office. He looked forward to working with Lisa McDaniel, the future Ward 4 Council Member. He thanked Julie Field for all her work the last 12 years on City Council, and especially for her assistance to him as a young elected official and her support of all the others on Council. Mr. Hannan invited Mrs. Field to continue to join the Council Members for future public events like the City Hall groundbreaking, ribbon cuttings, etc. because she had been instrumental in the work that went into these projects.

Mrs. Field thanked everyone for the sweet words. Mrs. Field said it had been an absolute pleasure, a privilege, and a blessing to work alongside all the Council Members, Mayor, and the department heads; it was a stellar group. There had been some rough years, but everyone was put into place in different seasons for different purposes. She mentioned her appreciation of Mayor Broska's natural leadership abilities and his perseverance and how far the City had come over the last 12 years. She felt the City was in good hands for the future [applause].
