Disposition of Minutes

Citizens' Comments

Laura Lewis, 1085 Sparrow Run, expressed that she was very interested in an opt-out option for the new water meter replacement program.

Regina Rohan, 1338 Vantage Way, said she was also opposed to the new meter system. She said she had no clue this was happening and was not comfortable with it. She didn't feel it was necessary and felt there should be an opt out for utilities like this. Mr. Michniak asked Ms. Rohan if she wanted to place some of her concern onto the record regarding her opposition. Ms. Rohan wondered what would happen to the workers that were going out to read the meters; would they be let go? Bill Miller emphasized that the workers would not be let go; there was a lot of system maintenance the City was behind on and the workers would help catch up on that. Ms. Rohan understood it would take 24 hours to be alerted if there was a leak detected in her home, but she didn't feel she needed the City to tell her that her toilet was running.

Kristyn Senk, 688 David Drive, was also opposed to being forced to get the new water meters and not being allowed to opt out. She asked for clarification on what "acoustic leak detection" meant. Bill Miller explained that the if water main out front was leaking the water meter itself could hear that and relay that information to the City staff. There was nothing in the meter than heard anything other than water flowing in the pipe; it could not pick up conversations. The meter would hear the whistling of the water flow and if the pitch changed, it would alert to a problem. The louder the noise the closer the leak. Mr. Ring added that it was the frequency of the vibration going through the pipe; there were no microphones whatsoever. Mayor Broska added that it was not an "Alexa" type system. Ms. Senk asked what kind of signal was sent out by the new water meters. Bill Miller said it was about a 450 MHz wireless radio waves signal and he would provide Ms. Senk with some information sheets tonight. Mr. Ring said it was about \(^{1}4\) of what a cell phone puts out.

Reports/Communications from Depts/Boards/Commissions

Chief Reinholz said the biweekly activity report was sent that listed the EMS and fire runs, the mutual aid calls, it highlighted the calls that overlapped, and listed the training sessions the firefighters had participated in. Often when there was a good outcome (life saving), the participants would come to a Council Meeting to give a testimonial, but tonight he passed out a couple of letters thanking the Fire Department for their assistance and for a second chance at life.

Mr. Czekaj reported that Council Members would not see activity at the City Center site for a while because the construction team was pulling off the site due to the muddy weather conditions. They had completed the watermain from SR 43 to the Fire Department, which had been approved as a change order. The City had gone to bid for construction of the splashpad area and would open bids soon.
